Cadet Merrill Cadet H. A. Merrill, neglect of duty, trying deception suspended 30 days. in giving excuses. Cadet Merrill appears before the Faculty and states his case. On motion it is resolved that he be suspended for thirty days, during which he is not to enter the College grounds - that during this time he keep up with his classes by private study and that on the expiration of his suspension he be examined as to his standing. If found wanting, he is to be suspended to the end of the session.

Cadet McDonald Cadet Fer. L. McDonald. Neglect of duty, absent from classes without excuse, absent from quarters and from College without leave. Moved and seconded, that he be dismissed. Carried.

Cadet Beard Cadet W. L. Calvert^{Beard}, charge: Firing gun loaded 21 days arrest. with ball cartridge from dormitory.

Cad. Calvert Cadet Calvert, officer on duty, neglect of duty in not preventing firing gun, as above, although present. 8 days arrest. On motion Cadet Beard 21 days arrest, Cadet Calvert

Faculty met at 1 Pm. in President's room.

Reading of Papers
in open sessions
regulated.

All present. It was stated, that the papers read in open sessions of the different societies often contained objectionable matter and that in one case, matter that had been stricken out by the Prof. of English, had nevertheless been read in open session. - It was moved and seconded that the reading of papers should hereafter be omitted. Lost.

It was then moved and seconded that the papers in question should be handed at least three days before the open session, & a committee to be appointed for that purpose, that nothing should be read, except what they read and approved and that in case their decision was disregarded the reading of papers in open session should hereafter be forbidden.

The motion was carried. The President then appointed a Professor White, Helvel and Pence a committee for that purpose.
