

The Faculty voted approval of these recommendations.

In the absence of Dean Taylor, Carsie Hammonds presented for the College of Education a request that Education 181, Teaching Vocational Agriculture, be increased from a 12 semester hour course to a 15 semester hour course, effective with the inauguration of the semester system. He stated that this increase in credit was made necessary because of a recent interpretation of the Office of Education in Washington. The University Faculty approved the change.

In the absence of Dean Funkhouser, M. M. White, Chairman of the Committee on Honorary Degrees of the Graduate Faculty, presented the following recommendations of the committee:

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY FACULTY MARCH 8, 1948

The University Faculty met in the Assembly Room of Lafferty Hall Monday, March 8, at 4:00 p.m. In the absence of President Donovan, Vice President Chamberlain presided. Members absent were C. A. Anderson, May K. Duncan, William C. Eaton, W. D. Funkhouser, M. Jongeward, Claude Sprowles, and Edward Wiest.

The minutes of February 9 were read and approved.

Dr. Chamberlain announced to the Faculty that President Donovan had arrived safely in Germany.

Dean Holmes, Chairman of the Committee on Student Organizations, presented the following recommendations from the Committee:

1. That the University Faculty approve the organization of a local chapter of Tau Kappa, a social fraternity.
2. That the Constitution of the Student Government Association be amended as follows:

REPORT TO THE UNIVERSITY FACULTY:

According to the Constitution of the Student Government Association, the following amendments to the Constitution have been presented in the prescribed manner and passed by the Assembly:

In Article Three, Section 1-B. Strike out the words, "twenty-nine" and insert the word "thirty," making B begin, " thirty student members elected....."

In Article Four. In line four, after the phrase, "two quarters of residence at the University," insert the phrase "with the exception of the representatives from Graduate School, on whom no requirement of previous residence shall be placed."

The following changes in the By-Laws have been presented and passed by the Assembly:

Number 8-a. Strike out the work "nineteen" and insert in its place the word "twenty".

Number 8-b. Insert provision for one representative-at-large to be elected from the College of Pharmacy, said election to be in the regular spring election, making the total representatives elected in the spring quarter 20 instead of 19.

According to the Constitution, these amendments are effective subject to the approval of the University Faculty. The Student Government Association hereby submits them for approval, anticipating that approval will be received in sufficient time to allow for the Pharmacy representative to be elected in the regular spring election scheduled for Thursday, April 1, 1948.

3. That the Faculty approve the organization of the Young Democratic Club of the University of Kentucky.

In considering the request of the Young Democratic Club, Dean Kirwan offered a substitute resolution: That the Faculty refuse to recognize any organization whose announced purpose is to promote any political group. After some discussion, the substitute motion was put to a vote and was adopted.

Dean White presented for the College of Arts and Sciences the following recommendations, which were approved by the University Faculty:

1. Reinstate certain courses for the summer only.
 - Chemistry 3b-----2.7 semester credits
 - Chemistry 20-----4 semester credits
 - Physics 3c-----4 semester credits
11. Authorize for the spring quarter a course approved on the semester plan.
 - Zoology 130-----4 quarter hours credit

111. Require for graduation a comprehensive examination, effective September 1, 1948.

1V. Reduce the credit value of a course.
Library Science 25-----from 2 to 1 semester credits

V. Authorize the attached curricula for the degree of A.B. in Music.

Dean Cooper presented for the College of Agriculture and Home Economics the following new courses in Agronomy:

Animal Industry 27 Travel Course in Dairying 3 credits
(To be offered during the summer term or in the interim between terms.)

A course designed to acquaint students with research problems and methods at other institutions and with commercial dairy operations in other sections of the country. Full time for approximately two and one-half weeks. Prerequisite: Animal Industry 21, or permission of instructor. Special fee \$40 (for transportation).

Animal Industry 127 Travel Course in Dairying 3 credits
Same as Animal Industry 27 except that graduate students will be given additional assignments. Special fee \$40 (for transportation).

The University Faculty approved the new courses in Agronomy.

Dean Terrell presented the following recommendation from the College of Engineering: "In order for students to continue their curriculum without duplication, it will be necessary to reinstate, for the Summer Session, 1948, only; Metallurgical Engineering 142b."

The University approved the recommendation.

Dr. Hegeman, Chairman of the Rules Committee, presented the following recommendations, which were approved by the Faculty:

1. That Pi Mu Epsilon (formerly a Recognition Society in mathematics) be classified as an Honor Society.
2. That in view of the prevailing tendency for recognition societies to seek classification as Honor Societies, the Committee on Student Organizations be mindful of the need for continuing supervision of the scholastic requirements for membership in these organizations.
