

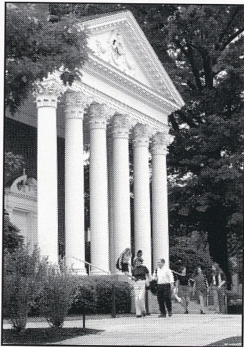
History

- Founded in 1865 as a land-grant institution.
- Located in the heart of the beautiful Kentucky Bluegrass region on a 764-acre campus just south of downtown Lexington.
- The University also has a large medical center in Lexington with a 473-bed hospital.
- Policy is set by a 20-member Board of Trustees which includes alumni, faculty, staff and student representation.
- Charles T. Wethington Jr. is the tenth president of the University.

Tuition & Fees

Tuition and fees on the Lexington Campus for the 1998-99 academic year:

- Undergraduate state residents: \$3,016 per year in tuition; \$336 in fees.
- Undergraduate non-residents: \$8,376 per year in tuition; \$336 in fees.

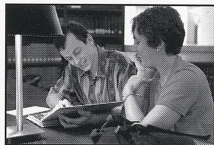

William T. Young Library

The new William T. Young Library on the Lexington Campus opened this year. This architectural initiative is the finest library resource in the state and includes:

- Seating for 4,000 patrons
- Space for 1.2 million volumes
- 3,600 computer network ports
- 600 personal computers available for users
- 362,000 square feet of space

The UK library system now ranks 32nd among all research libraries in the nation, according to American Research Libraries.



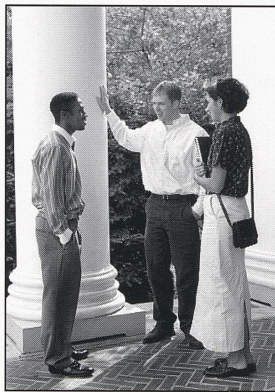
Academic Programs

Students have 100 majors from which to choose in the 16 academic colleges:

Agriculture, Architecture, Arts and Sciences, Communication and Information Studies, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Gatton College of Business and Economics, Human Environmental Sciences, Law, Social Work, Allied Health Professions, Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy.

Research

- Faculty and staff attract more than \$131 million in research grants, contracts and gifts---\$72 million in federal funds.
- Four College of Engineering students were among a handful of students selected nationally for an experiment with NASA. Controlled falls aboard an airplane flight were used to simulate a zero-gravity environment.
- Researchers at the Head Injury Research Center have developed the first anabolic cocktail - a combination of nutritional and growth supplements - to help patients recover from traumatic brain injury.
- Royalties from inventions bring in over \$2.4 million a year, ranking the university in the top 40.



Students

- Enrollment on the main campus, Chandler Medical Center and Lexington Community College is more than 30,000.
- 3,100 students are enrolled in the five colleges in the Chandler Medical Center.
- 5,200 students live on campus in 18 residence halls or apartment complexes.
- 250 organizations offer students a wide variety of interests to choose from.
- Another excellent freshman class: 75 National Merit Scholars, 127 Kentucky Governor's Scholars and 103 high school valedictorians.

Graduate Education

- More than 5,000 graduate students are enrolled in 96 master's degree and 60 doctoral programs.
- The first joint degree program in the state is being offered as UK and the University of Louisville begin a joint doctoral degree program in social work.

Faculty

- 1,832 full-time in Lexington.
- 97% of the faculty in Lexington have the highest degree attainable in their fields.
