Doctoral program rated 'average'

A study of doctoral programs at universities across the United States rated only a small number of UK's programs as above average.

However, top University officials say the study is to completely relevant to UK's current climate.

Gerry Bramwell, UK vice president for research and graduate studies, said the study by the National Research Council was done in 1993, and a lot has changed in UK's doctorate program since then.

Bramwell said the graduate program has doubled its research dollars in the last five years, especially in the last two.

And he said he thinks significant resource increases lead to growth in faculty as well as diverse and new ideas.

The National Research Council is a private, non-profit institution that provides science and technology advice under a congressional charter.

The 740-page report it put out examines the quality of more than 3,600 research-based doctoral programs in 41 fields at 274 universities. It is the council 982.

NATION Senate denies 'family cap' for welfare

WASHINGTON — Heeding warnings that a mational welfare 'family cap' would drive up abortions and punish poor families, the Senate derailed a conservative push yesterday to deny additional cash payments to single mothers who have more children.

Twenty Republicans sided with every Democrat as the Senate approved an amendment by Sen. Pete Domenici, 66-34, to strip a family cap policy from the Republican blueprint to overhaul the nation's welfare programs.

Conservatives said the government, if it is ever going to bring down the rising rates of illegitimate births, must stop subsidizing the "reckless, irresponsible" behavior of single women who ask taxpayers to support their children.

Only two days after meeting with President Bill Clinton, Alson Crabtree said she will resign as Governmental Affairs Chairwoman of UK's Student Government Association.

Although he often gets advice from his older brother, who has just finished his redshirt season — at Michigan.


The older brother, Scott Dreisbach, is now the starting quarterback for the Wolverines.

Environmental group watches water quality By Stacy Schilling

In Rupp Arena's parking lot stands a little island that looks like a jungle and smells like a sewer. "This is where we're going to be starting," said Robert Boak director of research for Bluegrass Water Watch. "You can find all kinds of wildlife down here, like birds, ducks, ground squirrels, fish, trash bags, drunks and even an old tire," Boak said.

As Boak and his volunteers climbed down into this jungle, everyone has a comment to make. "It smells like someone's toilet just exploded down here," said UK graduate Wade Davidson. Davidson and Boak are two members of UK's Bluegrass Water Watch chapter of the Kentucky Water Watch hapter of the Kentucky Water Watch Program. The Bluegrass Water Watch program goes into streams, creeks

and even sewers to test the waters that flow through Lexington.

"We keep our eyes open for problems that have been missed," Book said.

Aside from looking for just problems with the water, BWW tests the water once a month and compares the data with past data.

Once the data is collected, the information is given to the state Kentucky Water Watch city engineers and they decide if the problem needs fixing or not.

UK Online almost prepared for **Internet surfers**

If you signed up for UK On-Line, chances are you've discov-ered patience is more than a

erea patience is induce than a virtue—it's a necessity.

Sign-ups for UK On-Line began on campus in mid-August, offering University students, faculty, staff and Alumni Association members 15 hours of prime time Internet access for about \$12 per month. Non-UK affiliated computer users were going to be the time, people expected to receive their fulfillment packages within one to two weeks. But a few least minute changes turned a week into a month.

MCI Internet specialist Inho Lee said it was a matter of ironing out some wrinkles.

"The first time (the software was completedy), it turned out that there were some minor details, cosmetic changes. So the program went back and forth between UK and MCI for approvals," Lee said.

UK officials said the delay was caused by the need for intensive testing of the new MCI software.

"We wanted to make sure the software was working well and that we had good documentation to send with it," said Doyle Friskney, hease of K network.

One of the tersulting changes is the addition of an on-line guide for the Windows application, which will "improve usability." Lee said this was fairly typical of the changes being made.

Although the program has been delayed, the uncommon relationship between UK and MCI should make UK On-Line worth the wait.

"Our relationship with UK is unique, more so than with others," Lee said. "UK was one of the first universities on board, and we really brought them into more of a collaborative effort."

For UK, it means an opportantly to be involved with the design of the program, ensuring a service that suits UK.








I really like keyboards Punk rock redefined and, I think, revolutionized guitar playing. I would pick Black Flag's Greg Ginn over Eddie Van Halen in a second, or Hüsker Dü's Bob Mould over Jimi Hendrix, easy. But punk was never able to de much interesting with

But punk was never able to do much interesting with keyboards, which may, more than anything else, stem from the way a keyboard's sound isn't as harsh as a guitar's does not strike me as valid, since keyboards can be outfitted to sound harsh, and anyway, the basic spirit of punk rock was to sound harsh, and anyway, the basic spirit of punk rock was to sound ugly, and you can sound ugly on a keyboard just as you can sound ugly on a guitar. I think it was the basic design of keyboards.

You can jump all over the place with a guitar (or bass, come to think of it), bashing out big noise with huge, adrenalined arm thrusts. Consider Pete Townshend and his signature windmill

shend and his signature windmill

sweep.

Drums are powerful and prifrustrations is there than beating on stuff over and over again? It doesn't matter that you're

anchored to your chair, because anchored to your chair, because you're swinging your arms around and pumping your legs in constant, athletic motion. But keyboards don't offer much in the way of mobility — you're kind of stuck there

— nor in frenzy of motion: your hands aren't going to move more than a couple of inches no matter what you play, and even the most complex keyboard most compiex keyboard sequences are going to involve little more than speedy finger shuffling, which hardly qualifies as generating the kind of fiery barbarian lust that sees in your garden-variety Bonbay file sole

it. However, I would argue that the key-board is passionate in too subtle a way for punk rock to take much interest in it.

The synthesizer boom, which crested in the early '80s, should have produced a rich crop of wonderful keyboard players, one would think. It's simple mathematics, right? The more people playing keyboards, the more likely that a good keyboardist will arise from

good keyboardist will arise from that enlarged pool of candidates. But it didn't work out that way. Some bands, like The Cure (after the first album, anyway), were basically punk-types who wanted to put their piano lessons to good use; they were interested in sounding as chilly and creepy

Bands like Kraftwerk seemed

less interested in playing as toy-ing around with the new tech-nology.

Others weren't interested in

anything further than stringing together giddy little pop melodies.

But I don't think any band has been able to match the sheer majesty of Procul Harum's "Whiter Shade Of Pale," and no keyboardist has been as consis-tently fascinating as the Doors' Ray Mayarek Ray Manzarek.

I thought the Charlatans, an English band which places the organ front and center in its sound, would finally give key-boards a proper representative in the rock canon after a long absence

Reviving a dismissed genre, the Dirty Dozen Brass Band will

inception in the '70s arose when only one other brass band was working in New Orleans.

Working as a second line in parades and funerals turned to appearances on "Late Night With David Letterman" and "The Tonight Show" and six albums with their bayou brass grooves. The exuberant appeal of the dirty dozen extends past the bayou, having performed 17 shows in Europe, Japan, Brazil, Israel and throughout Asia.

and bosoms" hung around. On "Jungle Blues," the band


