To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting

Whereas James A. Crump of Callaway County, Missouri, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at St. Louis, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said James A. Crump, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 21st of April 1820 entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" for the West half of the South East quarter of Section Thirteen, in Township forty seven, North, of Range ten, West, in the District of lands subject to sale at St. Louis, Missouri, containing eighty acres,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said James A. Crump.

Now Know Ye, that the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said James A. Crump, and to his heirs the said tract above described, To have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said James A. Crump, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
