

Norfolk July 25. 1836

My dear Sir

As requested by your letter of 29th May 1834. I procured at Palermo in Majorca a Sack of best Breed. three years Old. 5 ft. high & will be half a horn higher. the Majorca Breed are more esteemed in the Mediterranean than the Matter, they procure finer shorn or unshorn, and are higher priced, when at Matter in July last. I saw all that were for sale. They were all small, many size, all of good size & Character, had recently been brought up. I sent to the West Indies; the Animals I have brought has the handsomest. Head & neck I have seen, in those Animals, and is I think valuable I could not meet with any Ternets, such as I thought worth bringing. I shall be very glad to retain a half interest in the Sack. But have been obliged to value upon you, for the whole Cost and Expenses. One Hundred ten dollars, in favor of J. A. Thornton Esq. Pursuant of the Delaware at 15 days sight, the Sack is in fine Order, and as a Liberty State in this City, will you do me the favor to say
