

Baltimore 26th July 1836

My dear Sirs

I have been duly favoured with your letter of the 16th inst and am sorry to hear of our bid prospects for increase of young stock, this being the case I think the sooner you sell them the better, you know you have a cattle block & be assured whatever you do will be satisfactory to me.

I have received the check you enclosed in your letter for 250⁰⁰ \$ @ 1/2 per Prem is 250²⁵ 100⁰⁰ \$ which amount I have paid to your A in account or you do not designate it as a remittance for any specific purpose.

I have applied at Mr Thompsons Counting House some time for the amt paid by him for you, in case that I might settle the same, but should not have been able to ascertain how much it is. I am sorry to say that he is in most wretched health, is confined to his bed and I am afraid is breaking up — Mr Blanton has come
