

Ashland Nov. 23<sup>d</sup> 1853.

My late husband by his last will gave to our son John M Clay one half of the Blooded Stock, to wit, of Magnolia - of the Zingane mare named Genobia, also of the Brown Imported mare - and their increase - and whereas said mares now have the following increase to wit, Magnolia has a Yorkshire filly two years old named Madonna - a Wagner colt one year old - and a sucking colt by Yorkshire - Genobia has a Biston colt now two years old named Zero - also a sucking colt by Yorkshire - The Brown Imported mare is dead & her only increase is a Yorkshire stallion named Yoric now five years old - And whereas by the said will the other half of said Blooded stock belongs to me to do with as I may think proper -

Now in consideration of my love and affection for my son John & as part of his distributable portion of what I have a right to distribute among my children, I do hereby give, grant & deliver to my son John the one equal half of the stock above described - which gift by me invests him with a full & perfect title to the whole of them
