and believing finally, that the local and temporary embarrassment produced by this adoption by the United States would be more than offset by the benefits which would accrue from increased facility to everyday transactions;

Be it Resolved:

First, that the Senate of the University of Kentucky approves the gradual adoption of the decimal metric system of weights and measures in the United States.

Second, that it approves House Bill 125, providing for a survey by the United States Secretary of Commerce as to the advantages of world metric standardization.

Third, that the secretary of the Senate be authorized to forward a copy of these resolutions to Honorable Randolph Perkins, Chairman of the Committee on Coinage, Weights and Measurements of the House of Representatives, Washington, D. C.
