JOINT ALUMNI COUNCIL APPROVES REFERENDUM

The Executive Committee of the Joint Alumni Council of Kentucky, in session at Kenlake Hotel in June, unanimously approved the November referendum to call a limited Constitutional Convention for the purpose of up-dating Kentucky's antiquated governing document.

The Committee reaffirmed its faith in the people of the Commonwealth and, in so doing, its faith in the ability and wisdom of the citizens of the State to revise the Kentucky Constitution in accordance with desires, needs, and demands of today.

The group, after careful consideration of many problems facing the state, asserted that it felt a sense of civic responsibility and opportunity to serve the citizenry and the Commonwealth by working for a favorable vote on the question at the November general election. The committee proposes to spearhead an informational and factual campaign on the Constitutional issue, believing that when our citizens have the facts they will act in their best interest and in the best interest of the state.

"In this present scientific era we are no longer satisfied with 1890 farm equipment, 1890 production machinery, 1890 medical and health practices, nor with 1890 schools—to say nothing of the automobile and other necessities or conveniences of only a few years ago. Neither can we any longer be satisfied with an 1890 'horse and buggy' charter," said Maurice D. Bement of Louisville, executive director of the Council.

The Joint Alumni Council of Kentucky is a non-profit, non-partisan, public service corporation of alumni associations of Kentucky's six public institutions of higher learning—Eastern, Kentucky State, Morehead, Murray, University of Kentucky, and Western.

In approving the November referendum to call a constitutional convention in undertaking an information campaign to explain the need for limited revision of the Kentucky Constitution, the Joint Alumni Council of Kentucky has given its support to a project that deserves the full active effort of every UK alumnus. But more than this, the Council's action demonstrates the kind of responsible, public leadership which its six member alumni associations—and the educational institutions they represent—are dedicated.

When one looks objectively at this public question that will appear on the ballot at the November election, there are no real mysteries concerning it. The twelve sections of the 1891 Constitution which contain the antiquated and outmoded provisions needing revision are known and have been specifically designated by the General Assembly; no others can be considered at the convention. The step-by-step procedure for calling the convention, for electing the delegates to it, and for eventual ratification of the people of the limited revision proposed by the convention is clearly established and complies completely in every detail with the revision provisions of the present Constitution. The absolute and costly inability of our state government, our county and city governments, our public schools, and our institutions of higher education to provide the kind of public service which every Kentuckian deserves and wants, without the modernization of the Constitution, is a widely recognized and well documented fact. The benefits to agriculture, to industry, to labor, to the business community, to the professions, and to all of the geographical areas of the Commonwealth which will result from careful, considered limited improvement in the Constitution are immeasurable. In fact, the only true uncertainties about the referendum are whether the people of Kentucky will cast their votes on the question presented and, in doing so, whether they will be governed by their fears or by their belief and faith in the future of the state.

Both of these unknowns can be resolved through effective leadership and information. No alumnus of any of the educational institutions whose alumni associations compose the Joint Alumni Council should leave any doubt in the mind of any other alumnus that his vote in support of the convention call is needed. Anything less than that would mean that Kentucky will remain handicapped at the very time when her future and the future of her people and their educational institutions are the brightest.

Two special awards to be given by the UK Alumni Association were established by the alumni executive committee at its April meeting.

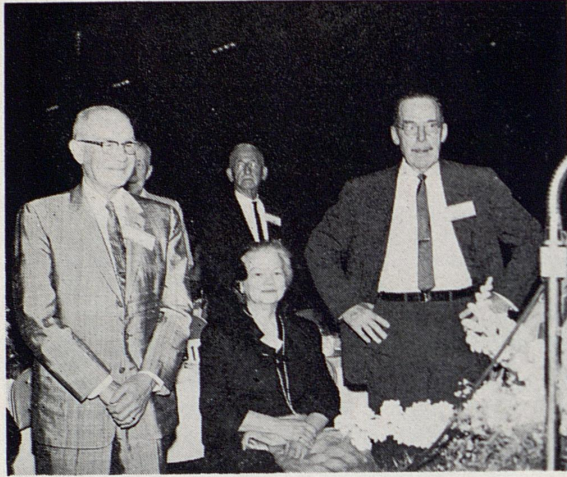
Members of the University Alumni Association will be asked to nominate four persons for awards as:

GEORGE GILBERT BEQUEATHS SCHOLARSHIP FUND TO UK

George H. Many alumni of the University of Kentucky and other institutions of higher education in this country are following the example of Mr. Gilbert to make their universities beneficiaries of all or parts of their estates, and encouraging to university officials to have such bequests come to the institution through alumni generosity.

The University of Kentucky Alumni Association has available information concerning methods by which such bequests can be made and will be glad to answer questions from interested alumni. Mr. Gilbert became affiliated with the General Electric Company shortly after his graduation from the University and served with GE offices in Richmond, Va., and Baltimore, Md., before retiring from company in 1933. He was unmarried and the remainder of the estate devised to a number of relatives.

ANNUAL REPORT TO THE ALUMNI

The annual meeting of the University of Kentucky Alumni Association was held in conjunction with the Alumni Annual Picnic and with the 1960 Alumni Seminar, May 28, 1960 at Carnahan House, Coldstream Farm.

Dr. Ralph J. Angelucci, Lexington, outgoing president of the Alumni Association, presided. Present for the meeting were approximately 350 alumni and Seminar participants.

Mr. H. D. Palmore of Ashland made a motion that the minutes of the 1959 annual meeting on May 23, 1959, be approved as published in the August 1959 ALUMNUS magazine. Seconded by Mr. Hillenmeyer, the motion carried unanimously.

Miss Helen G. King, Director of Alumni Affairs at the University, gave her report as follows:

DIRECTOR OF ALUMNI AFFAIRS May 28, 1960

Thomas Jefferson said once, that "if a nation expects to be ignorant and free . . . it expects what never was and never will be."

Ignorance and freedom are as incompatible as oil and water and for the educated man or woman this incompatibility is posing a personal problem today, at a time in history when the challenge of totalitarianism demands people and a program.

How does this problem and this challenge affect you—alumni of the University of Kentucky? The answer is simple and direct. Freedom of mind and heart are attributes of the educated man and in order to protect these priceless intangibles and also to make them available to others, through education, your responsibilities are heavy—and personal.

The vitality of the American system rests today in the strength of its human resources and the ability of Americans to apply themselves to the problems at hand. Your problem, and mine, is to prepare the coming generations with the educational background which will develop bold and imaginative leadership and an implicit belief in our concept of democracy, namely, that free men are more effective in social action than enslaved men.

When you left the campus of the University of Kentucky to meet the challenge of your time, you carried with you a dual responsibility, the first part of which was expressed in the pledge you took on commencement day: "In the presence of this audience, citizens of the Commonwealth and members of the University, with a strong sense of my respon-

sibility, I promise to hold my degree so no loss will come to it through my holding, to regard it as a claim upon my loyalty to Alma Mater and to pledge myself to the service of God and my fellow man."

The second, intangible obligation which you accepted that day was expressed in the charge to the graduating class: "May you have in your declining years, material comfort, the respect of your fellow citizens, the feeling of work well done, and a spiritual and intellectual interest in human life."

It is about your spiritual and intellectual interest in human life that I wish to speak today. Laurence M. Gould, President of Carleton College, has said: "I do not believe the greatest threat to our future is from bombs or guided missiles. I don't think our civilization will die that way. I think it will die when we no longer care—when the spiritual forces that make us wish to be right and noble die in the hearts of men. Arnold Toynbee has pointed out that 19 of 21 notable civilizations have died from within and not by conquest from without. There were no bands playing and no flags waving when these civilizations decayed! It happened slowly, in the quiet and the dark when no one was aware. . . . If America is to grow great, we must stop gagging at the word "spiritual." Our task is to re-discover and re-assert our faith in the spiritual, non-utilitarian values on which American life has really rested from its beginning."

Your University and the hundreds of other colleges and universities throughout the country are the outposts of freedom in a democratic way of life. Here, on this campus, young men and women by the thousands are being trained in specific fields and in the broader concepts of human relations and human dignity. Here, at your state university, established for the purpose of making higher education available to all of those who are qualified to partake of it, young people are being trained constantly to accept and to be able to cope with public responsibility.

Many of you believe that the tax dollar takes care of their education. This is an understandable but mistaken conception. In 1957-'58 only 49% of the University's total budget was supported by state and federal funds. The remainder came from student fees and services and gifts and grants. This points out to you quite adequately the necessity of steadily increasing support from alumni, corporations, foundations and friends.

The Executive Committee of your Alumni Association has worked diligently

and well during the past decade to formulate a well-rounded support of the university's many programs within the framework of its budget. We have, abiding faith in your interest and in your generosity, added several important, distinguished projects to the total alumni program, including the Annual Alumni Seminar; the gift of \$500 each to faculty members annually for distinguished contributions in writing and research; and the establishment and continuation of a scholarship program which consists of a \$2,800 scholarship given annually to an incoming freshman who demonstrated outstanding ability in scholarship and leadership and who has a definite need for financial help. This program, initiated in 1949, has made possible for seven outstanding Kentucky scholars to obtain degrees from UK and four more are now on campus.

Last June your Alumni Association initiated a major gifts campaign, totaling \$250,000 in support of the above program and to finance an on-campus Alumni Center for your convenience and for the benefit of faculty and students. This campaign, known as the Century Club drive, conceived by your Executive Committee in preparation for the University's centennial in 1965 and in order that the alumni of the institution might make a substantial contribution to the University upon the occasion of her 100th anniversary.

With the assistance of a few dedicated volunteer workers this project has been eminently successful, but we need a minimum of 30 Century Club members who will agree to pledge \$100 a year for five years to the fund, in order to reach the quarter-million dollar goal. There are many of you here today who are able, financially, to contribute \$500 to the Century Club drive. Without you, we fail to reach the total—with many of you participating we can pass that goal. To begin the establishment of an endowment fund which will take care of an ever-broadening program and ever-increasing needs of the future. Members of the Executive Committee and Alumni Association staff members are here today to evaluate the program to you.

Some of you have taken advantage of the Alumni Association's continuing education program this weekend and have heard distinguished alumni, faculty and citizens lecture and comment on a subject of world importance: "Communications in 1960," during a two-day seminar devoted to this important subject.

Last March the Alumni Association presented to four outstanding University

scholars, \$50,000 for research published in January 1960. These gifts are scholarship funds for staff and faculty at the University.

scholars, \$500 each for distinguished writing, research or both which had been published during the two-year period, January 1, 1958 and January 1, 1960. These gifts are encouraging continued scholarship among faculty and research staff and are adding prestige to the University.

The athletic banquets, reunions, homecoming, field trips to alumni groups within and outside of Kentucky, close organizational work with the alumni secretaries of the five other state-supported institutions of higher education in Kentucky, and many other facets of alumni-University relations have occupied the days and many nights of your director during the year just closing, each function important at a given moment, but all facets of a program which will grow and develop or will stagnate, according to the will of the total alumni body.

What I am saying to you is this. If you will be satisfied with the mediocre for your University and for your alumni program then we will continue on in an earnest but inadequate way to do the best we can with the materials you supply. Your institution can be no better than your ambition for it and your pride in it. You set great store by the achievements of our athletic teams but sometimes lose the total perspective.

This year has seen the addition of a field secretary to the Alumni Association staff in the person of Richard A. Rushing, 1955 graduate from the School of Commerce who has the youth, the ambition and the know-how to revitalize and reactivate every alumni group and yes, every alumnus, if you will give him your cooperation and your help.

The Alumni Fund is the life blood of the Alumni Association. This is the beginning of a new year and your active participation through contributions, large or small, will set the standard for our future operations.

Your treasurer will recommend to you today that the general Alumni Association vote to set aside from some of the anticipated savings of the Association a sufficient sum to establish the beginning of an endowment fund for the purpose of future expansion. This is an important and necessary step in the right direction if we are to implement the University's ever-expanding program and I hope you will consider the proposal with favor.

As a matter of record I would like to report briefly upon the thinking of an alumnus in connection with the University's program and his anticipated bonus from the Commonwealth. Mr. Phil Ardery, of Louisville, wrote to us early in the Century Club drive and volunteered that when he receives his bonus he would

endorse the check to the Alumni Association as his Century Club contribution. He further suggested that other veterans might be inclined to follow his example. If this suggestion meets with widespread approval this money might form the nucleus of a permanent endowment fund.

We generated considerable interest in contributing memberships in 1959 through a challenge from the alumni of the University of Tennessee to a race for total membership. We lost the race, but I cannot believe that Tennessee alumni are more dedicated or have more pride in their institution than you have in yours. The competition will continue through 1960-'61 and the balance of proof rests with you. This has been a rewarding year in many respects and most of the credit goes to the dynamic leadership given to the Alumni Association by its president, Dr. Ralph J. Angelucci and the members of his executive committee. These men and women meet once each month eleven out of the twelve months each year, many of them coming from as far east as Pikeville and as far west as Paducah. It is never too much trouble for them to meet, advise and contribute of their time and their resources to this University. To them go the heartfelt thanks and appreciation of the professional alumni workers and the University.

I would like to pause here and pay tribute to the leadership afforded the Century Club campaign by Mrs. Hampton C. Adams, who accepted the chairmanship of the drive a year ago and who has been indefatigable in her efforts to put the program over the top. She is one of the dedicated ones—having interrupted her winter vacation in Florida on two different occasions to come all the way home to implement the program, attend meetings and lend her leadership and her counsel. She is an alumna whom many of us could emulate to the profit of the University and to the satisfaction of our own souls.

The Executive Committee, in turn, wishes to express deep gratitude to President Frank G. Dickey, vice presidents Leo M. Chamberlain and Frank D. Petersen, to O. L. Press, Seminar Coordinator, to O. Clay Maupin, Director of Accounts and Controls, and to the members of the Faculty Awards Committee for their interest, their enthusiasm and their support in our many projects.

The Alumni Office staff has worked hard and loyally and we wish to say "bless you" to Dick Rushing, Olga Vardone, Ada Refbord, Mae Montjoy, Mary Miller, Edith Kenton, Betty Wiggs, Sue Boyer, and Amelia Gano for work devotedly and faithfully done.

Now, one last word in conclusion. This

report constitutes a personal appeal to each of you to invest in the future. Not to give, in the ordinary sense of the term, but to invest—support—underwrite—yes, to insure and safeguard your own future and the future of your children.

Speaking of public responsibility, Thomas Jefferson once said that there was a debt due from every man to his country "proportioned to the bounties which Nature and Fortune have measured for him." In the quiet of his own thoughts, what American can claim that he is not a debtor?

Mr. Palmore of Ashland made a motion that the Director's report be approved as read. Seconded by Mr. Cooper of Somerset, the motion carried unanimously. Following the report of the Director, Dr. Angelucci asked for a motion on the suggested endowment fund to be established in the Association. Mr. Shively made the motion that \$5,000 be transferred from the general funds to establish an endowment fund according to the recommendation made by Miss King in her report. Mr. Hillenmeyer seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Dr. Angelucci then called on Mr. Rushing, Alumni Field Secretary, to give his report. Mr. Rushing stated that since July 1, 1959 he had attended over forty meetings of alumni clubs throughout the state. He also attended several meetings of the Joint Alumni Council of Kentucky and has done considerable work on the Century Club. Mr. Rushing also reported that he has formed a Speakers' Bureau consisting of faculty and staff members at the University. These speakers will be available to speak at alumni club gatherings upon request and will be of great service in spreading the proper information concerning the University. Mr. Rushing stated that his plans and projects for this fiscal year included the raising of percentage active membership in the Alumni Association throughout the state and the nation; to initiate a Parent Organization with parents of the students being Associate members of the Alumni Association; to have sessions with students and explain to them the programs, projects and aims of the Alumni Association, so that after graduation they may make good alumni.

The Treasurer's Report on the financial operations with the recommendation of the establishment of an endowment fund was given by Mr. Shively of Lexington, treasurer of the Alumni Association as follows:

During the past decade there has been a continuous increase in the costs of sup-

plies and services purchased by the Alumni Association. From all indications this inflationary trend will continue in the future. Therefore, it seems highly desirable that an endowment fund be established and the income from such fund be used to supplement the annual operating budget.

It is hereby recommended that \$5,000.00 be transferred from the general fund reserve to establish an endowment fund. It is further recommended that this fund be supplemented by special contributions.

This fund is to be invested primarily in equity growth stocks of high quality, thus serving a two fold purpose of yielding a reasonable return on the amount invested and an opportunity for appreciation of the value of the securities.

The income from this endowment fund will be included in the Association's annual operating budget.

BBB President Jackson Honored By University

Hugh R. Jackson, president of the Better Business Bureau of Metropolitan New York, was honored by New York University School of Retailing in June at a luncheon sponsored by the school's Merchants' Council.

Last December, Dr. Martin resigned the superintendency and became commissioner of finance.

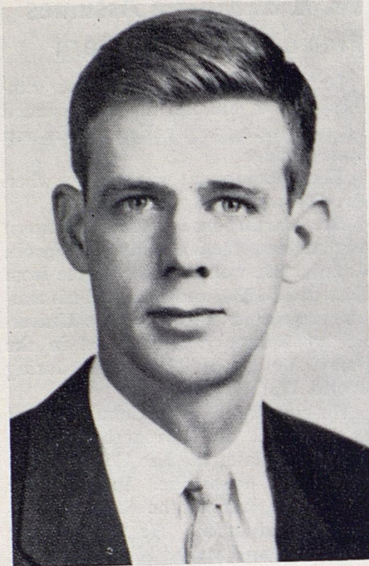
Dr. Martin is married to the former Miss Ann Hoge of Frankfort.

NOVEL PUBLISHED

"Nathan Coulter" is the title of a novel published in April by Houghton-Mifflin Company and written by Wendell Berry, class of 1956.

It is Berry's first novel and has as its locale the Henry county, Kentucky, area where he was born in 1934 and reared. Berry received his master's degree from UK in 1957 and taught at Georgetown College in 1957-58. In 1958-59 he worked under a fellowship at the Creative Writing Center at Stanford University. During the past year he taught creative writing at Stanford.

A reviewer for a California paper calls Berry's novel "a fine book." "An exceptionally strong and sensitive first novel" is the comment of a reviewer for the Louisville Courier-Journal. "It is a regional story which concerns itself with a tobacco growing community, a boy, his family and acquaintances and the experiences which influenced them all. Birth, death, love, family unity and conflicts . . . are masterfully portrayed in amazingly fine prose that at times becomes poetic."

Clifford Amyx, art professor at UK and Berry's father-in-law, designed the jacket cover and end papers for the book.

NAMED RESEARCH DIRECTOR

What's in store for Coach Blanton Collier's seventh edition of Wildcats in 1960?

It is general knowledge by now that last year's Kentucky eleven was accorded the unique tribute of rating "the best losing team in America." And Coach Collier already is on record, regarding the potential of this season's outfit, as saying:

"Kentucky will be a good ball club in 1960. I can't promise that this will be reflected by the record we score against some of the toughest teams in the country who are on our schedule, but I feel the potential for having a pretty good season will be present.

"This potential was present last season, but was handicapped by a tough schedule and injuries—and, I might add, our own mistakes. . . . Aside from the morale-busting task of facing three of the nation's best teams (Georgia Tech, Ole Miss and Auburn) in the first three weeks of the season, our problems revolve around developing reserve strength fast from among promising-but-inexperienced sophomores."

Thus, as can be readily seen in the coach's comment, the big bugaboo in posting a good season record revolves chiefly around the schedule.

For a quick look at what the Wildcats will be up against, here is a capsule summary of each opponent's outlook as gleaned from the publicity departments of the schools themselves and from impartial reports:

FIRST GAME — GEORGIA TECH at Atlanta. Uneasy Bobby Dodd claims his club is "the biggest question mark in years," but forecasters figure the Engineers stronger at every position except center and pick them no worse than fourth in the SEC chase. Rebound expectations of the team, which finished just out of the top 20 nationally last season and had a post-season date in the Gator Bowl, are based on a talented crop of youngsters—such as red-shirt quarterback Stann Gann—and some promising holdovers. In the latter category are two of the SEC's top tackles, Ed Nutting (239) and Billy Shaw (238), and

a pair of impressive ends—Gerald Burch and Taz Anderson.

SECOND GAME — MISSISSIPPI at Memphis. Despite the graduation of 14 lettermen, experts foresee enough talent remaining in Johnny Vaught's stronghold to justify a unanimous prediction that the Rebels will finish atop the SEC in '60. This prize avoided them last season despite a 9-1 record and Sugar Bowl win. Last year's Mississippi eleven was voted "Team of the Decade" in the SEC, but had one of its toughest games in downing the Wildcats.

THIRD GAME — AUBURN at Lexington. The experts are betting that the Plainsmen will not disappoint as they did last year in finishing fifth in the conference race despite a 7-3 overall mark. Consensus of opinion is that they will take a back seat only to Mississippi. Although losing seven regulars, enough material is on hand in the persons of 17 returning lettermen and a bevy of talented youngsters to offset any losses.

FOURTH GAME — MARSHALL at Lexington. Although the Big Green has enjoyed outstanding success in the past (four undefeated seasons), they have had only two winning seasons since 1950 and last year hired ex-UK aide Charlie Snyder to lead them back to prominence. Expectations are for gradual improvement this season with 18 returning lettermen boasting much game experience. Reports say Marshall will be stronger and faster in its backfield, light but experienced in the line.

FIFTH GAME — LSU at Lexington. The great Billy Cannon and many of his mates will be missing this year, but nobody is expressing sympathy for ex-UK aide Paul Dietzel. Fourteen veterans of Dietzel's three-unit system return with much game savvy to form a re-building nucleus and the experts figure LSU to challenge the leaders all the way. Many say the schedule may make them the darkhorse.

SIXTH GAME — GEORGIA at Lexington. Georgia, last season's surprise SEC champ and Orange Bowl winner, isn't likely to sneak up on anybody

this year. But the experts figure will not need the element of surprise. On hand are 20 returning lettermen headed by All-America guard Dye and All-SEC quarterback Frank Tarkenton. The Georgians expect exceptional strength in the backfield should finish no worse than third

SEVENTH GAME — FLORIDA STATE at Tallahassee. A new coach to the Kentucky card, Florida State a fast-rising Southern independent power with a new coach—Bill Peckham from LSU—and a new athletic cooking aimed at big-time promotion. Seventeen experienced hands including the nation's leading interception artist in senior half Bud Whitehead. Speedy backfield hefty linemen (216 average in game) make FSU a distinct threat.

EIGHTH GAME — VANDERBILT at Lexington (Homecoming). Quarterback losses hit Vandy pretty hard, but the lettermen, including superb halfback Moore) and spring practice (Bill Moore) pleased little due to snow interference but the experts are not selling Commodores short. Vandy has the ideal ingredient of strength in the middle—quarterback Russ Morrison and Cody Binkley, fullback Bobby

NINTH GAME — XAVIER at Lexington. Newly-classed as a Division I football school by the NCAA, Xavier has plans for their "debut" an interesting one in these plans is quarterback Ron Costello, already the school passing marks. Although he played two games last season, he is expected on 93 of 151 tosses for 1,000 yards and six TD's. The Muskies turn an experienced hand at the position except center and backfield return of nine men who were on the team in 1959.

TENTH GAME — TENNESSEE at Knoxville. A great many experts inclined to give the Vols a nod as darkhorse entry in the '60 SEC chase. Their schedule, like Kentucky's, is a deterring factor in an otherwise rosy picture. They catch some tough in Knoxville, but must get by on the road in their opener and survive a crucial test against straight SEC clubs at season's end. Bowden Wyatt is optimistic of talent and improvement in Wing offensive operations.

UNIVERSITY AFFAIRS

KIRWAN AND KRAECHE WIN GUGGENHEIM FELLOWSHIPS

Winners of Guggenheim Fellowships recently announced are Dr. A. D. Kirwan, professor of history and dean of the UK Graduate School, and Dr. E. Kraeche, associate professor of history.

The Guggenheim Fellowships, from the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, were awarded to professors for research and writing during the 1960-61 academic year.

Dr. Kirwan will work on a biography of John J. Crittenden, Kentucky governor and U.S. Senator who was active in politics during the first half of the 19th Century. He was author of the Crittenden Compromise, which attempted to prevent the Civil War.

The UK professor did research on his project for one semester and parts of the past academic year. With the fellowship he will work with materials at the University and the Library of Congress.

He will take leave from his duties as dean during the first half of the '60-61 year and will work part-time on his project during the second half. Dr. Kraeche will study the German policy of Prince Klemens von Metternich, Austrian chancellor who was the outstanding European politician of the first half of the 19th Century.

Kraeche has done earlier research while on a Fulbright grant in Vienna. With the Guggenheim Fellowship he will work in Vienna at the state archives and will visit archives in Munich, Stuttgart and other German cities. Kraeche expects to complete a volume on Metternich this summer and will use the new fellowship to get material for a second volume.

Bobbie Watson, '52, had a very successful basketball season at Owensboro Junior High. He will be one of the coaches in the annual East-West clarifier opener and test again.

Eddie Ward, '53, is head football and baseball coach at Harlan High School.

BUCKNER HONORED

Dr. Snow Honored As 'Distinguished Teacher'

Dr. Charles E. Snow, University professor of anthropology, was honored with a "Distinguished Teacher Award" at the annual Honors Day convocation in May.

The newly established award is expected to become a yearly tradition at U.K. Dr. Snow addressed the assembled honor students, faculty, and parents on "Higher Education and Race."

The student members of the Honors Day Committee, all representing leadership honorary societies, selected from among several nominees a professor who has distinguished himself as a teacher and scholar.

Dr. Snow is being recognized not only for his regular classroom teaching but also for his successful use of television in offering a regular class through that medium.

A native of Boulder, Col., Dr. Snow received an A.B. degree from the University of Colorado, and his graduate degrees from Harvard University.

During World War II, he held important posts in the War Department, working first for the climatic research laboratory of the Office of the Quartermaster General and later for the Army Graves Registration Service.

In 1952 he was named distinguished professor of the U.K. College of Arts and Sciences and carried out research on prehistoric Hawaiians. He is the author of numerous articles in scholarly journals.

Research Develops More Accurate T.B. Test

Dr. Morris Scherago, head of the Department of Microbiology, as the result of research begun five years ago has developed a more accurate test for tuberculosis.

Scherago carried out his work under grants from the Ohio Valley Allergy Society, the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases of the U.S. Public Health Service, and the Kentucky Heart Association.

The test gives promise of applicability in brucellosis (undulant fever in humans), histoplasmosis and other chronic infectious diseases.

He said the method which his students helped develop involved microscopic examination of specially prepared blood samples.

Scherago said that a person who has t.b. gives a positive skin test when tested with tuberculin, a product of the tubercle bacillus. However, he continues to give a positive test long after he has recovered and thus a positive test can mean either that the person has t.b. or has had it and recovered.

The leukocyte hypersensitivity test, just developed, is positive only as long as the patient has the disease.

ATTEND SOCIETY MEETING

Five faculty members of the University of Kentucky department of chemistry attended the spring meeting of the American Chemical Society held in Cleveland, Ohio. Dr. William D. Ehmann presented two papers at the Division of Inorganic Chemistry meeting and Dr. Arthur W. Fort presented a paper at the Division of Organic Chemistry meeting. The other members attending were Drs. Lyle R. Dawson, John F. Steinbach and William F. Wagner.

Scherago presented a paper on the discovery at a meeting of the International Congress of Clinical Pathology from June 13-18 in Madrid, Spain.

Other diseases which the UK scientists have been studying by their tests are rheumatic fever and allergic diseases.

Scherago has been a member of the University faculty since 1919, the year he was awarded a doctorate from Cornell University. He became head of the Department of Bacteriology in 1924 and served in that capacity since then. The name of the department was recently changed to the Department of Microbiology.

As we approach the 1960-61 year your Alumni Association faces many challenging problems.


World conditions continue to emphasize the need for improved education and the provision for more and more technical people to hold our country's position among the great nations.
