The minutes of yesterday's session were read and approved.

Curator Elley moved that the By law requiring secret session be suspended for the time being - lost.

Curator J. G. Allen offered the following resolution Res: That in the discussions which may arise during the session of the annual meeting of the Board of Curators each speech be limited to five minutes and that no Curator shall be allowed to speak twice on the same subject until other Curators who may desire it shall have spoken—unless by consent of the board—adopted.

The Treasurer read his report of the condition of the finances and investments of the University and was fully discussed/253/by Curators Worthington, Ricketts, Elley, White, Allen, Kinnaird, Sloan, Williams and others which with several motions to amend refer to a Comtee. of three was laid upon the table to be called up at some futhre hour by a resolution of Curator Campbell.

Committee on the preparatory Department made their report which was upon motion of Curator C. T. Worthington refered to the Extive Comtee.

Viz To see if the four % over and above the six percent basis, ordered by the Board in 1862 has ever been accounted for - upon which a warm and unpleasant discussion took place engaged in by Regent Bowman Curators Worthing & others. Regent Bowman explained his language in this Board addressed to Curator Worthington which on motion of Curator Campbell was unanimously adopted.

Curator Worthington explained & regretted his hasty conduct before this Board Curator Joseph mith moved that said explanation be accepted which was accepted as satisfactory.

Resolved to adjourn till 3 o'clock P. M. Benediction .----

/256/ The Board assembled at 3 o'clock and the minutes read and approved. Comtee. on Medical College made their report which was adopted. Committee on Commercial College made its report which was adopted.

Committee on Agricultural & Mechanical College reported and same adopted.

Curator Worthington consented to accept the following resolution as substitute for the one offered by him & recorded in forences—a discrepancy seems to exist in the Treasurer's report in that a portion of the funds of the Institution were during the years of 1859-1860-1861 at 10% while the estimated income was based on 6% Therefore Resolved that the Treasurer be respectfully requested to make such explanation as may be satisfactory to the Board—Adopted.

Curator Dr. Smith called up the resolution offered by him and recorded on page 255 marked (4) which after some discussion was adopted and ordered to become one of the Bylaws of this Board.

Curator Groom moved that when we adjourn until 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon- Adopted.

/257/ Curator Dr. Smith moved that we go into Executive Session adopted.

Committee on Nominations presented the names of Geo. White of Bourbon, A. M. Barnes of Fayette, and R. M. Gano of Bourbon-Ey law suspended and vote viva voce and all elected.

Same Comtee. also presented the names of the present incumbents as officers of the Board - On motion by laws suspended and vote viva voce and report adopted.

A petition was read by Regent Bowman requesting the rescinding of By-law forbidding Secret Societies which on motion to refer to University Senate was amended referring it to a Committee of three to confer with the Faculties of the different Colleges and report to this Board - Curator J. Aug. Williams, White & Wing were to compose said Committee.

On motion the Board adjourned to meet 2 c'clock P. M.
