- ✓ Bacteriology 110a,b. Laboratory Diagnosis. Three credits.  
To replace Bacteriology 105 a,b - Advanced Bacteriology.
- ✓ Bacteriology 107. Bacteriology of Water and Sewage. Four credits.
- ✓ Bacteriology 106. Bacteriology of Foods. Four Credits.6
- ✓ Bacteriology 150a, b. Seminar. One credit. ✓
- ✓ Physics 113. Radio Communication. Three credits.
- ✓ Physics 214. Transient Electric and Vacuum Tube Phenomena. Three credits.
- ✓ Music 21a,b. Band. Three hours a week. One-half credit per semester.  
To replace Music 6a,b, one-half credit per sem.
- ✓ Geology 110. Stratigraphic Paleontology. Three credits.

- ✓ Political Science 156. Colonial Government. Three credits.
- ✓ Art 47. Principles of Art Appreciation. Two hours a week for one semester. Two credits.
- ✓ Art 57. Introduction to Art Criticism for Journalists. Three credits.
- ✓ Psychology 114. Abnormal Psychology. Three credits
- ✓ Psychology 115. Measurements of Human Relationships. Three credits.
- ✓ Civil Engineering 46. Railroad Location, Construction and Maintenance. Lectures and recitations five hours a week.  
This course is to replace Civil Engineering 41, 42, 43. There is no change in the character of the work.
- ✓ Civil Engineering 47. Railroad Field Practice. Twelve hours a week.  
This course is to replace Civil Engineering 44 and 45. There is to be no change in the character of the work.
- ✓ Civil Engineering 6. Reinforced Concrete. Lectures and recitations five hours a week.  
This course is to replace Civil Engineering 2 and 3. There is to be no change in the character of the work.
- ✓ Civil Engineering 7a, and b. Elements of Architecture.  
This course is to replace Civil Engineering 5. No change in the character of the work given.

New Courses:

- ✓ Civil Engineering 7b. Elements of Architecture.  
This is a course of lectures in extension of the work given under Civil Engineering 7a.

Methods in Agricultural Extension. Lecture one hour a week.

- ✓ Economic History of Europe Changed from 2 credit to 3 credit course.

✓ Commerce 124..Federal and State Taxation 3 credits.

The Senate approved the reorganization of a group of students to petition Sigma Delta Tau.

The Senate voted to revise the rules governing refunds of fees so that a student who withdraws from the summer session within eight days after registration may receive a refund of eighty per cent of fees. The rules formerly allowed ten days.
