Pat Terrell, the university's vice president for student affairs, anounced her resignation in an e-mail to a Student Affairs listsery vesterable to a Counseling and Testing Center, Fratemity and Sorority Affairs and Residence Life.

The resignation will be effective immediately, said UK spokesman Tom Haris. The reasons for Firerll's resignation are confidential, as with all employee records, Harris said. Provost Kumble Subbaswamy issued a press release announcing Victor Hazard, associate vice president for Student Affairs will become the interim vice president for Student Affairs, and a call to his home at 8 p.m. Thursday, Hazard said he had not yet been contacted by Subbaswamy and


was not aware of his new position.







## **USP** program changes were long overdue

UK students spend a year and a half of their college careers taking classes that have nothing to do with their declared major. That means 15 classes with 15 final exams, resulting in 15 grades before students begin checking off the requirements for their area of focus.

The university requires 45 credit hours to be completed in the University Studies Program, which in many majors have to be at least partially completed before they can achieve upper the control of the current ine, the Kernel reported Wednesday.

It's about time.

The current program curriculum was set in the 1980s and hasn't been assessed since, according to the Wednesday article. 





A Kentucky judge has upheld an order to seize the domains of 141 gaming Web sites Thursday, saying opponents aynument that judicial interference will have a damaging effect "does not ruffle the Court."

"The Internet, with all its benefits and advantages to modern day commerce and life, is still not above the law, whether on an international or municipal level, "Franklin Circuit Judge Thomas Wingate wrote in a 44-page opinion.

The decision follows an order about a month ago seizing 141 online gaming Web sites, a move supported by Gov. Steve Beschear. Opponents have argued shutting down the bistes that operate around the world is outside Kentucky's pirisdiction and impose of the presonal rights and internet freedom," said John Pappas, executive director of the Poker Players Alliance, in a press release on the group's Web site.
