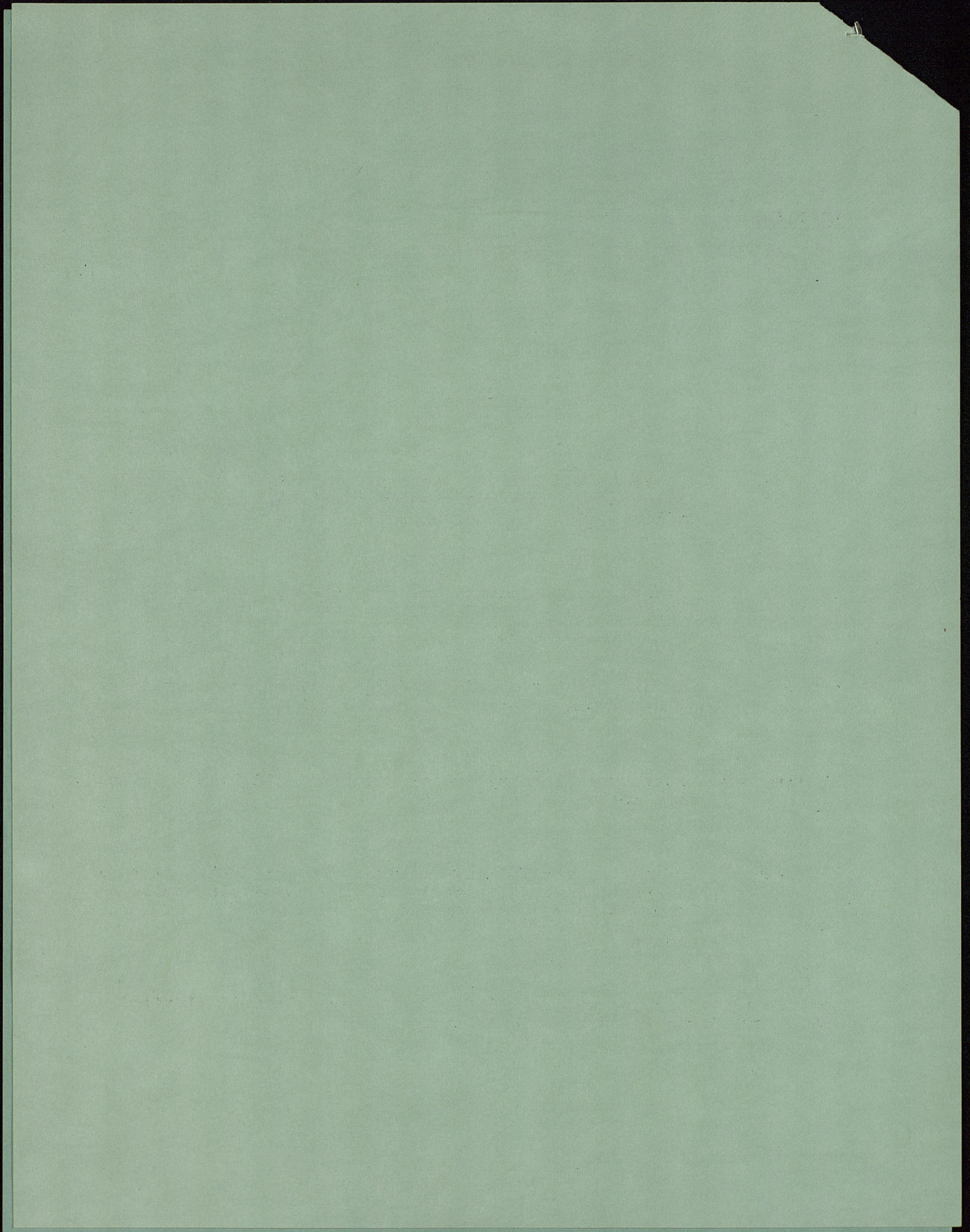
30 October - "Preschoolers, parents and books" - workshop at UK Student Union, 9-11:30 AM.

ABOUT THE LIBRARIES

In the Gallery: Some Bluegrass Presses:

"Some Bluegrass Presses 1943-1976" is the title of the current exhibit in the Gallery of King Library North. The exhibit is a tribute to the small-press industry that has flourished in the Bluegrass since 1787 when John Bradford, Kentucky's first printer, established his press at Lexington. More than 50 books and ephemeral pieces produced by private and small-press publishers are on display. All are from the University of Kentucky Libraries' collection and include pieces from the following presses: Anvil, Bur, Buttonwood, Gnomon, Gravesend, Larkspur, Polyglot, Stamperia del Santuccio, Whipporwill, and Wonderley.

The exhibit will run through November 76 and can be seen at the following times: Monday-Friday, 8-5; Saturday 8-12.
