Japanese Papermaking at the University of Kentucky



Timothy Barrett who studied the art in Japan for two years under a Fulbright will be conducting the events. Mr. Barrett worked with Kathryn and Howard Clark at the Twinrocker Hankmade Paper Mill, and assisted in making custom papers for Jasper Johns, Robert Motherwell, and Claus Oldenburg. Currently he is conducting research under a National Endowment for the Arts grant and working on a book to be published by Henry Morris of the Bird & Bull Press.
