

University sets new curriculum outline for general studies

Preshmen entering UK in the Fall 1898 semester will find a much more stringent academic environment than previously existed, courtey of the proper of the program expands the core of basic requirements developed to provide a broad base of knowledge for undergraduates during their first two years of study.

The new program was approved by the University faculty Senate on Feb. 4, 1986, after several months of debate.
