The 56-member UK Wind Ensemble, the elite band in the School of Music, will be traveling to the Kentucky Music Educators Association and the College Band Director's National Association performances.

"We received invitations to both," said Richard Clary, director of the wind ensemble. "At the CBDNA, the most outstanding bands from the United States and Canada get invitations.

The ensemble originally submitted appears of the music to both organizations and was selected to perform for Louisville and in North Carolina and Tennessee high schools Feb. 22-27.

The wind ensemble, which has been practicing six hours a week all year, is excited about the opportunity.

"I've never done this before," said Janece Thompson, a clarinet player and music education junior. "They went the year before I got here, and they were really good that year. It will be neat." The select pieces of music played by the ensemble differ. "We try to mix things up — old favorites and new compositions," said Peter Monsen, a clarinet player and music performance senior. Monsen said their music, though not popular outside the concert music circle, is popular among other college bands.

said. He music selected by the ensemble ranges in difficulty. "We play music that is fairly hard," Thompson said. "But it gives you a real sense of accomplishment when you finally get it."

Monsen agrees.
"The music we play is quite challenging," he said. "But it's very good."
This is the first time the wind ensemble has been selected to perform at the national association's performance. The group has traveled to the Kentucky association's performance before.
"We usually submit an audition tape and perform every three or four years there," Clary said.
The group will be performing select pieces including a piece by German composer Paul Hindemith entitled "Symphony: Mathis der Maler" and a piece by Spanish composer Joaqui'n Rodrigo.

HUDSON, N.H.—Fresh from victories in the first voting of the 2000 presidential campaign, Democrat Al Gore and Republican George W. Bush quickly turned their attention yesterday to the contest in New Hampshire. Orrin Hatch, who finished last in the lowa caucuses, decided to quit the GOP race. Vice President Gore finished with a nearly 21 margin over rival Bill Bradley in Jowa, but polls show him in a dead-heat with Jowa, but polls show him in a dead-heat with pradley in New Hampshire. Bush took 41 percent of the vote in lowa, beating the 30 percent gathered by publisher Steve Forbes. However, Arizona Sen. John McCain, who skipped lowa to concentrate on New Hampshire, is leading Bush in Granite state polls.

Nor'easter wallops East

NEW YORK — A surprisingly fast-moving storm blanketed the East Coast with up to 2 feet of wind-blown snow yesterday closing airports and schools, paralyzing the nation's capital and leaving North Carolina looking more like North Dakota. At least four people were killed in weather-related traffic accidents in the Carolinas, and a 5-year-oll girl was missing in Massachusetts after falling into a river while walking to school in heavy snow. During the morning, snow fell from South Carolina all the way to Maine.

QUITO, Ecuador — Ecuador's new president yesterday declared that his government was not beholden to the military generals who put him in power. Gustavo Noboa, the former vice president, took office Saturday after President Jamil Mahuad was forced out. The military said the action was taken to avoid "a social explosion" after hundreds of Indians and young military officers



stormed the Congress building and declared a new government. But some say the generals who handed Noboa the presidency did so under pressure from Washington and more than 20 regional commanders who rejected the overthrow of civil-ian rule.

HAVANA — Argentine soccer hero Diego Maradona, apparently angered by constant media coverage during his stay for occaine rehabilitation, punched and broke a reporter's car window yesterday. Photographers and cameramen say they were trailing Maradona outside a Havana supermarket when he got out of the black Mercedes Benz loaned to him by the Cuban government. Maradona, 39, arrived in Cuba on Jan. 18 to undergo treatment for drug addiction at a medical-oriented hotel on the outskirts of Havana.





How to (maybe) be a star

Getting Discovered: How to please your fans and win the attention of record executives with your own compact disc.

So, you've got a band, and you sometimes have delusions that you're actually going to make it. After a meeting, your band decides it's going to "get serious" and make it. First step is a demo tape, and none of you know where to start. What are you going to do? To try and give you a few answers, Italked to the president of Wakefire Studios, Richard Easterling.

Easterling works with record executives every day, and while he couldn't ensure these were foolproof tactics, he did offer a few pointers about problems he sees all the time. The first problem, Easterling said, is that many people come in Just to cut a demo.

While this is fine to give to a bar or club owner, it's not fine for a record exec-

"Think about how much stuff they get every day. They're going to pop [your demo] in and say, 'Well, they cut a demo.'


You have to put in time to make it work," Easterling said. Most record executives respect the fact that you've put in time and look at a finished product, as opposed to a quickly cut "demo."

The second fault Easterling finds is that most bands don't have their "chops" down. That is, they don't know what's going on and haven't put in the time to practice, and that is the most key problem. Another problem few bands even think about; scally on their songs. Using metronomes and learning more about your instruents aren't really geeky, said Easterling. "Having good equipment also goes a long way, too. We don't work miracles."

If you think that you've gotten to this point, and you're ready to do your first record, you're gonna have to book some time in a studio to do production. Unfortunately, it costs money to put in this time to get noticed. To do a full CD, Easterling put the rough estimate at a round \$1,500. That price can charge be at on the time it takes. Most bands don't have that kind of

money, but Easterling said that it's well worth the effort and money, seeing the possible payoff. Your time commitment on this recording venture will be around a week of eight-hour days, but that can change depending on what you get done. Easterling suggests that you not worry about your budget for CD's to sell. "It doesn't matter if you have 10 CD's." Easterling said, "because you'll sell them all if what you've got is good."




