Constitutional amendment fails

Three times was not a charm for Graduate Student senator Michael Tomblyn and his constitutional amendment that would have reallocated senate seats. Last night at a full Student Government Association meeting senators did not approve the amendment 10-12 with four abstentions.

The constitutional amendment originally requested that the senate be composed of one college senator from each college for every 1,400 students enrolled within that college. All the colleges would be represented by at least one college senator. To ensure the same amount of college senators, Tomblyn's amendment reduced the number of freshman senators and senators at large. Two weeks ago the senate amended the amendment to leave the number of freshman senators the same. This would have added two people to senate.

senator for every 2,000 students.

The amendment has been tabled twice since its creation on Oct. 2. At that time, the Operations and Evaluations committee decided that the amendment be tabled until the next committee meeting, the amendment passed favorably 5.2.

On Oct. 16, the last full senate meeting, the senate decided to table the amendment once again after arguing about amendments to the restructuring amendment.

However, realizing that he would not get the two-thirds needed to pass the amendment, Tomblyn voted against his amendment.

"If I had kept my vote it would have ended here tonight," Tomblyn said. "It couldn't have been brought up again this session."

Though he does not know when he will bring up the bill he was disappointed in the outcome of the vote.

CLARKSVILLE, Tenn.—Promising to win one for "Mr. Lincoln," Bob Dole began his final push for an electoral breakthrough Wednesday by suggesting President Clinton's re-election would plunge the nation into a recession.
"The Clinton recovery ended today," Dole said at a campus rally here as he stumped for votes in the South.

The region is generally a GOP presidential stronghold, but Dole is still struggling to bolster his standing there.

Seizing on a new government report showing that the economy slowed in the July-September quarter, the Republican challenger asserted that the U.S. economy "is barely afloat" under Clinton's stewardshin.

"It doesn't take a team of economists to tell you what happens when you mix slow growth with increased taxes: That's a recipe for economic collapse," Dole said. "If this is a recovery, I can hardly wait for the recession."

WASHINGTON — Four years in the White House have dramatically altered Bill Clinton's vision of his presidency.

His once-grand designs have shrunk, reflecting a recognition that he bit off too much in his first term — and there's not a lot of money to spend anyway.

If he wins re-election, there is nothing in Clinton's agenda on the scale of his doomed plan to guarantee health insurance for every American.

Nor is there anything like his 1992 idea to persuade taxpayers to spend \$80 billion for a Rebuild America Fund.

"We've gone from the Great Society to the itty bitty society," said University of Virginia political scientist Larry Sabato. "Clinton has a thousand tiny plans, no overarching theme."

It is "an itsy bitsy agenda," agreed Brookings Institution presidential scholar Thomas Mann.
"There is no way this administration is going to pursue some liberal agenda. It just ain't going to happen."

BEIJING — The trial lasted four hours, and the verdict was harsh: 11 years in prison for Wang Dan, noe of the last active leaders of the 1989 Tiananmen Square democracy movement. With yesteday's swift judgment, China's Communist Party leaders signaled their resolve to silence critics.

But they also revealed worries about anti-government sentiment and the potent memories of the military assault that crushed the 1989 demonstrations.

"The student movement was such a big thing that nobody can forget it," said a man standing outside the courthouse where Wang was tried.

"Just because we don't talk about it openly doesn't mean we don't are," said the man, who refused to be identified.

For many, Wang symbolized that movement. As a Beijing University student, he led marches and called for a student union free of government control.

After the crackdown, the government put him atop its most-wanted list, flashing his picture on TV nationwide.

It only take 100 days for hemp to reach its maturity while it takes trees between five and 50 years to reach maturity for the use of paper.



For the past couple of weeks, the Dean of Students Office has been investigating a disruption at the Oct. 3 meeting of UK Lambda by members of Delta Sigma Phi social fraternity.

Dean of Students David Stockham said yesterday that his office has completed part of an investigation into the incident and found that it is not a hazing situation and that the fraternity as a whole is not at fault for anything that happened.

"There is not sufficient evidence to bring charges against the organization," Stockham said. He said the investigation did not produce enough proof that the fraternity had instigated the individual's behavior.

He said a greater "preponderance of evidence" was needed in the case so it would have been able to stand up against an appeal.

"Dean Hazard has rather thoroughly and exhaustively investigated the case," Stock-

"Dean Hazard has rather thoroughly and exhaustively investigated the case," Stockham said.

Thomas Harper, Delta Sigma Phi president, said he was happy the office ruled the incident was not hazing.

"We maintained throughout the investigation that it was not," Harper said. "We know we are not a hazing organization."

However, even though charges are not being brought against the fraternity as a whole, Stockham said, an investigation continues into the actions of the individuals and whether or not the University has a case against them.

"Only part of the investigation is over," he said.

Film critic Dole accuses Hollywood again for encouraging drug use

LOS ANGELES — Presidential candidate Bob Dole, doubling as a film critic, accused the entertainment industry of on-screen drug pushing in movies such as Pulp Fiction and Trainsporting.

But it looks like Dole may have been preaching to the choir: When it comes to glamorizing or glorifying drugs, most filmmakers just Don't Do It.

The days of free-spirited scenes of smoking, snorting and shooting drugs are largely gone — and that's not just according to Hollywood itself. Even conservative observers agree that movies have broken the habit.

"Dole is 10 years too late," said David Horowitz, director of the Center for the Study of Popular Culture in Los Angeles and a Dole supporter, "Films, in general, have become relatively conservative."

say Horowitz — even within the films cited by Dole as proof of Hollywood's irresponsibility.

In Pulp Fiction, director Quentin Tarantino's 1994 comic-violent view of the workady lives of two hit men, a gangster's moll played by Uma Thurman is indeed sexy, stylish and a drug user.

"Drugs are bad enough. If you just demonstrate what they do, that's a prevention message in and of itself," Leshner said.

Dole and other politicians have the right and responsibility to condemn Hollywood moissteps, but they have to be accurate.

If the Hollywood movie script on drugs has indeed been rewritten, it isn't the first time. The issue was not treated lightly or kindly in past eras: In 1955, for example, hard drugs were the evil in Otto Preminger's graphic The Man with the Golden Arm., which starred Frank Sinarta as a junkie.

Then came the revolution, and drugs were woven into movies as they were into the times. From the high travelers of 1969's Esp Rider to the marijuana-scented giddiness of comics Cheech and Chong in Up in Smake to the siliness of inept nonuser Woody Allen sneezing away a line of coaine in

Annie Hall, drugs got at least a wink, if not a nod.


So what's changed? Society, and the Hollywood community with it, say observers and misnisty with it, say observers and misnisty with it, say observers and misnisters. Bryan L. Dyak, president of an industry-sponsored group that helps draft suggestions for the depiction of such issues as drugs, sex and violence, has seen a whole-sale shift in attitude.

The council is working with the National Institute on Drug Abuse to develop and distribute new information on the physical effects of drugs, and sponsored a 1995 symposium with then-U.S. drug care Lee Brown and other experts that drew 135 industry executives.

Politicians and Hollywood can team up effectively. Dyak said, noting that the council worked coley with then-first lady Nancy Reagan and her "Just Say No-anti-drug campian."

But Dole and his "Just Don't Dole" effort erred in attacking Hollywood, Dyak argues.

"When all is said and done, the industry is part of the solution, not part of the problem," Dyak said. "That's reality."

Kaiser is looking at Susan Gibson in the No. 1 spot for the women, where the freshman has been all season long. On her heels is Colleen Crawford, per-forming better than ever, Kaiser said.



The fundamental rule of intel-lectual discourse, which is often forgotten, is that an opinion is just that: an opinion (i.e. separate from fact). Open-minded pluralistic thinking does not equate with political apathy, and close-minded dogmatic thinking does not equate with political activism.

The danger is that if we always express our opinions and never lis-ten, then we have little opportuni-ty for our beliefs and ideas to evolve. We have cut off any

chance of intellectual growth which could result from the exchange of ideas.

When we state our opinions as fact, as THE ONE RIGHT WAY to think about things, no one is forced to consider the issues at hand beyond more than a cursory examination. Stagnation of ideas occurs, and we allow ourselves to be pigeon-holed as a "conservative" or a "liberal," rather than considering the issues for their own merit.

I noticed this disturbing inconsistency in myself the other day. When I bicycle or jog on the side of the road, I constantly think, "These damn drivers are crazy—they whiz by too fast, and get too close to me." However, I noticed that when I drive my car around campus, I often think, "These bikers and joggers are crazy—they whiz by too fast, and get too close to the control of the property of the control of the control of the property of the control of the contro

If someone who is both a jogger and a driver can hold such rigid views even when they are forced to switch roles, then how stuck in our political opinions might we become when we are never forced to take another viewpoint?

I'd like to entreat armchair political analysts, political activists, candidates columnists, and anyone who chooses to engage in a conversation to tyno only to listen to other viewpoints, but also to bear them. I am not going so far as to say that all ideas have equal merit, but rather am asserting that if we give all ideas equal attention, we might be able to better decide which ones have more merit. That's only my opinion, of course.

It angers me that a few individuals would say that Wilder was over-zealous in making her appeal to the SAB, which resulted in her reinstatement and consequent coronation as queen.



Harrelson testing limits of freedom in Kentucky

day.

The judge will give his review within 90 days.

The actor/environmentalist planted four French industrial hemp seeds in eastern Kentucky June 1 so he could get arrested and challenge the state's marijuana law.

He thinks treating hemp and its psychoactive cousin the same is unconstitutional.

Harrelson compared himself yesterday to "Hustler" magazine founder Larry Flynt, a native of nearby Magoffin County. Harrelson, who is playing Flynt for an upcoming movie, said he is testing the limits of freedom in the same way Flynt did.

"I never would have probably tried some of this, you know the planting and everything, if it hadn't been for the influence of playing him," Harrelson said. "His was about freedom for the farmers."

Harrelson, partner in a California company that makes clothes and other products from imported hemp, is charged with a misdemean count of possession of anaiyunan. He bought a simple play for the purpose of planting them.

Kentucky changed its legal definition of marijuana in 1992 to remove an exemption for hemp products.

hemp are two distinct plants, and that treating them the same is unconstitutionally arbitrary.

But a Kentucky State Police detective put on the stand by Lec County Attorney Tom Jones testified that legalizing hemp production would cripple marijuana eradication.

Sgt. James Tinton a member

fied that legalizing hemp production would cripple marijuana

Sgt. James Tipton, a member
of the Governor's Marijuana
Strike Force who has seen plots
with 400,000 pot plants, said the
two plants are indistinguishable
from the air.

He pictures farmers mixing
high-grade marijuana in with the
hemp to make a profit.

"In about a year or so, you
would be overrun by marijuana
dealers," he said. "We would have
to test every plant in every field. It
could not be done."

But Varley Wiedeman, a
retired University of Louisville
biology professor, testified for the
defense that the two plants are
distinct subspecies of cannabis.

He said they are easily distinguishable from each other at
maturity. Harrelson argued that
hemp would be a great product
for Kentucky farmers, who are
facing possible hard times with
restrictions on tobacco.

He said it can be used to make
cloth, paper, oils, cosmetics and
thousands of other produces.

He said that would be a great
alternative to cutting down 50
million trees a year for paper.

But Scott Smith, chairman of
the agronomy department at UK,
said the crop's economic potential

He said hemp can't compete with Southern wood chips, for instance, which go for about \$25.
Jones questioned Harrelson about why he doesn't support production of kenaf, a plant that has no psychoactive THC and shares most of hemp's qualities.
Harrelson said he was interested in anything that would help the environment.

Harrelson, asked if he was wearing any hemp clothing, said, "I plead the Fifth."

Despite the carnival atmosphere, Harrelson is taking the case seriously. After all, he is facing 12 months in jail.

"We're just going to keep going, no matter what happens, he said.

Donna Cockrel, the Shelby County teacher facing disciplinary action for allowing Harrelson to display hemp products in her classroom, took a personal day to attend the hearing. She is rooting for the actor all the way.

"If they turn loose on him," she said, "they have to turn loose on me."
