MRAP EVENTS AND CURRENT PROJECTS

1. The Study Team met for an all day session on Oct. 16th at which time we discussed the surveys sent to the Department Heads. Each member of the team had taken an area of the survey and prepared a detailed report for discussion. A summary report will be sent to the Director and the entire staff in the near future.

2. The library staff (excluding Dept. Heads) will receive a survey within the next week. This survey will allow the remaining staff to input their concerns and needs to be considered in the MRAP Study.
3. The Chairperson, John Bryant, attended an MRAP training session in Washington Oct. 23-25. Attending were the other ARL members under going MRAP this year. Each chairperson presented a detailed description of the progress at their respective institutions. Among other items discussed were the selection of the task forces, identifying areas to study and total staff participation in the study.
4. The Study Team is now into the second phase of MRAP in which we are carefully studying the Libraries environment, i.e. its relation to the University, major trends in higher education, the University responses to these trends, and the trends as they effect the Library.
