Grateful Med

The Medical Center Library has received notification that the National Library of Medicine has funded the "Grateful Med Outreach Project for Southeast Kentucky." This is an eighteen month project for the MC Library to design and conduct programs to introduce online searching via Grateful Med to health professionals in underserved areas and to provide them with a link to information services from health science libraries. The project is a cooperative venture with the Southeast Kentucky Area Health Education Center Library and will cover health providers in 16 counties in that region. The project director is Janet Stith.

From the "Watch Out Where You Strip" Department

The following important information concerning the placement of security strips was printed in a recent issue of the Heckman Bindery Newsletter:

"When inserting detection devices into individual serial issues, please be sure to place them in the center of the gutter margins. When detection devices are placed near the head or tail of the text block, trimming becomes difficult and in many cases will not be performed.

"Also, when placing detection devices in signature issues, be sure you do not insert them in the center fold. Otherwise we must remove them prior to sewing. The removal of such devices can amount to a substantial time charge and in many cases may damage the serial issue."

This same advice would apply to pamphlet-type monographs that might be sent to the commercial bindery.

Preservation Planning Program Update

The ARL Preservation Planning Program being conducted by the UK Libraries has entered the final phase of the nine-month study. The five task force reports have been submitted and the Study Team is preparing the final report, to be completed in December. Consultant Michele Cloonan will visit the Libraries on November 2 to meet with the Study Team and Task Force members for the third and final time. The Study Team expresses its appreciation to all of the task force members for their assistance and hard work over the past few months.
