



FIFTH ANNUAL U.K. INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT

The finest tournament field ever assembled in advance of the national finals.

That's the way the experts are describing the fifth annual University of Kentucky Invitational Tournament to be staged in spacious Memorial Coliseum on the Kentucky campus December 20 and 21.

The lineup leaves little doubt that the high-calibre UKIT again has grabbed off the elite basketball clubs of the nation. Besides the host Kentuckians of wily Adolph Rupp, third ranked team in the country last season and expecting improvement, the field will include undefeated national champion North Carolina; the number eight outfit, West Virginia; and perennially powerful and colorful Minnesota of the Big 10.

Pairings for the opening night of the tourney have North Carolina pitted against Minnesota and Kentucky taking on West Virginia. The two winners in first night play clash for the championship on Saturday night, Dec. 21, following a consolation encounter between the first session losers. Tipoff times are 7:30 p.m. Central Daylight Saving Time each night on the opening game and approximately 9:25 p.m. on the second contest.

Besides the increasingly-important national

prestige attached to the honors in the UKIT, each of the participating teams picks up an equal share of the net proceeds which generally amount to around \$10,000. The Kentucky tourney is recognized as the most lucrative in the country and berths are eagerly sought by many teams willing to risk playing Baron Rupp's famous Wildcats on their home floor—where they have been beaten only four times since 1943.

The Wildcats have taken championship honors in the UKIT three of the four years that the tournament has been in existence, losing only in 1955 to Dayton.

The UKIT was inaugurated in 1953 with the thought of furthering a trend toward returning big-time basketball to college-controlled arenas. Selection of teams by Tournament Manager Bernie Shively, Kentucky's Athletic Director, is based on consideration of national reputation in cage circles, potential calibre of play expected and a desire to give the tournament a national scope with top flight teams representing different sections of the country. Taking part in previous tournaments have been LaSalle, Utah and Dayton (all appearing twice); UCLA, Duke, Southern California, Minnesota, Illinois and Southern Methodist.

NORTH CAROLINA Tar Heels

North Carolina's Tar Heels, directed in outstanding fashion by "the counterfeit Rebel," Frank McGuire, swept past all opposition in convincing fashion last season and annexed the NCAA championship in the process to become the nation's biggest winning perfect record unit of all time with a streak of 32 straight victories. Even Coach McGuire was predicting before the close of the 1956-57 campaign that his team would be 50 percent better in 1957-58. That caused many observers and opposing coaches to quip: "Fifty percent better than perfect should make the Tar Heels something to behold." The great Lennie Rosenbluth graduated and North Carolina has suffered injuries to 6-9 Joe Quigg, who was tabbed as Rosenbluth's successor, 6-4 shooting demon York Larese and 6-7 junior standout Danny Lotz. But nothing seems to stop their steam roller drive toward another national championship as they enter the UKIT in the role of prohibitive favorite and with a 36-game undefeated skein going.

The talk in Southern Conference circles centers on the prospect of the undefeated Mountaineers ending up with at least as good a team as their 1957 outfit and possibly better. Youthful Fred Schaus, 32-year-old veteran of only three seasons in the coaching ranks, looks at the season as a building year but most observers feel the Mountaineers should rank as almost prohibitive favorites in quest of their fourth successive Southern Conference title. Chief All-America hope on the West Virginians' current roster is Lloyd Sharrar, a 6-10 pivot operative voted the outstanding player in the conference last year. The Mountaineers apparently aren't lacking anything either in continuing their fast break offensive pattern with an abundance of players of near-equal ability.



Ed Beck looks like one of the country's top defensive postmen while the muchheralded Johnny Cox is finding the early going difficult in living up to his reputation. Junior College transfer Adrian Smith rounds out the Kentucky starters as a fine-performing guard.
