January 8th

The Faculty met as usual. Cadet Officers Brown, Merrivether, and Floete were reported as negligent of duties during the Christmas recess. Prof. Patterson was requested to express to these officers the disapproval ^{by the Faculty} of their conduct.

Messrs Moore and Hays were present charged with breaking into the cellar and taking coal belonging to the College. They admitted that they were in the cellar but denied breaking down the door and taking coal. In the investigation of the case these young men made statements which they afterwards admitted were not strictly correct. Not wishing to press the evidence against these young men any further it was resolved to write to their parents requesting their immediate withdrawal from College. Mr Hays ^{when he} was notified of the decision wept, asking that we spare his parents the mortification of knowing of his conduct. On further deliberation the Faculty concluded to try both of the young men again, requiring them however to move from the College grounds to some private family.
