Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, April 3, 1979.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met in regular statutory session at 2:00 o'clock (EDT) on Tuesday, April 3, 1979, in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Professor Michael Adelstein, Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler, Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. L. D. Gorman, Mrs. Sally Hermansdorfer, Dr. David A. Hull, Mr. Thomas B. Kessinger, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. Homer W. Ramsey, Mr. W. B. Terry, Mr. Eugene Tichenor, Professor Constance Wilson, and Dr. John R. Woodyard. Absent from the meeting were Mr. William R. Black, Mr. George W. Griffin, and Mr. Zirl A. Palmer. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Lewis W. Cochran, Robert Zumwinkle, Stanley Wall, Peter P. Bosomworth, Raymond R. Hornback, Jack C. Blanton, and Donald B. Clapp; Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel; and Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research. Representatives of the various news media were in attendance.

### A. Meeting Opened

Mr. Sturgill, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 2:06 p.m. Following the invocation, pronounced by Mrs. Hermansdorfer, the Chairman requested Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel, to administer the oath of office to the following: Mr. Tracy Farmer, appointed by Governor Carroll to replace Mr. John R. Gaines for a four year term ending December 31, 1982; Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, reappointed for a four year term ending December 31, 1982; Mrs. Sally Hermansdorfer reappointed for a four year term ending December 31, 1982; and Mr. Thomas B. Kessinger, reappointed for a term ending June 30, 1982.

The Secretary called the roll and reported sixteen members present and three absent. The Chairman then declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 2:09 p.m.

### B. Minutes Approved

Without discussion, on motion duly made, seconded, and carried, the reading of the Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Committee on March 5, 1979, was dispensed with and the Minutes were approved as published.

### C. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary called attention to his monthly Report to the Trustees, copies of which had been distributed earlier, and recommended its acceptance. Without objection, it was so ordered.

### D. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

After noting that the personnel changes in PR 2, Recommendations of the President, were routine in nature, President Singletary recommended its approval. Without discussion, on motion by Governor Chandler, seconded by Mr. Clay, and passed, PR 2 was approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

### E. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3)

President Singletary said that the two items in PR 3, had been received in his office too late for prior distribution and, therefore, suggested that the two parts be considered and acted upon separately.

This being agreeable to the members of the Board, President Singletary recommended approval for transmission to the Council on Higher Education, of three capital construction projects as follows: (1) a parking lot on College View at a cost of \$165,000, (2) additional chiller capacity at Cooling Plant #1 at a cost of \$864,000, and (3) additional chiller capacity at the Medical Center Cooling Plant at a cost of \$700,000.

Without discussion, Mr. Homer Ramsey moved approval of the three capital construction projects. His motion was seconded by Mr. Frank Ramsey and passed without dissent. (See PR 3-I at the end of the Minutes.)

Before recommending approval of PR 3-II, Administration Appointments, President Singletary explained that the recommendation that Dr. David L. Cowen be named Acting Chairman of the Department of Medicine did not represent the expressed preference of the faculty in that department. It is, however, the recommendation of the Search Committee, the Dean of the College, the Vice President of the Medical Center, and the President of the University. President Singletary then recommended approval by the Board. Governor Chandler moved that PR 3-II be approved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Frank Ramsey and passed without dissent. (See PR 3-II at the end of the Minutes.)

### F. Budget Revisions for 1978-79 (PR 4)

President Singletary indicated that Mr. Carter, Budget Director, was present and would be pleased to answer any questions relative to the proposed revisions in the 1978-79 Budget as recommended in PR 4. There being none, President Singletary recommended approval and, on motion duly made, seconded and passed, the Budget Revisions for 1978-79 were authorized and approved. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

### G. Naming the New Fine Arts Building (PR 5)

President Singletary said that the Committee for Naming University Buildings had given serious consideration to suggestions made to it relative to names for buildings and rooms in the new arts complex being constructed at the corner of Rose and Euclid and had submitted its recommendations to him for transmittal to the

Board of Trustees. The names, as recommended in PR 5, have his concurrence and President Singletary recommended approval. On motion by Mrs. Hermansdorfer, seconded by Professor Adelstein, and passed, PR 5 was approved. (See PR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

### H. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 6)

President Singletary indicated that the proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations as recommended in PR 6 had both faculty and administrative support. He then recommended the proposed amendment be received for consideration and put on the agenda for Board action at its next regular meeting. Without objection, it was so ordered by the Chairman. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

# I. Appointment of Dr. James E. Funk as Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs and Coordinator of Energy Research (PR 7)

President Singletary said that the appointment of Dr. Funk as Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs and Coordinator of Energy Research would be tremendously important in coordinating and promoting the expanding programs in energy research and education being carried on on the University campus. Dr. Funk is very knowledgeable in this field and is the logical person for this assignment. He will continue as Director of the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research but will resign as Dean of the College of Engineering as soon as an Acting Dean is appointed.

On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Homer Ramsey, and passed, Dr. Funk's appointment was approved. President Singletary noted that Dr. Funk was present at the meeting and Mr. Sturgill expressed the thanks of the Board members for his willingness to undertake this important assignment. (See PR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

### J. Kentucky Transportation Center (PR 8)

After briefly outlining the need for the coordination and management of the academic, private, and governmental sectors in addressing the broad range of transportation related problems on an interdisciplinary basis, President Singletary recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the establishment of a Kentucky Transportation Center in the College of Engineering. Governor Chandler so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Kessinger and passed without dissent. (See PR 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

### K. University Research Professorships (PR 9)

President Singletary said it was with much pleasure that he was recommending approval of four University Research Professorships for 1979-80 to be awarded to Professor William Y. Adams, Department of Anthropology, Professor Syed A. Nasar, Department of Electrical Engineering, Professor Kurt Niedenzu, Department of Chemistry, and Professor Donald Ringe, Department of English, in recognition of their outstanding research achievements. He concluded by noting that this was the third year that Research Professorships have been given. The four recipients were present at the meeting and were

introduced. After acknowledging their contributions to the University's research program, Mr. Sturgill called for a motion for approval of the naming of these individuals as University Research Professors for 1979-80. Mrs. Wilson so moved. Her motion was seconded by Professor Adelstein and passed without dissent. (See PR 9 at the end of the Minutes.)

### L. Honorary Degree Recipients (PR 10)

President Singletary recommended that approval be granted for awarding the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws to Mr. Carl D. Perkins, Doctor of Letters to Mr. Lyman T. Johnson and Mr. James Still, and the Doctor of Science to Mr. S. M. Shah. Mr. Clay so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Kessinger and passed unanimously. (See PR 10 at the end of the Minutes.)

### M. Faculty Retirement

President Singletary reported that, in lieu of the necessary guidelines from HEW relative to the Age Discrimination in Employment Act as it related to faculty retirement, the University administration had taken steps to solve the immediate problem with those scheduled for retirement by July 1, 1979, by allowing these individuals to apply for a one year post-retirement appointment. At the end of the year those accepting such appointments will have the option of accepting or rejecting the University's program which will be applicable for those reaching age 65 in 1979-80.

### N. Affirmative Action

Through the use of charts, President Singletary and Dr. Clapp reported on the University's current status in respect to the number of black faculty members and women faculty members presently at the University and the plans which are being made to increase these numbers. It was noted that the University has made progress during the past few years, but it needs to improve even more within the next five years.

### O. Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)

Mr. Clay reported that the University was "on target" and moved that the Interim Financial Report for the seven month period ending January 31, 1979, be accepted. His motion was seconded by Mr. Gorman and passed. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

### P. Student Code Committee Report (SCCR 1)

Mr. Clay presented the Student Code Report for Mr. Griffin, the Committee Chairman. He indicated that the proposed revision in the Student Code had been received by the Committee after going through the prescribed procedures prior to its transmittal by President Singletary to the Committee. The revision proposed would bring Article V of the Code into conformity with Sections E-19-1 and E-19-2 of U.K. Business Procedures as they relate to financial delinquency.

The Student Code Committee recommends approval of the proposed revision to Article V as set forth in SCCR 1 and Mr. Clay put that recommendation in the form of a motion. His motion was seconded and passed without dissent. (See SCCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

### Q. Meeting Adjourned

After determining there was no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned at 2:41 p.m.

### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendment to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky be received for consideration and, provided at least one month has elapsed, be put on the agenda for action by the Board of Trustees at its next regular meeting.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined.)

Amendment - Change the second paragraph of Part X,C,2 (page 36) to read:

Full-time faculty members employed on an academic year basis shall be on assignment from August 16 through May 15 and are expected to be normally available for participation in appropriate academic activities during this period. To insure opportunities for vacations, faculty members employed on this basis shall be limited to a maximum of two and one-half months employment in activities funded by the University or its affiliated corporations during the summer period (May 16 through August 15).

Background: This amendment is supported by both faculty and administration. Its approval will undergird implementation of desired University practice which will provide more flexibility and greater incentive relative to faculty members engaging in extramurally-funded research and service activities during summer periods.

### KENTUCKY TRANSPORTATION CENTER

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees establish a Kentucky Transportation Center (KTC) in the College of Engineering.

Background: The Kentucky Transportation Center will serve to stimulate, coordinate, and manage the efforts of the academic, private and governmental sectors in addressing a broad range of transportation related problems on an interdisciplinary basis. In addition to problem solving, the Center will assist in the development of educational programs such as workshops, seminars, conferences and training sessions. The Center will address all facets of the transport of persons and goods and the delivery of services as well as all modes of transport including water, rail, air, public transport, highway, cycling and walking. Attention will be paid not only to the physical elements of transport systems but also to the broader societal issues and impacts associated with various transportation alternatives and the institutional environments within which decisions concerning transportation are reached. This will require the cooperative effort among many units of the academic community, private sector, industries and business, and the various levels of government.

The role of the Center is more specifically defined by the following objectives:

- To increase interdisciplinary awareness and involvement by providing a central focus for transportation investigations;
- To advise and assist government and the private sector on issues related to transportation.
- To assist in developing continued learning opportunities for professionals working in the field of transportation;
- To stimulate research activities in the area of transportation in the academic community; and
- 5. To assist the research and development program of the Kentucky Department of Transportation (KYDOT) in interdisciplinary investigations.

### CARL D. PERKINS

Carl D. Perkins was born in 1912 in Hindman, Kentucky. He graduated from the Jefferson School of Law in Louisville in 1935. He served in the US Army during World War II, overseas in the European theater of operations and participated in the Battle of Northern France, the Battle of the Bulge, the Rhineland and Central Europe campaigns.

In Kentucky, he has served as Commonwealth Attorney, as Knott County attorney, and in the State Legislature. He has been a congressman from the 7th district of Kentucky since 1948, which makes him one of the most senior members.

In Washington, he is well known as Chairman of the House Education and Labor Committee, under which title he has contributed immeasurable support to Education. He still considers the passage of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1964 one of his greatest achievements—one which poured money into underprivileged school districts in the big-city ghettos and places like Eastern Kentucky. He was instrumental in getting compensation for miners with black lung disease. His work on this committee has also reflected favorably on this University, to which he has lent support for various extramural funding.

For his untiring work on behalf of education in the United States, and his interest in and contributions to his home state of Kentucky, Carl Perkins is being recommended for the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws.

### LYMAN T. JOHNSON

Mr. Lyman T. Johnson was born in 1906 in Tennessee. He attended Knoxville College Academy, received his A.B. from Virginia Union University in 1930 and his Master of Arts from the University of Michigan in 1931.

An educator by profession, he was a teacher and administrator in the public schools of Louisville from 1933 until his retirement in 1973.

Mr. Johnson has been active in the field of human rights for over forty-five years. During the 1930's he was instrumental in the fight that culminated in Kentucky's black teachers receiving equal pay. During the 1940's he spearheaded the movement to desegregate higher education in Kentucky and was the first black student to attend the University of Kentucky.

In the 1950's and 1960's, as president of the Louisville NAACP, Mr. Johnson led the desegregation movement in that city. He served as president of the Louisville NAACP many times during his career and has received numerous honors for his extensive public service.

For his work in public service, and specifically for his activities in the field of human rights, Mr. Johnson is being recommended for the honorary degree of Doctor of Letters.

### JAMES M. STILL

James Still was born in 1906 in Hindman, Kentucky, received his B. A. from Lincoln Memorial University in 1929, the M. A. from Vanderbilt in 1930 and a B.S.L.S. from the University of Illinois in 1931. His work included a period as Librarian at the Hindman Settlement School and as Associate Professor at Morehead State University, but his great interest and true profession has always been that of a writer. His first short story was published in 1936, followed by Hounds on the Mountain, a book of poetry. Since that time he has steadily produced quality literature and has gained national recognition, witnessed by the numerous awards he has received—among which we name the O. Henry Memorial Prize for a short story, the Southern Authors Award and two Guggenheim Fellowships.

Among his 8 books and numerous short stories published in distinguished journals and magazines, we would mention the novel which shared the Southern Author's Award with Thomas Wolfe's You Can't Go Home Again.

Of special interest to Kentuckians is the fact that the subject matter for many works is inspired directly in the Appalachian Region with which he is most familiar. His literary portrayal of this area places him among the most important regional writers of Kentucky.

For his outstanding contribution to the field of creative writing, Mr. Still is being recommended for the honorary degree of Doctor of Letters.

### S. M. SHAH

Professor Emeritus S. M. Shah was born in 1905 in India. He received his Bachelor's degree in Bombay, and the M.A., Ph.D. and Doctor of Literature in London. During his stay in England, he was a Government of India Research Scholar at Oxford, and then at Cambridge.

Before coming to the University of Kentucky in 1966, he held positions at Aligarh University, the University of Wisconsin, Northwestern University, and the University of Kansas. After a distinguished career as both undergraduate and graduate teacher in the Department of Mathematics, he retired in 1976.

Recognition of his excellence in teaching and research has been shown in his election as Distinguished Professor by the faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences in 1969, and the Alumni Association Research Award in 1969. He has also received research support from the National Science Foundation from 1965 onwards.

His contributions to the field of complex analysis have brought distinction to the Department of Mathematics and to the University of Kentucky. Three books and over 130 shorter works attest to constant activity and contribution to his profession; his work as Associate Editor of various journals in the field have attested to international recognition of his leadership.

For his teaching, service and scholarly contributions, Professor Shah is being recommended for the honorary degree of Doctor of Science.

### AMENDMENT OF CODE OF STUDENT CONDUCT

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve the suggested revision of ARTICLE V - Statement of Financial Delinquency in Student Rights and Responsibilities. Part I. Code of Student Conduct, effective August 16, 1979.

Background: Under Article VII--Amendment, only the Board of Trustees may amend the Code of Student Conduct. Responsibility for proposing revisions to the Code of Student Conduct is delegated to a committee consisting of students, faculty, and administrators. The committee accepts and reviews recommendations from students, faculty and administrators regarding revisions and forwards them to the President for presentation to the Board of Trustees for its consideration.

As in past years, the committee solicited proposals for Code revision from members of the University community via <a href="The Kernel">The Kernel</a>. Only one proposal was received, pertaining to Article V, Statement of Financial Delinquency. The committee evaluated and revised the proposal, cleared it with both the Vice President for Business Affairs and the Dean of Admissions and Registrar, and announced the proposed revision verbatim in two issues of <a href="The Kernel">The Kernel</a>. Having received no negative comments on the proposal, the committee decided to endorse it and submit it to the President for his consideration and forwarding to the Board of Trustees. The intent of the proposed revision is to make Article V of the Code consistent with Sections E-19-1 and E-19-2 of UK Business Procedures issued on July 1, 1978.

The proposed revision was approved by the President and it was forwarded to the Board of Trustees Student Code Committee, which concurs and recommends approval by the Board.

### ARTICLE V - STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL DELINQUENCY

### Section

- 5.1 Student Responsibility
- 5.11 The University expects the student to be financially responsible and not be delinquent in his/her financial obligations to the University or to any department or division thereof, including room and board payments to sanctioned fraternal student organizations. Such obligations shall not include fines and penalties assessed against the student by other than University officers.
- 5.2 Unmet Financial Obligations
- 5.21 [Financial obligations that are not met within 10 days after the date due shall be reported in writing to the proper office.

  Obligations to any division or department of the University shall be reported to the office designated by the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer.]

Offices or departments of the University, with previous approval of the Vice President for Business Affairs, will notify a student twice of an unmet financial obligation owed to them exceeding \$20.00.

If not paid within 60 days, the office or department will notify the Registrar's Office that the student is delinquent.

5.22 [The appropriate business office shall notify the student of the financial obligation. If the student does not settle the obligation by the date designated on the notice, he/she shall, subject to regulations promulgated by the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer be considered delinquent, and that office shall notify the Registrar.]

After the Registrar has been so notified, the Registrar shall not allow the student to register, transfer credits, be readmitted to the University, or receive the graduation diploma which certifies the degree earned until the office or department declaring the delinquency notifies the Registrar that the obligation has been met or until the statute of limitation on collection applies.

- [5.23 After the Registrar has been notified that a student is delinquent, the Registrar shall not allow the student to register, or to transfer credits, or certify the student for graduation, until the Registrar has been notified in writing by the appropriate business office that the obligation has been settled.]
- 5.3 Disputed Liability

If there is a dispute as to whether or not a student is legally liable for a financial obligation asserted by the University, and the student challenges such obligation through either timely administrative or legal means, then the sanctions of Article V with respect to registration shall not apply until final resolution of the dispute.
