Yesterday UK administration, employees and students gathered on the steps of the newly-renovated Scovell Hall to celebrate the consolidation of Human Resource Services into one location. Originally the different departments — STEPS, Benefits, Wage and Salary, Development, Records and Employment — had been scattered across campas at rive different sites.

"Having all of the departments in one location makes it much easier for all of the employees," said Ann Fister, associate director of Human Resource Services.

"There isn't the hassle of traveling from one building to another to gain the specific service you need."

need. Sovell Hall, which once served as the home of the College of Agriculture, went through a series of renovations in 1903, 1911 and 1936.

This latest rebuilding now allows HRS and the Ag Communications Department of the College of Agriculture to share the same location.

"Our job was to redesign the building to make more room for Human Resource Services," said Jamie Draper of Omni Architecture.

The Omni Architecture firm was chosen by the University to complete the task of adding employee training rooms, administration offices and a new reception area to the building located on Washington Street and Limestone.

### **WORLD Serbs making** moves toward peace

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina — Bosnian Serbs began pulling tanks away from Sarajevo and made grudging moves yesterday toward seeking peace. NATO, in no mood to accept half-measures, blasted the Serbs again with airstrikes. It was not immediately clear if the airstrikes were as severe a blow to Serb facilities and morale as on Wednesday, when NATO and the United Nations began its aggressive new strategy. In Washington, a senior Pentagon official would say only that the airstrikes were not in the immediate brains of the sarajeva care, where clouds were too low and thick. He spoke on condition of anonymity.

### NATION Student shoots homecoming queen

WILLIAMSON, W.Va. — A dropout who may have been infatuated with his high school's home-coming queen has been charged with shooting her to death just days before she was to start college.

James C. Pennington, 20, told authorities he shot Michael Ann Koontz twice with a .22-caliber weapon on Aug. 25, when the 17-year-old girl left home to run an errand, police said.

Ms. Koontz's body was found in woods near a sewage treatment plant just north of this tiny town on Monday, the same day the Wilson High School cheerleader and homecoming queen was to start classes at Aushall University. Pennington, who dropped out of Williamson High in 1992, was arrested Wethoesday and appeared at a hearing yesterday, where he was ordered held without bail. No plea was entered and his court-appointed lawyers had no comment.

# **QBs getting used to Uzelac**

Speedy and Haskins adjusting to offense By Brett Dawson Senior Staff Writer

Last year, it was no secret that the UK football team was going to have an offense built around a

to have an offense built around a posse of potent running backs.

Problem was, that offense averaged only 13.6 points and 279.7 yards per game, both at the bottom of the list in the Southeastern Conference — and in doing so, it nearly ignored the nass.

And spicing up the new offense to include an aerial game

offense to include an aerial game won't be easy.

This year's probable starter at quarterback, Jeff Speedy, threw for fewer yards last season than any starting QB in the SEC, and his efficiency rating of 75.7 was also dead last in the league.

To be fair, injuries limited Speedy to starting only seven of 11 games.

games. But add the stats of fellow part-time starter Antonio O'Fer-ral — now a wide receiver — and UK's hybrid starting quarterback would've been 10th in the league in passing yards, ahead of only Tennessee's Peyton Manning, Peyton Manning,

who played just 10 games, and Ronnie Gordon of Vanderbilt, a team which threw the football 29 fewer times than anyone

else in the league. Speedy thinks things will be better off in 1995. His reasons? A new attitude, and more impor-tantly, a brand new

tude, and more importantly, a brand new offense, courtesy of former Colorado offensive coordinator Elliot Uzelac. "Quarterbacks are the trigger men in this offense." Uzelac said. "They have a lot to do in this offense."

The new attitude is an intangible. But UK definitely has the new offense, one that will put a new focus on the tight end position, and one that Speedy said will make life easier for the UK quarterbacks. "Last year, we had the shot-

Though Speedy is a length ahead of the competition at quarterback, it's not a two-man race.


Sophomore Chris Ford, a converted cornerback, is listed third on the depth chart, and Curry said true freshmen Greg

disappointing 1994 season.

Strong safety Melvin Johnson with 129 tackles was first, followed by safety George Harris and cornerback Steven Hall in third and fourth positions.

The lack of tackling by the linebackers was not a positive statistic said defensive coordinator Mike Archer.

"We hope one of our lineback-

"We hope one of our lineback-ers this year is our leading tack-ler," Archer said. "If they're not,

than you're not going to see dra-matic improvement."

With the need for improve-ment great, Key admitted Archer has been drilling his troops

earnestly during the preseason in preparation for tomorrow's opener against Louisville.
"He's been on our ass a little bit," Key said, "but we need it."
As a result of the vigorous practice sessions, etc.

# **Cats hope backs find harmony**

Images of a musician preparing to perform come to mind when looking at UK's stable of running backs.

While a musician starts with Do Re Mi, the Wildcats are starting the season in the back-field with Moe, Ray and G.

Moe Williams, Ray McLaurin and Donnell Gordon, that is.

"(Tailback) is far and away our best position," UK coach Bill Curry said.

Not only is the tailback position one of Curry's deepest, it is also the most intriguing.

Take for instance the fact that McLaurin, a fullback last season, emerged as the number one tailback at the start of fall drills.

Now incumbent starter Images of a musician prepar-

Now incumbent starter Williams and Gordon, a backup last season, find themselves bat-tling for second place after off-season shoulder surgeries side-

tling for second place after offseason shoulder surgeries side-lined them during the spring.

"(The depth chart) has been really complicated by the emergence of Ray McLaurin who showed up having gained 14 pounds, lost body fat and increased speed," Curry said.
"He has emerged as a genuine threat to be a top tailback."

McLaurin, a junior, rushed for 87 yards in his first two seasons. But with Williams and Gordon on the shelf during the spring, he scampered for 459 yards and six touchdowns.

"What was good for (McLaurin) this spring was that he got a lot of work after not having been a real tailback last year," running backs coach Mike Drake said.
"He had to regain what he had beforeard estatements was the sort of the said of the

"He had to regain what he had before and redevelop what its like to be an I-back carrying the football."

While McLaurin's perfor mance might have surprised many outsiders, it was no sur-prise to Williams. "Ray's been doing this every-

"Ray's been doing this every-day in practice last year and the year before," he said. "He has been that good since day one." Williams, who rushed for 1,733 yards in his first two years at UK, seemed to be heir to the tailback throne at the conclusion

of last season. The junior ranks sixth on

Meanwhile Gordon, who rushed for 231 yards and an average of 6.1 yards per rush last season, could be the third tailback used by Curry and his staff.

The heightened sense of competition at tailback comes from the installation of a new offensive scheme. UK will move from the triple option of a year ago to new offensive coordinator Elliot Uzelac's one back system.

"I enjoy (the new system) a lot," McLaurin said. "It's a run-

ning backs offense. A back in this offense can look to carry the ball 20-30 times a game."

But everyone involved agrees

the competition will be benefi-cial to the Cats' running game.

"It will make each one of us better," Gordon said. "One mis-take can cost someone the posi-tion."

"It's a great situation to have, because we're going to need to have at least two or three guys playing." Drake said. "The offense requires that, and I'm just happy as heck to have such good players there."

the Mississippi State University is under investigation. In most cases, such as Alabama's, violations occurred outside the institution. Money, boosters and sports agents add up to spell probation.

"If we can keep those people out, we could eliminate probably 80 to 85 percent of the violations," Kramer said.

The problems began in 1990, when Florida was placed on probation for a year, in part because of illegal coaching supplements

of illegal coaching supplements made by former coach Galen Hall. In 1991, Tennessee was hit with a year's probation for an illegal football camp used for

recruiting.

Two years later, more serious violations surfaced. Auburn was sentenced to two years probation stemming from illegal loans made to players by boosters. Ole Miss, which was on probation in the mid-1980s, was slapped again

loans to players by boosters and wound up with the stiffest penalties since Southern Methodist was hit with the NCAA's "Death

Penalty" in the late '80s.

Alabama and Mississippi start
the SEC's 63rd season on probation.
"Probation hurts



more than just the players," said Auburn coach Terry Bowden. "It hurts the University, the community everyone associ-

ated with the University. It hurts the image of the conference.

Mississippi State has yet to respond to an NCAA letter that charges a MSU athletic department employee, two boosters and a former student assistant coach violated rules with pay-ments, loans and inducements to

ments, loans and inducements to players.

"There's no more speculation now," Bulldog coach Jackie Sherrill said at this year's SEC Media Days. "We know the issues we're dealing with. It's not going to affect us on the field."

Tennessee also had a run-in with the NCAA this summer.

A University-wide telephone

with the NCAA this summer.

A University-wide telephone scandal included some football players. Those players received punishment from coach Phil Fulmer. There are five NCAA schools currently on probation. They are:

The Crimson Tide will be on television, but no bowl game or SEC Championship game prompted University officials to pledge a serious fight with the NCAA. Funny how lost revenue will upset the higher-ups.

### Texas A&M

The Aggies can appear in the postseason this year, but will remain on probation until 1999.

### Mississippi

Life in Oxford has been stormy over the past decade for Rebel football. Now, scholar-ships have been drastically reduced; there will be no post-season for two years; and Ole Miss is on probation until 1998.

### Washington

The Huskies are on probation until 1996, but eligible for the postseason this year. Washington received jail time for an NCAA no-no: lack of institutional control.

### **Washington State**

WSU's violations were mild; they come off probation in 1996 with little damage done.





# **UK defense: 'time to fight back'**

Let's make things nice and simple. Free safety Melvin Johnson was a

great tackler.

He had a nose for the football. He had a knack for playing defense. But he played in the secondary. The goal of a defensive unit is to stop

offensive players before they reach the

Therefore, if Johnson never had to make a tackle, his team would probably

be doing something right.
One problem.
In his senior season, Johnson was the busiest man on the field, making a team-

leading 129 tackles.

That spells trouble and probably helps explain why the Cats finished last in three Southeastern Conference statistical

three Southeastern Conference statistical categories — total defense, rushing defense and scoring defense.

"As good as Melvin was — and he was a great player — for him to have as many tackles as he had was a great indication of the way we played," said defensive coordinator Mike Archer, who came to UK in 1002

But Archer is not making any excuses. In fact the career journeyman, who was once head coach at LSU, spent the long offseason preparing for 1995 and a chance at redemption.

"It's time to fight back, that's how I've away. That's their role. "Its time to fight back, that's now I've approached this season," Archer said. "I've told the guys 'people have rubbed your nose in the dirt and questioned you. It's time to go out and prove that you're a better defensive football team than what you showed last year."

Archer's defensive unit does have six.

Archer's detensive unit does have six starters returning, but only one of those returnees, end Kurt Supe, resides on the defensive line, the very place where many of the Cats' defensive woes began last season.

Linebacker Chad **Projected leaders** 

Hudson explained how breakdowns on the defensive line last season allowed enemy blockers to eliminate the Cats' linebacking corps from many

plays.

The result of the initial breakdown was a chain reaction that too often resulted in total defensive collapses and lopsided

scores.
"Everybody knows what their role is this year," said Hudson, who will be joined at the position by Donté Key, David Snardon and others. "The defensive line has been told the linebackers are supposed to be the leading tacklers and it's their job to keep the offensive line


"But at the same time we know we have to make more tackles this year. You know your not doing good when the safeties are making most of the tackles."

Because of injury and graduation, the Wildcat defense was forced to field a crop of young and inexperienced players, including some true freshmen. In fact, there were times last year when the Big Blue looked very green. "We played some players last year that probably weren't ready to play on this level," Archer said. "Hopefully the year growing—

Archer said. "Hopeful-ly the year growing — maturation wise, men-tally — will help us." The Cats do appear to have a solid secondary with nearly everyone but Johnson returning.

Snardon but Johnson returning. Five veterans are battling for playing time at cornerback, including juniors Van Hiles and Kiyo Wilson. At the other corner seniors Steven Hall and Carlos Collins should both see significant action. Now it's time for results. "As we all know, we weren't good," Archer said. "I know that, and I take that responsibility ... We've shown some improvement, but all this rhetoric means responsibility ... . We've shown some improvement, but all this rhetoric means nothing."

# **Uzelac hoping to ignite the Cats**

Perhaps the most interesting develop-ment during the spring was the excitement surrounding the new offense under offen-sive coordinator Elliot Uzelac.

The two-tight end, straight-ahead style of his new offense might be just the thing to ignite the potential with this UK squad

to ignite the potential with this UK squad or it might not.

New offensive formations, wrinkles and plays have been the hallmark of the Bill Curry era. The Stack-I offense of Darryl Dickey was given much attention, but the end result was mediocre at best.

Every year, there is optimism, and nearly every year, there is a huge letdown.

This year?

"When you go in that opener, you don't know how they are going to react," Uzelac said. "You really have to get into a game to see how everything develops."

While still being optimistic about the squad's outlook this season, the enthusiasm is toned down a bit this year. After all, you can't sound too cocky after going 1-10. There are also lingering questions about a UK offensive unit that finished last in the Southeastern Conference in total offense and scoring offense. The offense could muster only 279 yards a game and averaged just over 15 points per contest.

This year's team will face an uphill battle to get back on the right track and still

faces a lot of tough questions.

"A consistent offense is where you want to be, and we're not there yet," Uzelac said.
"It's better right now than it was last year."
The likely starter at quarterback will be junior Jeff Speedy, who kept his position as the No. 1 starter in fall practice. Speedy had the starting job last season and fought off sophomore Billy Jack Haskins.

Speedy should have plenty of options are the ball is snapped this year as UK is deep in the backfield and in the receiving corps.

The biggest change is the backfield sur-

is the backfield sur-rounds the emergence of junior Ray McLaurin as the new starter at tailback, beating out UK's 9th leading all-time rusher, Moe Williams

McLaurin won the

McLaurin won the job in the spring when Williams was injured and hasn't let go. Donnell Gordon gives added depth at the tailback position.

Uzelac said he feels the Wildcats will be able to give the quality playing time to the tailbacks, even though the offense calls for a one-back set most of the time.

"With a one-back set, you're still going to need all of them," Uzelac said.

Juniors Chris Davis and Isaac Curtis III

will get the starting nods in the two-tight end set. Curtis was UK's second-leading wide receiver last year, and was moved to

wide receiver has year, and the tight end in the spring.

At wide receiver, the Cats are deep with seniors Leon Smith and James Tucker as the starters. Freshmen Kevin Coleman and Child Ward and combourner Kio Sanford Craig Yeast and sophomore Kio Sanford add youth to the receivers, while junior Jaysuma Simms and senior Antonio O'Fer-

ral, who was backup quarterback last season, bring offensive experi-

ence to the position.

One of the biggest questions centers around the development of the offensive

line.
Seniors Barry Jones and Andy Britt will steady the left side of the line, Smith the left side of the line, and sophomore Brandon Jackson and freshman Jonas Liening will play on the right side. Sophomore John will start at center.

The offensive line took its lumps last year, but the Cats' line is even younger this season.

season.

Uzelac said he was confident, however, that the line has made progress over the summer, along with the rest of the offense.

"We're just going to get better and better," Uzelac said.
