





"I think a lot of people don't properly understand the ordinance," Stevens said. "A lot of people recounted the evils of alcohol, and we're not advocating that. We already have sales on Sunday, we're just modifying the hours."

The new ordinance would allow all restaurants, bars, liquor stores and grocery stores to sell alcohol by the drink as well as in package sales during specified hours. Distilled spirits and wine by the drink and beer by the package or drink would be allowed

from 11 a.m. Sunday to 2:30 a.m. Monday.

Packages of spirits or wine would be available from 1 p.m. to 9 p.m.

Currently, restaurants that seat at least 100 customers and make more than half their revenue from food sales can currently sell alcohol by the drink on Sundays from 1:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Stevens said that despite the comments of the opposition, he still stood behind the ordinance.

"I can't speak for the other council members, but they didn't change my mind," he said.

The next vote for final approval on the ordinance could come as early as tomorrow.

Warming may hurt whales' recovery

The Washington Post

As many as 118,000 gray whales roamed the Pacific before humans decimated the population through hunting, and human-induced climate change may now be depriving those that remain of the food they need, according to a study released Monday.

Today there are only about 22,000 Pacific gray whales, including about 100 in the western Pacific. By earning the genetic variability of the current population, scientists at Stanford University and the University of Washington at Seattle calculated that there were between 76,000 and

118,000 gray whales in the Pa-cific before commercial whal-ing in the 1800s shrank their numbers.

ing in the 1800s shrank their numbers.
Federal officials took east-ern Pacific gray whales off the endangered species list in the mid-1990s, but a rise in sea temperatures appears to have limited the whales' available food.

Stephen Palumbi, a professor of marine sciences at Stanford and a co-author of the study, said the research sugests that given the right conditions, the number of gray whales could increase in the years to come. But a warmer Bering Sea could impede this recovery, he said.







Women's safety should focus efforts on proactive answers

Despite UK's attempts over the last several years to cuttail violence against women on campus, the situation is just as dangerous as it has been. A recent survey reported in the Kernel on Sept. 5 showed the percentage of women who feel safe on UK's campus has nearly doubled since 2004. But the percentage of women who have experienced some sort of violence directed toward them has stagnated at 34.1 percent, down just 2.4 percentage points from 2004. And the Kernel reported that the drop was not statistically significant enough to say that fewer women are being victimized at UK, said Carol Jordan, the director of the UK Center for Research on Violence Against Women, which conducted both studies.

Fewer women are worried about the possibility of violence directed toward them and therefore, they are less likely to be on guard against potential dangers.

On a positive note, UK should be

dangers.

On a positive note, UK should be pleased that nearly four times the number of women are reporting rape crimes as compared to three years ago, according to the report. Yet, according to the survey, only 9.1 percent of all rapes are reported, a figure that is far from ideal.

All improvements in the number of women reporting rape crimes can be attributed to the proactive, educational policies of institutions such as the Center for Research on Violence Against Women at UK.

violence against women, neglecting areas of education and preventative reform.
