



HISTORICAL RESUME OF THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH

In the early part of 1872, in a log cabin on Norway Avenue, near Spring Hill Cemetery, eight sincere and devout Christians, namely the late Reverend Nelson Barnett, Walter Fry, Caroline King, Derby King, Betty Barnett, Murray Jasper, Henry Hunt and W. O. James, with the Late Reverend William Bryant, serving as advisor, organized, what today is known as "The First Baptist Church".

Moving from the log cabin on Norway Avenue to a rented building in the 200 block of Twelfth Street in 1879, a building was erected in the 800 block of Eighth Street at a cost of 1500.00. The present site known as Sixth Avenue at Eighth Street was purchased from the Central Land Company of West Virginia, purchase deed of May 16, 1891, as recorded in deed book $35\frac{1}{2}$, page 9 - recorded in the Cabell County Court House, Huntington, West Virginia. The purchase price being \$1350.00, payable as \$540.00 cash in hand and the balance of \$810.00 plus interest. On this site was erected the Church at a cost of \$15,000.00. The Church was completed under the pastorate of the late Reverend I. V. Bryant.

Over the years we know that our church (First Baptist) has done much good in the community. She has welcomed our new born, sanctified our marriages, and ministered to our sick and buried our dead.

In January, 1960, the Reverend Charles H. Smith of Lexington, Kentucky, assumed the pastorate of First Baptist. He remained in service until July 20, 1980, at which time he left to further his ministry to hundreds of thousands as Deputy Director of the NAACP.

Under Rev. Smith's spiritual guidance and through his untiring efforts, the church moved steadily forward:

The present \$250,000.00 Church ediface was erected in 1966;
Rotary Gardens, a housing project of 150 units, was developed;
The 16th Street Seafood Mart, Fisherman's Wharf and the
Seafood House were established;
New choirs and organizations were formed;
The First Baptist Church Child Development Center was
established which now has a Staff of 8 with 60 children;

First Baptist looks onward and upward. She continues to thrive and touch the hearts of many. As we move forward, let us remember these sacred words:

FAITH makes all things possible; LOVE makes them easy; PRAYER keeps them alive.
