In Review

Reverend Charles H. Smith was born in 1931 in Georgetown, Kentucky. He was reared in Lexington, Kentucky, where he received his elementary and secondary education; married to Miss Lillie Hamil-ton of Richmond, Virginia, two chldren, Jacqueline Yolette and Dabbis Salva. Debbie Selena.

Mr. Smith was graduated from Virginia Union University in 1953 with an A.B. in Language & Literature; from the same school in 1955 with a B.D. in Religion. In 1957, he was one of twelve men chosen to be trained in a pilot study in Public Health Administration and Human Relations at the University of Penn. In 1958, he continued post graduate studies in the field of clinical Psychology at the Univ. of Ky.

By the Grace of God, the following things have been accomplished in the past twelve months, under the leadership of our pastor.

One hundred and twenty-five members have been added to the Church and of this number, eighty of these came as candidates for Baptism.

New organizations have been born and are showing signs of growth; The Men's Organization, Ladies' Organization, The Chancel Choir, The Baptist Youth Fellowship which consists of three separate groups, namely, the Elementary, the Junior High and the Senior High and Above Group. Doctrine, Worship, Bible Study, Character Training, and Recreation are the main features of these groups.

Weekly Sunday Bulletins, Periodical Sermon Briefs, and Monthly Newspapers have been initiated.

Weekly Instruction Class for the Church School Faculty and any other person interested in Bible Study has been started and proved profitable.

A new modern well-designed Church Parsonage has been constructed at the cost of \$24,000 dollars and is now being occupied by the minister. The property has been appraised for more than

The Church Office has been fully modernized and equipped for service. 95% of our publications are printed in the office by the Church's own hired secretarial staff.

Our membership roster has been brought up-to-date with names, addresses, and telephone numbers. Our resident membership totals more than 530 at this time.

Our Church and all of its properties have been reappraised and insured for 90% of its appraisal value. (The maximum)

A general financing plan was instituted to cover the cost of our building program. The total pledges were more than the actual

The Church has grown spiritually in every direction. Many departments in the Church have manifested new life; training programs have been provided for the Deacon Board and the Mission

Department. Our Church School has doubled its weekly attendance.

Established a gross budget last year of \$33,000.

A parking lot has been provided that gives a \$40 a month income to the Church, and at the same time it is available for church parking on Sundays.

A bus for church use has been purchased.

A nursery has become a reality.
The Little Chapel, the ladies' lounge and men's restroom have been remodeled and painted.
The Weekday Religious Training Program for the young people culminates each year with educational tours to other states.
