Parking garage to open in March

Officials blame bad weather for delay

Weather has slowed construction on the parking structure across from Administration Drive, univer-sity officials said.

Joe Burch, vice president of university relations, said workers have not been able to finish the exterior of the structure because of constant rain over the last few days.

Instead, workers have been concentrating on the

inside.

Burch was careful not to give a specific time until the finish of the parking garage, but said the structure is "nearing completion."

He used the pedestrian skywalk, called the pedway, as an example.

Workers on the garage estimated three more "working days" are needed to lay the concrete. That, Burch explained, is three more days uninterrupted by bad weather.

Don Thornton, director of Parking and Transportation Services, said his department is hoping to move its offices into the garage by Feb. 21.

He warned, however, that would only mean the interior would be finished, not necessarily the exteri-

"We have our fingers crossed that we can get peo-ple parked in there on March 3," he said. "But that depends on how the weather goes."
Thornton said he didn't want to have cars in the garage while construction was going on.
The new garage, Parking Structure No. 5, is scheduled to have a little more than 1,000 parking paces; Thornton said.
Commuting students are scheduled to get about 300 and faculty are scheduled for about 600. More than 100 spaces are scheduled to be for visitors.
The new structure also will have more safety fea-

The new structure also will have more safety features than UK's older garages, Burch said.

For example, the elevators and stairwells will ave plenty of windows so people will be able to see at and in.

The garage will also have increased lighting and mergency phones like those on campus, Thornton

emergency phones like those on campus, Thornton said.

The pedway will have a special heating system, which will melt ice on the surface so pedestrians can safely walk to their cars, Thornton said.

Also, unlike UK's other garages, the new garage will close each night, Burch said.

Akthough cars will not be allowed into the garage, remaining cars will be let out, Thornton said.

UK Police will monitor the garage through closed circuit television, he said.

According to architecture documents, the parking structure was started in Oct. 1995. The structure was funded through a gradual increase in parking fees over a five-year period, which started three years ago, Burch said.

Psychologist studies delinquent behavior

Every teacher dreads walking into class and deal-grain that one bad apple who refuses to mind his and d's.

Ing with that one bad apple who refuses to mind his p's and q's.

But who is that bad apple, and what separates him from the typical class clown or the rebellious teen trying to assert independence?

Psychology Professor Donald R. Lynam is trying to answer those questions and at the same time help young students most at risk for becoming adult psy-

chopaths.

Although some people might think any ax-wielding mass murderer is a psychopath, a number of traits help identify the antisocial tendencies of an adult psychopath.

"This is an offender with kind of a certain personality profile," Lyman wrote in one of his papers.

"They lack remores, they lack anxieties, they don't have any empathy, they're manipulative, they are glib, they are impulsive and irresponsible. When you put those together you get a bad apple."

Lynam's interest in antisocial behaviors began in

1989 during his first year of graduate work at the University of Wisconsin at Madison. It was there that he started to look at children with conduct disorder problems and hyperactive personalities.

The symptoms of conduct disorder problems are common among children, but a complete disorder problems and the problems that may include aggressive acts and stores that interfere with the child's relations to family teachers and other children.

Although the clinical definition of hyperactivity has changed through the year, it generally refers to restless, inattentive or impulsive betwien. With this in mind, Lymar exent research has brought together a number of past studies, which focused on a single as predictive of psychopathy in children studies of posts that considering these and other behindren who truly need intensive intervention.

Early identification is a key to treatment success, former eacher and psychology senior Jenny Aldrich sid.

You can't get a decent job. They've narrowed their opportunities to that point. So what are you going to do at that point, To said. If Lyman and other researchers an ascessfully build on this research and gain a greater understanding of psychopaths, they hope to then create new childhood diagnostic tools tooth identify and treat these children. Otherwise, adult psychopaths may continue to account for nearly 20 percent of the criminal population.

basketball poll, visits Florida. Rick Pitino faces off against former player and assistant Billy Donovan, who is in his first season as the head coach of the Gators.

Donovan played two years under Pitino at Providence, including the 1987 Final Four Friar squad. He also played a season for the New York Knicks while Pitino was the head coach.

He then joined the Wildcat staff as a graduate assistant when Pitino came to the Bluegrass, before leaving for his own head coaching job in 1994 at Marshall.

"I've always been proud of Billy," Pitino said. "I never thought Billy was going to go into coaching. To be honest, as a player, I never thought he would be a good coach. He are thought he would be a good coach. He are thought he would never get after anyhody, he was an extremely politic and humble person. Coaching was not his personality."

Because he served so long under Pitino, it shouldn't be a surprise that Donovan has brought a lot of the up-tempo, high-pressure, shoot-the-three style of basketball to Gainesville.

"Billy is not really copying it because (he) lived and played it," Pitino said. "This is (his system as well as mine because he played it. There is nobody that knows the system better than (him) because he played it and played it to grace than (him) because he played it and played it thetter than I've coached."

The Gators, who enter the game with a 10-9 record overall and a 3-4 mark in the Southeastern Conference, are leading the conference in three-point attempts per game (8.6). They are also third in the SEC in three-point shoot-

ing percentage at 37.3 percent.

Florida has been burning the nets from downtown on a record-setting pace. Currently the 196 thress that Florida has made so far this year is the third-most in school history. The school record is 196, set in the Final Four season of 1993-94 and in 1986-87.

But the three-point shot isn't necessarily the primary offense for the Gators.

"Florida's style is not so much a carbon copy of ours now, it is a carbon copy of ours six years ago," Pitino said. "Florida's looks to drive to the basket and get fouled, post up or take the three. The in-between game is not what they are looking for.

"They don't get their threes necessarily off their plays. They get their threes in transition and off dribble penetratio."

Leading the three-point parade for Donovan's squad is 6-foot-8 sophomore forward Greg Stolt.

Stolt is second in the SEC in three-point percentage at 44 percent. He is shooting a conference-high 51.6 percent against SEC opponents.

For the season, Stolt, who hails from

ference-high 31.6 percent against DEC opponents.

For the season, Stolt, who hails from fluntsville, Ala., is averaging 14.5 points a game, along with 6.6 rebounds per contest.

But in his three games against the Wildcats, Stolt is only averaging 4.7 points and recombounds. He shot a combined 14.7 percent from the field against UK last season.

In fact, no player currently on the Gators' roster has played very well against the Cats. Combined, the nine players who have faced the Cats have scored 135 points, or an average of 3.5 points a game.

Florida is only dressing seven scholarship players due to injuries, which at times have reduced the number down to six. On the Cats' bench, Cameron Milis rebound-ed from the concussion he was suffering from to score 10 points against Arkansas, giving the team a huge lift. This will mark the first meeting between Rick Pitino and Billy Donovan as coaches of Southeastern Conference teams. Donovan is in his first year in Gainesville after spending two years in Huntington, W. A., as the coach at Marshall. While at Marshall, Donovan was 0-2 against Pitino. Another UK connection between these two schools is former Unforgettable John Pelfrey, who is a Florida assistant.

Women finally get reprieve from ranked teams

Tonight's clash of the titans between UK and South Carolina could be titled the "Battle of Perennial Rebuilders," or even better, "Game of the Weak."

UK and South Carolina are both trying to win and rebuild their programs in the tough Southeastern Conference. Thus far they haven't been too successful.

Each team will be looking for its first conference win when these two women's basketball bottom feeders battle tonight in Columbia, SC., for bragging rights, with the winner moving up to 11th in the SEC.

Last year both teams were at the bottom of the conference and South Carolina got the best of UK in their two matchups.

Just when it seemed as if UK (6-12, 0-6) was turning the corner with a win over nationally

ranked Western Kentucky and a strong loss to No. 5. Alabama, the Cats played a real stinker against No. 18 Arkansas on Saturday.

"We can't have a game like we did against Arkansas," UK head coach Bernadette Mattox said. "We try to play consistently, but we constantly refuse to do that."

A Key problem for the Cats has been leadership from upperclassmen — or lack there of.

"I thought that was really the key at the beginning of the year," Mattox said. "The non-leadership has kept us from going over that hump, and I'm really disappointed that we're playing inconsistently,"

One classic example of inconsistent play is Kim Denkins. Last year's second team All-SEC center struggled earlier this season.

After a season-high 23 points against Alabama last Wednesday, it seemed that Denkins was over her problems.

Against Arkansas, Denkins went 1-of-4 for two points in 23 minutes. She also failed to get to the free-throw line.

After that game Mattox said, "No question (we have to get her more shots.) Let's just hope that it's not a step back. Let's just hope it's an awakening for her to understand that she's got to come to every game."

UK was also supposed to get leadership from junior Shaunda Roberts. The leading returning scorer from last year's team has been missing in action during much of the season.

Roberts has a back injury that has kept her out of action the past three games and she will not play tonight. The back problem also caused her problems at the beginning of the season.

"We can't mess with that back," Mattox said. "We rested it for five days last time and she got hurt again. It's in the best interest for her to get fully healed and we're going to go with that."





In Florida this week, Sen. John Grant, Ratampa, chairman of the state senates education committee, told the University of South Florida to cancel a scheduled speech by Olympic diver Greg Louganis because he felt it would contribute to the "moral decadence" of society.

"Such a presentation represents moral decadence and is an embarrassment to the university community," Grant wrote.

Grant said he will not justify further state higher education spending for USF if student funds are used to pay for Louganis' appearance.

Cancun: #1 International Destination

ancun is located 600 miles south of Miami on the ancun is located 600 miles south of Minam of the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico. A relatively new resort, it is the crowning gem of all Caribbean resorts with over 30,000 visitors per week who enjoy Cancun's trade-mark clear blue water and white sand beaches. Cancun is hot-both in temperature and in action. Cancun is known for unbelievably warm, sunny days and wonderful nights which Spring Break during Spring Break.

Cancun is actually a one-quarter mile wide, 14 mile lo Cancun is actually a one-quarter mile wide, 14 mile long L-shaped island connected to the mainland by bridges. The hotel zone is bordered by a lagoon, the Caribbean Sea and the Laguna Mujeres (The Bay of Women). Cancun is a complete resort area with a close proximity to endless shops, restaurants and markets. For the economy minded traveler, staying downtown is perfect. It's close to great nightlife or shopping, and still an easy bus (or taxi ride) to the beach.

About four years ago, Cancun addressed the transportation problem adding hundreds of little midgets that will
carry you anywhere you want to go, as well as buses which
continuously run the 26 miles from downtown to the end
of the hotel zone. These buses, often run 1-2 minutes apart
and cost only 3 pesos per person (about 5.35). As a result,
hotel location, has become virtually meaningless.

Additionally, hundreds of new businesses including scores of restaurants and clubs have been built all over the hotel zone further diminishing the location issue. So the best advice when choosing a hotel is to choose a great deal with a good beach since some of the beaches near the hotels have been washed away by local maids leaving only rocks. Most tour operators offer a variety of hotels to serve ost every taste and budget.

Downtown is the least expensive hotel district, with one noteworthy great value at a property called the Maria de Lourdes Hotel. Rated 3 stars, students find it very reasonable and clean for a budget hotel. It is just a couple blocks from the bus stop, has a nice pool, is air conditioned and has room telephones. If you're on a tight budget, don't be afraid of the Maria. Plus, it is only a 5-10 minute bus ride to the beach. Other good downtown properties include the Howard Johnson Kokai and Holiday Inn which are both slightly more deluxe and a bit more expensive. vn is the least expensive hotel district, with one





At least 35 percent of Spring Breakers traveling to Mexico are under 21 years of age and can legally consume alcoholic beverages in Mexico. Incredible nightclubs await you with fun beyond description. Senor Frogs is the most successful club in Cancun. Located on the Lagoon, it always attracts a long line of alligators to get in. Many tour operators work with these cantinas to supply a load of mind-numbing party satisfaction. Every year, some crazy person discovers the slippery pickle and the fun begins. Watch out if you slide — It's a 15 foot drop to the lagoon outside. Other things to do (besides party)

Besides the world renowned white sand beaches and the pools, Cancun has an amazing array of fun things to do during the day while letting your liver recover from those prior nights of hedonism.
Some activities are cheap (or free) while some others will break the bank. A few large tour oper-

ators, like Denver-based Student Express, have negotiated amazing discounts and freebies at many of the best events around. These optional trips include a trip to Isla Mujeres (Island of Women) which is five miles off-shore for snorkeling at El Gardon National Park, swimming with the sharks (tame nurse sharks that don't bite or the path of the property of of the the sharks (tame nurse sharks that don't bite or even nibble), riding mopeds (55/hour-check over the bike carefully before you depart) plus shopping and exploring this sleepy little village that seems a million miles from Cancun. Student Express offers a free trip to Playa del Carmen which is an hour south of Cancun by motorcoach. The trip leaves from Senor Frogs and has a \$4 registration feet. It includes a free Senor Frogs T- shirt (worth \$15 alone) and all the Dokken albums you can carry as well as a bus ride to the Frog's at Playa for some beach games; volleyball, limbo,

nude hop-scotch. (Just kidding, bring your suit.) Plus there is shopping at Playa and you can take a ferry to Cozumel, an island 30 minutes offshore. Other possible sidetrips include a trip to Xcaret

(pronounced shi-carrot) which offers a drifting trip on an underground river, Xel Ha (protrip on an underground river, Xel Ha (pro-nounced shelh-a), a fascinating cenote for snor-keling, Tulum, Mayan ruins and a spectacular beach. Free transportation abounds on the Island with Free transportation abounds on the island with three separate free bus systems running most of the night (provided by Louie's, Charlie's and the town of South Padre Island) with the town's free shuttle running all day. In addition, a local taxi is now only a buck a person. Finally, the Bahia Mar Resort, a huge resort 4 miles porth bas been recently remodeled and ren-

miles north, has been recently remodeled and ren-ovated with lodging space for over 2,000 persons. Also newly remodeled at the resort is the Bahia Beach Club, a large club at the Bahia Mar plus Parrot Eyes, Third Coast and Kelly's Irish Pub, all

within walking distance to North end hotels. These renovations have changed the balance of stu-dents on the Island in favor of the Central and North areas. Although the South is still very popular, it has few student condos in comparison to the North and Central areas.

Island, Rooms & Condos

Island, Rooms & Condos
The Island has two major types of accommodations including hotel rooms (4-5 persons, two
beds) and luxury 1-3 bedroom condominiums (410 persons with 2-8 beds in units with kitchens,
microwaves, living rooms, etc.). Student Express sells condos for obvious reasons — more room for parties. The featured Island hotel in the heart of parties. The featured Island hotel in the heart of the action is the Radisson Resort, a super deluxe property by any standard. The 'Rad', as it is known locally, is at the center of the daytime beach action with great promos on the property sponsored by Coca Cola. Although pricey, it is the place to be if you want constant action, can pay the price and don't care about kitchens. Prices for other resorts vary based upon the deluxe nature of the hotel or condo plus its location relative to the beach. Beachfront units are the most expensive and are located either right on the beach on within a few yards of the beach. Off beach units are often just as nice as the beachfront ones but involve a 1-3 block walk to the beach. Bayfront units are located

block walk to the beach. Bayfront units are located on the Bay(called the Laguna Madre) and involve a 2-5 minute walk to the beach.

Where to Eat

The Island has lots of the obvious; McDonald's, Whataburger, Pizza Hut, Subway, KFC, Taco Bell, Joe's All You Can Eat Lima Beans...etc. Try some of the restaurants with local flair such as Blackbeards, Rossis (Student Express gives 5 free breakfasts here.), Amberjack's, Scampis, Jesse's and Jake's. Groceries are the way to go to save money particularly if you are staying at a condo. There are two large grocery stores on the Island plus a dozen or more convenience stores that are within walking distance from about anywhere.

How much damage deposit?
