making good money

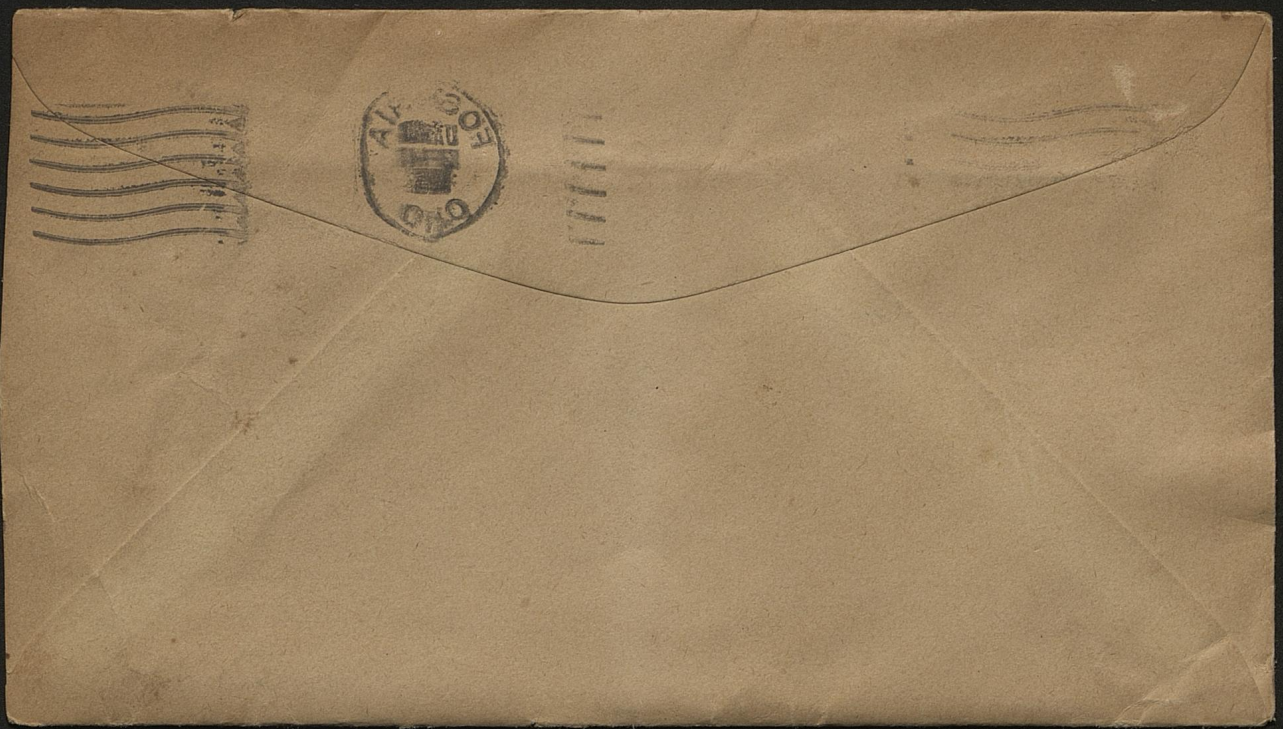

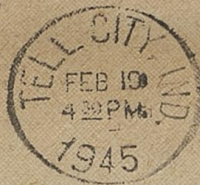
on it that he was fine and
