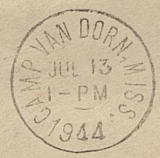

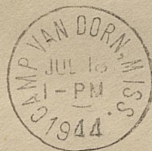

about 1 hour afier the



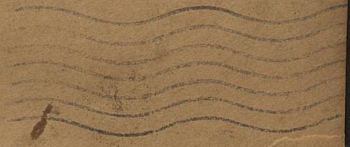
