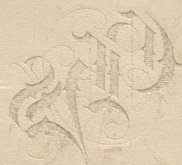

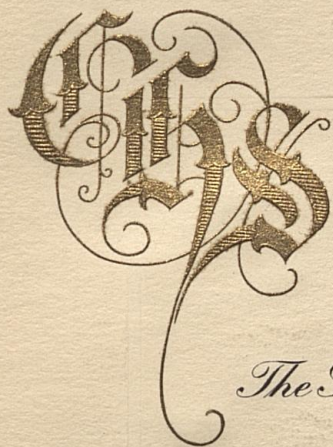

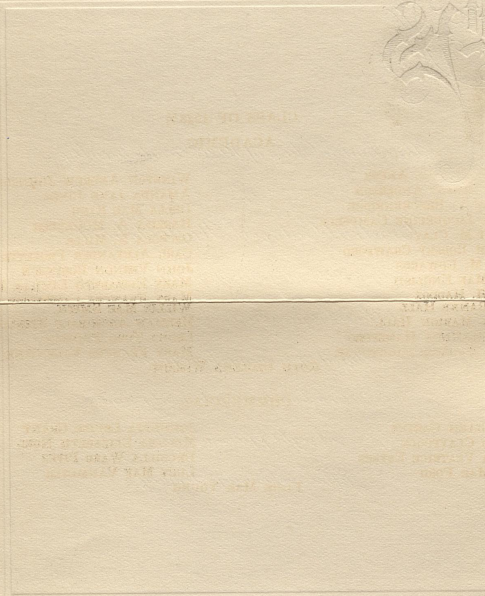

CENTRAL COLORED NIGHT SCHOOL OPENS

INCREASED ATTENDANCE EXPECTED

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES TO ALL PERSONS OVER SIXTEEN

On Monday night, September 30th., the Central Colored Night School will throw open its doors to the colored citizens of Louisville. It will offer free of cost to any person over SIXTEEN years old, a good education. From all indications the attendance will be larger than ever. For this reason it will be necessary for all persons wishing to enter to make application early. This is especially true of persons desiring to study any one of the trades to be taught.

Household Economics, Carpentry and Cabinet-making, Blacksmithing, Molding and Automobiling, Concreting and Cement work will be offered.

Grades from the First through the Tenth will be taught, so that any and all persons who desire may come and be benefited.

STENOGRAPHY AND TYPEWRITING

A Course in Stenography and Typewriting for a limited number of students will be given. This Course is new and is intended to fit our young people for a kind of service for which they have not been prepared.

Because of the limited number of machines, only EIGHTEEN will be admitted. The persons who apply first will be admitted in the order in which they come. It is barely possible that two classes may be formed. This would give each Class two nights per week; in that event two Classes of eighteen each could be formed.

The school will be located at Ninth and Magazine streets in the OLD HIGH SCHOOL BUILDING, now known as the PAUL LAWRENCE DUNBAR SCHOOL. It will be in session four nights each week from 7:30 to 9:30. The hours are not long and anybody may come.

The young men who attended the Automobile and Molding classes last year had no trouble in securing good jobs both as civilians and soldiers in either line of work.

The women and girls who attended the Night school and improved themselves by taking the Course offered in Household Economics are much more in demand than the ordinary person.
