## Richmond, Va.

WASHINGTON MONUMENT — Designed by Thos. Crawford, this work of art has been declared by critics as the finest equestrian statue in the world. The design of the base is a six-ray star, the statue of an eminent Virginian resting upon each ray, as follows: Patrick Henry, George Mason, Thomas Jefferson, John Marshall, Thomas Nelson, Jr., and Andrew Lewis.

VIRCINIA STATE CAPITOL — The central building of
the connected group dates from 1789, and is designed after
an ancient Roman Temple. The two wings were added in
1906. Here Aaron Burr was tried for treason in 1807, and
here sat Congress of the Confederate States. In the rotunda
stands Houdon's incomparable statue of Washington.

MAYO BRIDCE — Replaces the old Mayo Bridge over which the Confederate Army, defending Richmond, retreated, just before the evacuation and burning of the city in April, 1864. JEFFERSON HOTEL was first opened to public patronage in 1895. Erected by the late Maj. Lewys Ginter at a cost of nearly two million dollars, it is not surpassed in point of architectural beauty and completeness of equipment by any other hotel in the country. Ideally situated in the most desirable section of Richmond, within five minutes walk of the business center and shopping district.

VIRGINIA MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS.— This State Institution, opened in January, 1936, houses the famous John Barton Payne collection of paintings and prints and equally famous Henry P. Strause Collection of fine and decorative arts and many other works of art belonging to Virginia. The Museum and collections are valued at more than \$5,000,000.

VIRGINIA WAR MEMORIAL — This graceful tower is a memorial to the 1,784 Virginians who fell in the World War and to the 93,000 survivors who served with the armed forces of their country. Located on a commanding site in the principal park of the Virginia Capital, the war memorial was erected by the Commonwealth of Virginia. It rises to a height of 240 feet, and contains a carillon of sixty-six bells, on which concerts are frequently given.

JEFFERSON DAVIS MONUMENT — This imposing monument, the work of Valentine, is remarkable for its symbolical character as well as its artistic beauty. Standing upon a base of native granite is the portrait figure of the first and only President of the C.S.A. His right hand is outstretched in eloquent appeal to the Tuture, while his left hand rests upon the open book of History.

white HOUSE OF THE CONFEDERACY — Formerly a private residence, it was purchased in 1862 by the City of Richmond for the use of the Confederate Government, and was occupied during the war by President Davis and his family. It is now a Confederate Museum, each of the 14 Confederate States having in it a hieronial room. In frontion the manifold is the properly shaft of the "Merrimen", whose engagement with the "Monitor" revolutionized maval warfare the world over.

HOTEL JOHN MARSHALL — Located at the corner of 5th and Franklin Streets in the center of Prosperity, over-looking the entire city. Six blocks from the home of Chief Justice John Marshall, U.S.A.

MEDICAL COLLEGE OF VIRGINIA — A 103 year old institution has recently added a twenty-story building costing over \$2.50,000,000. It is the second largest hospital in the South and contains over \$300,000,00 worth of the most modern medical equipment. It is one-coff the few completely air-conditioned hospitals in the world.

ST. PAUL'S CHURCH — Completed in 1845. Has Jong been prominently associated with the social as well as the religious life of the city. It was here on the morning of April 2, 1865, that a dispatch was handed President Davis from Ceneral Lee, announcing the loss of Petersburg, and the consequent necessity for the evacuation of Richmond, which occurred that right. President Davis and Ceneral Lee occupied pews are marked with name plates.

UNIVERSITY OF RICHMOND — Founded in 1882, it was for the first eight years of its history known as "Richmond College" in 1920, its charter was amended and the present name adopted. Its grounds now embrace an area of nearly 300 acres about thee miles west of the city, and possesses many features of great natural beauty. It is organized on the English system and has a faculty of sixty members and an attendance (1926) of nearly 1,250 students. Since 1903 Frederick W. Boatwright, LLD. has been its President.


EDGAR ALLAN POE SHRINE — The oldest building in Richmond. Said to have beert Washington's headquarters here, and it is known that both he and Lafayette were entertained in the building. Now its gardens beautified, it houses many maguscripts, relics and much data associated with the life and work of Poe, who was raised in this vicinity.


JACKSON MONUMENT, presenting Gen. Thomas J. ("Stonewall") Jackson in his typical attitude, was unveiled October 11, 1919, the address being delivered by Col. R. E. Lee, a grandson of General Robert E. Lee.

THE MOSQUE— Richmond's Civic Center is located at Laurel and Main Streets facing beautiful Monroe Park. The Mosque has one of the most beautiful theatre auditoriums in America with a seating capacity of 5,000, one of the largest banque and exhibition halls in the South, a regulation swimming pool, roof garden, luxurious dining and iounge rooms, bowling alley, hostel accommodations and elementory for discriminating young men.

CET MONUMENT — Designed by Mercier, this splendid equestrian statue of Gen. Robert E. Lee is located on Monument Avenue and is a tribute to the "I'dol of the South". Unveiled May 30th, 1890, by Gen. Joseph E. Johnson, and was the occasion of the greatest reunion of Confederate veterans ever held.









