Two days later, South Campus shooter still unknown

UK police searching for leads

When a bullet came through her dorm room window early Sunday morning. Ama Campomanes had been asleep for almost an hour. She woke up to the startling sound of gunshots and quickly ran down the hall to the 12th floor lobby of Kirwan Tower.

"I saw a couple of police, but all the sudden there were 16 cop cars and 1 realized, this is earlied to the cop cars and 1 realized, this is complete the cop cars and 1 realized, this is complete that about 10 that police believe were rigited at around 3:18 am. The police originally believed that about six shots were fired, but have since found more shell casings, said Maj. Joe Monroe.

When the going gets turf

Grounds crew works daily to maintain all of UK's athletic fields

The plate on his desk reads " Til the Battle is Won," the motto of the UK athletic depart-

won," the motto of the UK athletic depart-tent.

But for Donnie Mefford, UK's sports turf anager, that battle is always being waged.

In more ways than not, Mefford is the man-hind the magic for most of the major sports ams at UK.

"I work specifically with the athletic depart-"I work specifically with the athletic depart-

behind the magic for most of the major sports teams at UK.

"I work specifically with the athletic department on all of the fields here at UK," Mefford said. "My crew is responsible for the day-to-day maintenance and game preparation of six different sports fields."

His territory includes Commonwealth Stadium, Shively Field (baseball), the soccer and softhella complexes and outdoor facilities for tennis and track and field. His maintenance crew works year-round to help with the upkeep and appearance of each of the playing fields, a task that requires work that never seems finished.

Put simply, at any given point in the year, there is some team playing on some field at UK. Mefford is responsible for those fields.
"We don't have down time." Mefford said. "Schedules are always expanding.

"Like right now, we have baseball and soft-ball, spring soccer and spring training in foot-ball," he said. "Then school is out and we start summer camps. Then, in the fall, we have foot-ball, men's and women's soccer and baseball. "It never really does stop." Mefford's office is squeezed into a niche be-tween the football practice facility and the base-ball field.
It's an office that comparets to a garage filled.

It's an office that connects to a garage filled with equipment of all sorts, an office with no windows whose walls are lined with detailed calendars and schedules of half a dozen UK teams and a top-of-the-line weather system that consists of a computer and a T'V that is more of ten than not tuned to the Westher Channel. This is Melford's computer and an oblitze his field crew team and the equipment it needs in order to cut. trim and replace fur. create and paint designs and logos on the fields and keep the grasses healthy.

At the same time, he is responsible for moniring weather patterns in order to figure out just how much a field may or may not need to be mowed and wetted down. Similarly, he is the man who calls the shots on whether or not a See Turf on page 5

Katie Couric set to leave NBC's 'Today' show

NBC executives expect Katie Couric to leave the "Today" show and accept an offer from CBS to become the first woman to anchor an evening newscast on her own, with an amouncement of nording to well-placed sources at both networks and others familiar with the negotiations.

The tentative plan is for a two-step process in which Couric first announces her departure from NBC, which would like to give her a warm send-off after a decade in which she helped make "Today" the top-rated morning program. Meredith Vieira, co-host of ABC's "The View" and host of the syndicated "Who Wants to Be a Milling. Couric and is seriously considering it, some of these sources say.

An announcement that Couric will succeed Bob Schieffer as anchor of the "CBS Evening News" will come later, in part because the final contractual details — which will include a regular spot on "60 Minutes" — have not been worked out, the sources say. They spoke on condition of anonymity because the contract talks have not been completed.







Lab-grown bladder transplants show promise

Researchers said yester-day that they have grown complete urinary bladders in a laboratory and transplanted them into patients, improving a Holy Grail of medicine: the first cultivation of working replacements for falling solid organs in people.

Experts applauded the work was a coming-of-age for the long-struggling field of tissue of the controversy over embryonic stem cells.




