The Faculty met at the call of the President.

Messrs Mollineaux, Moore J. and J. A., Ardrey, Warwick, Lortch, Stagg, Drou, Curlee, W. C. Ball, Rogers A., Parvish, Graham J. W., Fitzgerald, Lord, Barnett N. L., Cooper J. J., Trumbo and Sleet H. C. were reported as absent from work at 1 P.M. on the 16th.

After a long interview with the above named students, in which they gave as their reason for refusing to work for refusing to work that they had not been paid for their last month's work, and in which several members of the Faculty attempted to show the students the folly of their course, since no one had any fears of never getting his money, and intimated to them what must be the action of the Faculty in case they should continue disorderly,

The students <sup>they</sup> were then requested to withdraw to another room and delegate one of their number to wait on the Sec. after the Faculty should adjourned and learn its decision. After some discussion of the points in question it resolved, <sup>et</sup> That this action of the students be regarded as a combination violative of the laws:

2<sup>d</sup> That the students named above be directed to report for work at 3 P.M., thus showing that they had no intention to form an illegal combination; and that those who comply with this requisition shall not be, in any way, discounted in their standing for their conduct on this occasion:

3<sup>d</sup> That those who fail to report for work are hereby dishonorably dismissed. The Secretary was directed not to communicate this last resolution to the student as it might



be construed into a threat. Honorable discharges were granted Messrs. Lee  
 A. & B. M. Millan. On motion the Faculty adjourned.

The President called a meeting of the Faculty to take into consideration a petition from eight of the freshmen young men, who were before the Faculty at their last meeting, and who failed to report for work as then directed. Having learned from Pres. Latterson and Prof. Shackelford that they were dismissed by their own action in accordance with the 3<sup>d</sup> resolution of the Faculty at its last meeting, they presented the following petition, viz:-

"We the undersigned respectfully request the Faculty of the A. and M. College to defer the promulgation of their action in regard to our refusal to comply with the requirements made known to us today. We now promise compliance with it and will endeavor to do our duty henceforward, believing in the light of the explanations made that we acted upon a misapprehension of the facts in the case.
