The Hugh Atkinson Memorial Award is presented annually by the Association of College and Research Libraries, the Association for Library Collections and Technical Services, the Library Administration and Management Association and the Library and Information Technology Association. The award recognizes outstanding achievement by academic librarians who have contributed significantly to improvements in the area of library automation, library management, and/or library development or research. The award consists of an unrestricted \$2000 cash prize and a plaque.

The letter should outline how the candidate meets the award criteria. Letters should be accompanied by a current copy of the candidate's vita. Deadline for nominations is January 1.

ORAL HISTORY SYMPOSIUM

Baylor University and KCTF Public Television invite you to join in an oral history symposium and teleconference, entitled "History in Film and Television" on March 21-22, 1991 in Waco, Texas. The principal speakers will be Ken Burns, producer of "The Civil War" and Henry Hampton, producer of "Eyes on the Prize." In addition, Ronald Grele (Columbia University), Rosemary Gooden (University of Iowa; Texas A&M), Betty Sue Flowers (University of Texas, Austin), Nicholas Spitzer (Smithsonian Institute), Sylvia Komatsu (KERA Public Television), and George C. Wright (University of Texas, Austin) will discuss the use of interviews with Burns and Hampton and how history and documentary can be brought together.

In affiliation with the University of Kentucky, the March 22 afternoon session will be available via satellite. Britt Davis, of the Office of Instructional Resources, will serve as Executive Producer for the teleconference segment of the symposium. Terry Birdwhistell, President-Elect of the National Oral History Association, has also been integrally involved in getting this project off the ground.

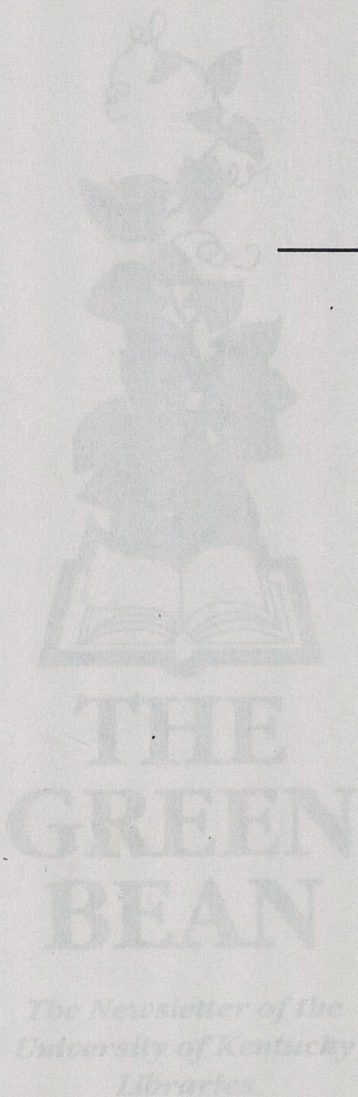
