

May 3 - 1907.

The family met in the president's room at 3:30 P. M. those present being the president, professor J. G. White, W. K. Patterson, J. W. Pryor, Mathews, Miller, Pence, Mackenzie, Norwood, M. White, Tuttle, Grubrod & Rowe.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved, - after some modification.

It was ordered that the confession and apology of the young man reinstated by family action at the last meeting be made a matter of record.

To the Students of the State College of Kentucky.

Fellow-students:-

On the 12th of last month, I was cited to appear before the Faculty of the State College to answer upon the charge of cheating or attempting to cheat in the examination held in the room of Prof. Davis in the Department of Mathematics. After a careful and impartial investigation, I was found guilty of the charge and sentenced to be dismissed from the institution. I now desire to say to the assembled student body that I was guilty of the charge and that the sentence was just. Upon the earnest appeal of myself and friends, the Faculty consented, on the 3rd of this month, to re-open the consideration of the sentence imposed. I am informed that the result of their action was that the sentence of dismissal be cancelled and that I be re-instated in the College pending good behavior, upon the 15th of April. I stated to the Faculty, through my father, that if the sentence was rescinded, I should voluntarily make this statement to the assembled student body, coupling with the confession of my guilt the statement that I sincerely regret the conduct that brought about the original action of the Faculty and I hereby pledge myself that in the future there shall be no ground of complaint against me for neglect of duty or for attempting to evade or to traverse the regulations of the College.

Prof. Mackenzie, chairman of the com. on absences reported for the committee that concerning the following students, H. E. Stevenson, W. O. Jackson, H. E. M. Garvey, it is recommended to the faculty, that, because of the continued neglect of duty on the part of these men, and since they have failed to appear before <sup>the com.</sup> although cited to do so two or three times, - their parents be requested to withdraw them from the college.

Upon motion of Prof. White, seconded by Prof. Miller, it was ordered that the report of the committee be accepted and adopted.

Prof. James White on behalf of the com. appointed to consider questions relating to second examinations after failures, reported as the recommendation of the committee (1) that a student who has a class standing of 14 or more in any subject may be excused from examination at the discretion of his professor. 2. that a student who has failed in a second examination will not be given any further examination in that subject until he has taken the subject again in class, in summer school, or under an approved tutor under such directions as the professor concerned may impose.

Upon motion of C. W. Mathews seconded by Prof. Gumbord. the first section of the report read was ordered adopted.

Upon motion of Dr. Pryor, seconded by Prof. Miller, it was ordered that the second section be adopted.

Prof. J. C. White also presented the report of the com. appointed to consider the question of entrance requirements for the various college courses, recommending.

1. - that applicants for admission from accredited schools be admitted to college classes without examination only on presentation of certificates that they have graduated from such a school.

2. that all other applicants be required to pass a satisfactory examination on each subject directly preparatory to the subjects taught in their respective courses.

After a somewhat prolonged discussion it was ordered upon motion of Dr. Pyor, seconded by Prof Mackenzie that the com. be continued with the addition of Prof W.K. Patterson and the president, and that the whole matter be re-committed for further consideration.
