 as committee to see Regent Bowman in regard to Morrison
 and Cardan. Youell's general standing was reduced
 50% for disorder in club. Deek's standing was reduced
 30% for visiting during study hours. Benson's and
 J. R. Frazer's reduced 20% each for visiting during
 study hours. J. S. Moore was granted a furlough till
 the 17th. The Faculty then adjourned.
