Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Friday, March 12, 1976.

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 2:00 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time) on Friday, March 12, 1976, in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William R. Black, Mr. Richard E. Cooper, and Mr. George W. Griffin. Professor Paul Sears, Ex-officio Secretary, was also present. Absent from the meeting were Mr. Albert G. Clay and Mr. William B. Sturgill. Representatives of the University administration present were President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Lewis W. Cochran, Robert Zumwinkle, Stanley Wall, Peter P. Bosomworth, John Smith, Jack Blanton, and Donald B. Clapp; Dr. Robert M. Drake, Special Assistant to the President; and Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel. Representatives of the various news media were also in attendance.

A. Meeting Opened

At the request of the Chairman, who was unable to attend, Mr. George W. Griffin presided and called the meeting to order at 2:04 p.m. The invocation was pronounced by Mr. Black. The Secretary reported a quorum present and the meeting was declared officially open for the conduct of business at 2:06 p.m.

B. Minutes Approved

On motion by Mr. Cooper, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, the reading of the Minutes of the January 27, 1976, meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees was dispensed with and the Minutes were approved as published.

C. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary reviewed briefly several of the more interesting items in his monthly report to the trustees and recommended that the report be received and filed. Without objection, it was so ordered.

D. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

Noting that the items in PR 2, Recommendations of the President, were routine in nature, President Singletary recommended approval of the personnel changes in section one and the acceptance of the quarterly report of gifts and/or grants in section two.

On motion by Mr. Cooper, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, PR 2 was approved as a whole and ordered made an official part of the Minutes of the meeting. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

E. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3)

President Singletary recommended that the reappointment of Mr. Leroy Miles to a two-year term on the Board of Directors of the Fund for the Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky Medical Center be approved.

On motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Professor Sears, and passed, it was so ordered (See PR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

F. 1975-76 Budget Revisions (PR 4)

Noting that Mr. Carter, Budget Director, was present and would be happy to answer any questions, President Singletary recommended that the revisions of the 1975-76 budget as presented in PR 4 be authorized and approved. On motion by Mr. Cooper, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Waiver of Governing Regulations [VII-A-7-(3)] (PR 5)

Explaining that normally the director of an interdisciplinary research institute would be a member of the faculty of an academic department, President Singletary requested that the Board of Trustees waive this requirement as set forth in the Governing Regulations [VII-A-7-(3)] in the event it should become necessary to employ a director for the Institute of Mining and Minerals Research who would not meet this criterion. He added that this waiver would not be exercised unless Dr. Funk should decide to return to the deanship of the College of Engineering.

On motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Professor Sears, and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Name for Old Agriculture Building (PR 6)

The Committee on Naming University Buildings has recommended that the Old Agriculture Building be named the Clarence Wentworth Mathews Building in honor of Professor Mathews who served as first dean of the College of Agriculture and head of the Department of Horticulture until his death in 1928. President Singletary indicated that the administration concurred in the committee's recommendation.

Professor Sears moved approval of the naming of the Old Agriculture Building the Clarence Wentworth Mathews Building. His motion was seconded by Mr. Cooper and passed without dissent. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Appointment of the Dean of College of Law (PR 7)

President Singletary recommended the appointment of Dr. Thomas P. Lewis as Dean of College of Law and Professor of Law (with tenure), effective July 1, 1976. He said that the recommendation came from the search committee and had the concurrence of the appropriate University administrative officials. A native of Kentucky, graduate of the University of Kentucky Law College, and a former professor of law at the University of Kentucky, Dr. Lewis is considered an authority on constitutional law, special legislation, and labor law.

On motion by Professor Sears, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, Dr. Thomas P. Lewis was named Dean of the College of Law and Professor of Law (with tenure), effective July 1, 1976. (See PR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)

Mr. Griffin mentioned that the Finance Committee had met prior to the Executive Committee meeting and requested Mr. Blanton to present the items being recommended by that committee.

Mr. Blanton recommended that the Interim Financial Report for the period ended January 31, 1976 be accepted and made a matter of record. It was so moved by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Cooper, and passed. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

K. External Auditor for Fiscal Year 1975-76 (FCR 2)

Mr. Blanton said that the firm of Coopers and Lybrand, Certified Public Accountants, had done a thoroughly satisfactory job as external auditors for the past fiscal year and recommended that they be engaged to examine the accounts of the University of Kentucky and its affiliated

corporations for the fiscal year 1975-76 for a fee of not more than \$50,000.

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Professor Sears moved approval of the recommendation. His motion was seconded by Mr. Cooper and passed. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Resolution Regarding Conversion of Dormitory Electrical Service (FCR 3)

Mr. Blanton explained that the trust indenture securing the University of Kentucky Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds requires Board of Trustees approval of expenditures from funds available in the System Repair and Maintenance Reserve. Since the available budget resources of the Housing and Dining System are inadequate to meet the increased cost of installing a 12 KV electric power distribution system, it is necessary to request that an additional \$72,000 be authorized from Housing and Dining Fund Balances and payment of \$135,499 be made available from the System Repair and Maintenance Reserve.

Mr. Cooper moved that the resolution in FCR 3 be adopted. His motion was seconded by Professor Sears and passed without dissent. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Employer Option for Health Care of Louisville, Inc., (FCR 4)

Mr. Blanton recommended that approval be given to the recommendation in FCR 4 which would permit payroll deductions to be made for payment of premiums for persons enrolled in Health Care of Louisville, Inc., a health maintenance service. He added that such deductions were allowed for persons enrolled in the Hunter Foundation, a similar organization in Lexington.

On motion by Professor Sears, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, FCR 4 was approved. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Collateralization of Bank Accounts (FCR 5)

Mr. Blanton, after stating that collateralization of University bank accounts would bring the University into conformity with the state system, recommended approval of FCR 5.

On motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Cooper, and passed, it was so ordered. (See FCR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Report of Investments (ICR 1)

Without discussion on motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Professor Sears, and passed, the report on investment changes for the University of Kentucky and its affiliated corporations for the quarter ending September 30, 1975 was accepted and made a matter of record. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

P. Meeting Adjourned

After determining there was no further business to come before the meeting on motion duly made, seconded, and carried, Mr. Griffin declared the meeting adjourned at 2:24 p.m.

WAIVER OF GOVERNING REGULATIONS [Part VII-A-7-(3)]

Recommendation: that approval be given for a waiver of VII-A-7-(3) of the Governing Regulations in the case of the director of the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research to permit the appointment of an individual who may not necessarily hold academic rank or be a member of an academic department.

Background: Interdisciplinary research institutes are defined in Part VII, Section A-1 of the Governing Regulations as units established for the administration of interdisciplinary programs that are primarily research in nature. The chief administrative officer of an institute is the director. Part VII, Section A-7 of the Governing Regulations states that "the staff of an interdisciplinary research institute shall consist of: (1) regular faculty members on a split appointment basis; (2) non-faculty employees appointed for the duration of a specific project; and (3) a director who shall also be a member of an academic department."

The Institute for Mining and Minerals Research fulfills the definition of an interdisciplinary research institute, and was in fact so created by the Board of Trustees on 21 September 1971. Normally the director would be a member of the faculty of an academic department. However, in consideration of kind and scope of the research program of the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research, and mindful of the necessity to limit the University's commitment for additional, tenured faculty, prudence suggests that the director not necessarily hold academic rank or be a member of an academic department.

APPOINTMENT OF THE DEAN OF THE COLLEGE OF LAW

Recommendation: that Dr. Thomas P. Lewis be named Dean of the College of Law and Professor of Law (with tenure), effective not later than July 1, 1976.

Background: At the time Dean Hardy resigned, a committee was appointed to nominate candidates and advise the President on a replacement for him. The committee, composed of faculty members, a student in the College of Law, and a member of the local Bar Association, made a thorough search and its choice was Dr. Thomas P. Lewis, Professor of Law at Boston University and formerly a Professor of Law at the University of Minnesota and the University of Kentucky. The President and the central administration concur wholeheartedly in their nomination and recommend to the Board of Trustees that Dr. Thomas P. Lewis be named as dean of the College of Law.

Dr. Lewis, a native of Ashland, Kentucky, received his bachelor of laws degree from the University of Kentucky in 1954. After three years active duty as a naval officer, he returned to the University of Kentucky as an assistant professor of law, was promoted to associate professor in 1960, and became a full professor in 1962. In addition to his teaching and research duties, he found time to complete studies at the University for a bachelor of arts degree and, during the 1959-60 academic year, was a Ford Fellow at Harvard Law School. He earned his doctoral degree at Harvard Law in 1964.

Author of more than a dozen articles in such publications as the Columbia, Stanford, California and Minnesota Law Reviews and the Kentucky Law Journal, he is considered an authority on constitutional law, social legislation, and labor law. Former editor-in-chief of the Kentucky Law Journal, Lewis is a member of the American Association of University Professors and the honor societies Phi Beta Kappa, Omicron Delta Kappa and the Order of the Coif.

EXTERNAL AUDITOR FOR FISCAL YEAR 1975-76

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees engage the firm of Coopers & Lybrand, Certified Public Accountants, to perform an examination of the accounts of the University of Kentucky, the University of Kentucky Research Foundation, The Fund for the Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky Medical Center, the University of Kentucky Athletics Association, Health Care Collection Service, Inc., and the University of Kentucky Credit Union, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1976, and render reports for a fee, including expenses, of not more than \$50,000.

Background: The firm of Coopers & Lybrand examined the accounts of the University of Kentucky and its affiliated corporations for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1975. The audit was both thorough and timely. The experience of the members of the firm in the examination of accounts of colleges and universities enables them to render an audit report which verifies the fiscal status of the University and evaluates the integrity of fiscal controls. The firm also possesses the ability to evaluate policies, procedures and practices utilized in fiscal management. This ability is especially valuable to administrative officers responsible for the conduct of financial administration.

RESOLUTION REGARDING CONVERSION OF DORMITORY ELECTRICAL SERVICE

Whereas, it has become necessary to provide in the University's residence halls and other buildings in the Housing and Dining System, the capability of distributing 12 KV electrical power in accordance with an agreement previously executed with Kentucky Utilities Company and,

Whereas, the cost of installing the aforesaid distribution system has exceeded the original estimate and an additional sum of \$207,499 is required,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- i. In accordance with Section 907 of the Trust Indenture made by the Board of Trustees to Farmers Bank & Capital Trust Company, Frankfort, Kentucky, securing the University of Kentucky Housing and Dining System Revenue Bonds, the Board finds that the unanticipated conversion costs for the aforesaid systems has resulted in a situation where the available budgeted resources of the Housing and Dining System are inadequate to meet the costs to be incurred.
- 2. The Vice President Business Affairs and Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to deliver to the aforesaid Trustee, an authenticated copy of this resolution, together with a request for the payment of the costs of converting the 4 KV distribution systems in the residence halls and other buildings in the Housing and Dining System to a 12 KV distribution system from funds available in the System Repair and Maintenance Reserve insofar as said payment of \$135,499 may be made without reducing the said reserve below the permanent minimum balance of \$750,000 required by the said Trust Indenture, and that additional funds of \$72,000 be authorized from Housing and Dining Fund Balances allocated for working capital.

EMPLOYER OPTION FOR HEALTH CARE OF LOUISVILLE, INC.

Recommendation: that the University Of Kentucky allow employees residing in Jefferson and nearby counties served by Health Care of Louisville, Inc., to enroll in any of the various full cost health plans offered by this Health Maintenance Organization, and that payment of premiums may be via payroll deduction, to be effective at the time the necessary administrative procedures can be established.

Background: This recommendation has been made by the University's Employee Benefits Committee. Under federal law (PL 93-222) all employers subject to federal minimum wage requirements and employing twenty-five workers or more are required to include in any health benefits offered to employees the option of membership in a qualified health maintenance organization for employees residing in areas served by such organizations. Implementation of this recommendation by the Employee Benefits Committee will put the University in compliance with the law as it is applicable to employees at the Jefferson Community College.

Health Care of Louisville, Inc. is a Health Maintenance Organization that has developed relatively recently to serve the Louisville area. It is a non-profit, local, federally assisted organization, providing comprehensive health services through its Health Center facility for primary care located at 1809 Standard Avenue, Louisville, supplemented by contractual arrangements with local hospitals and physicians for care beyond the primary level. The characteristics of its approach to health care in terms of program and pattern of operation are similar to the Hunter Foundation in Lexington (which the Board has approved prior), although in benefit provisions, alternative plans made available to subscribers, premium rates and in other respects it is not identical to the Hunter Foundation. Health Care of Louisville is in compliance with State legislation for regulation of HMOs as attested by a Certificate of Authority issued to the organization by the State Insurance Commissioner.

COLLATERALIZATION OF BANK ACCOUNTS

Recommendation: That each University of Kentucky demand deposit bank account be collateralized by securities having a market value equal to 110 percent of the average daily ledger balance for the account in the immediately preceding fiscal year, minus the sum by which the account is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Securities pledged as collateral shall be the same as those enumerated for accounts of the State Treasury in Section 41.240(2) of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

The University and each bank in which it has a demand deposit account shall execute a pledge agreement annually and securities pledged as collateral shall be held for safekeeping by a designated custodian approved by the Treasurer of the University.

This resolution supercedes Finance Committee Resolution 7d enacted by the Board of Trustees on December 8, 1970.

Background: This resolution clarifies and updates Finance Committee Resolution 7d noted above. While maintaining the security of University demand deposit bank accounts through pledging, the proposed resolution broadens the type of securities the University will accept as collateral. The revised listing of acceptible securities conforms with the listing prescribed by law for accounts maintained by the State Treasury.

Rather than specifying exact amounts of collateral which are excluded from pledging because of FDIC insurance, the exclusion is made general. The proposed resolution makes the exclusions continuously subject to the amounts of FDIC insurance in effect for each demand deposit account.

Finally, the resolution makes specific the sum in each account which shall be collateralized. It is an amount equal to 110 percent of the average daily ledger balance in the immediately preceding fiscal year.
