

#### New technology to advance UK's disease research

A new machine will help UK medical researchers' advance disease treatment.

A grant for \$415,000 went to purchasing technology to measure the mass of protein samples, helping researchers learn the protein's role in diseases.

"It will facilitate the cutting-edge research programs that will ultimately lead to novel disease diagnosis and treatment," said Dr. Haining Zhu, an assistant professor in the College of Medicine, in a news release. "This equipment will bring the research capabilities of the Proteomics Core Facility in the UK College of Medicine up to the state-of-the-art."

The grant, which Zhu received from the National Institute of Health (NIH), has been used to buy a matrix-assisted laser desorption/ionization-time of flight spectrometer.





It seems to have taken many Republicans 20 years to realize that Ronald Reagan isn't running for president anymore. And for 2008, there are no true viable conservative candidates for the Office.

Instead, the leading candidate for the GOP nomination at the moment is former New York City Mayor Rody. News. Resumssen and CNN Gallupy. Giuliani leads Sen. John McCain. Ariz., by 12, 14 and 16 points, respectively.
