Every body loan good love of me when I was sick and there was nothing that I wanted for and the Major says I am not to do a thing but rest until I am good and strong again and by that time I feel sure we will be ready to come home.

none on now.

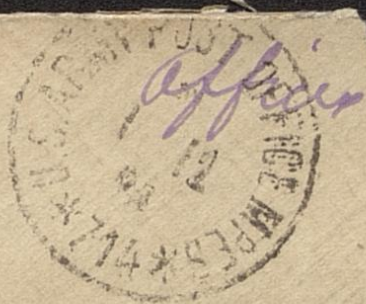
I hope Lis is well

Dear Hauine.

Have just received five letters
one from you one from Jim Hauine and
one from Mr Gairdes and two from
Motha. I was glad to have mail for
I leave for Nice tomorrow and will
be gone some time and will have no mail
until I return.

I am feeling fairly good
but I get tired very easily but I think
a good rest at Nice will fix me up
fine.

Your letter contained some plans
for our future which I am glad to
get anight full that we will do very
well here.

I will be in Paris on
my return from Nice and will try and
get you something nice for a dress or
something if I am not financially
embarrassed at that time, things are very
high over here but I would like for
you to have a Parisian gown or gab
of some sort.

I have never heard of the
arrival of Rebatas dress and your
Stocainy. I was in Sept. did they
ever come?

I had a telegram from Jim while I was down saying he was going to Nice and I may see him there if his rat goes back to his organization.

His name, is mobilized near Brest and waiting orders to sail, down I wish we were waiting such instructions or had reason to expect them soon; we get hope quite often that we will be up soon but one can't be sure of any thing in the army until it happens.

I am anxious to be home but don't care to open up an office before Spring, God bless it may as well wait until then for "My Uncle Sam".

I will write from Nice, I expect to spend one day at Lyon and one day at Marseilles on my way down. Will answer Mother's letter later.

I have been here four days and my leave is up day after tomorrow but I will stay for Lodges in the A.E.F. I want one day in Paris.

I think my trip has helped me I don't get tired so easily, but I am as ~~thin~~ thin as a snare yet.

I hope to get home soon and I will rest and get all night I am sure, but that I am not all night now I can't know but I have just lost my pup

I have begun to want to come home pretty badly since I have not been well but I want to get well before I come.

Jim was not here and has not registered with the A.P.M. here at all, I am of the opinion they must be on their way home now.

I have not gone around very much this trip for I had seen most every thing here before so I have just layed around the hotel and sat in the sun on the beach and tried to rest as much as I could.

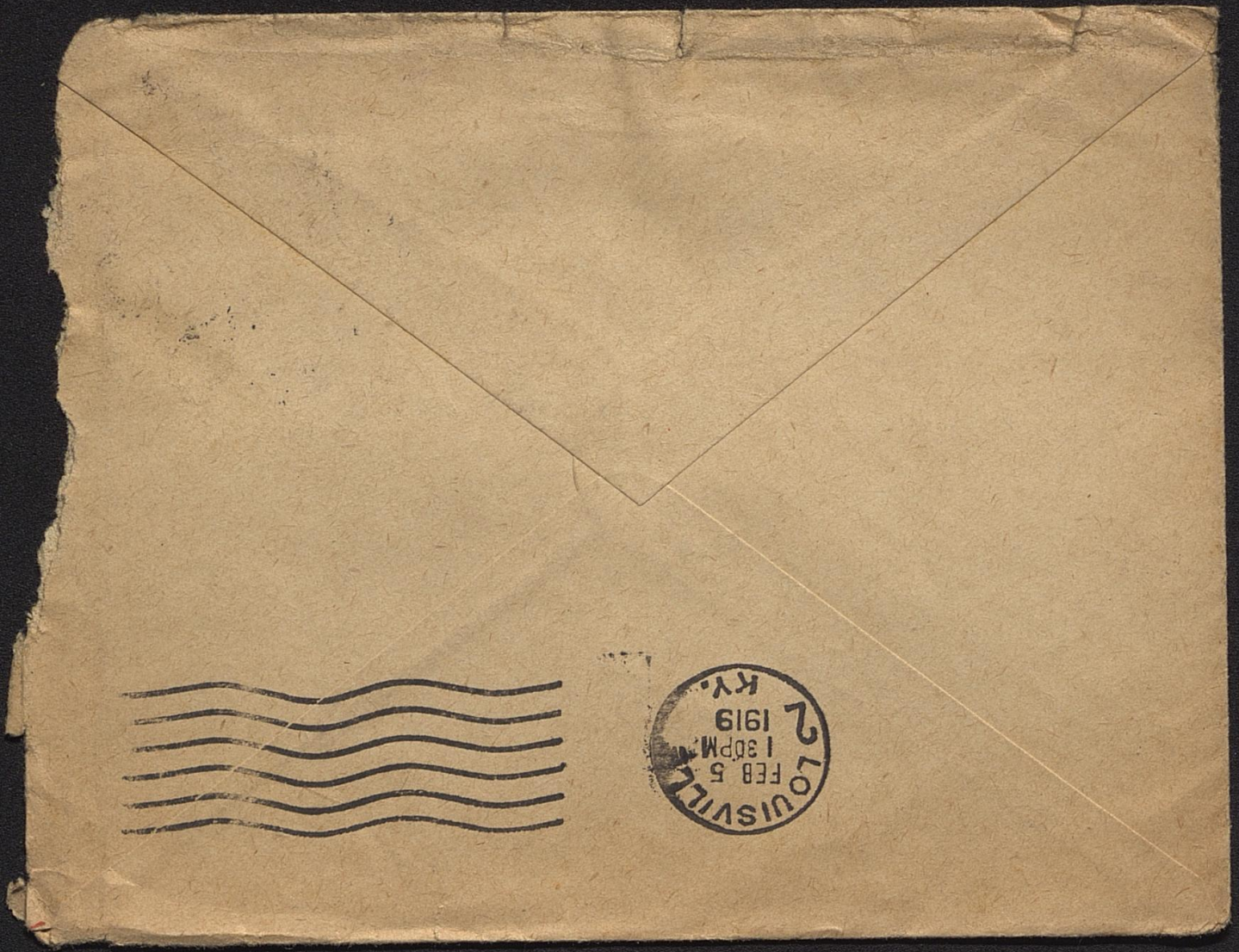
You mentioned in the last letter I had about Roberta getting
so strong and sturdy and I am of course very glad and
feel all the more glad that she is so strong and healthy. Nice is in
the light of the sun and in addition of Americans there
are waves of Indian here and on the promenade on the
beach one can hardly walk it so packed but I get worn out
with the crowd and pain. Am I getting old? I used to enjoy being
where there was some thing doing all the time;

I had forgotten to tell
you that I have almost quit smoking. When I had pneumonia
I had no taste for tobacco and after a while I had a
little fluttering of my heart for a short time so I got out
of the habit and have not smoked so very much since
I may be I will be entirely quit when I get home.
I must close now and get out in the sun. Love to all

Dear Halline:

I found lots of letters for me on my return from Nice and had a good time reading them.

And came back through Paris and spent a day I bought Kobuta doll in Paris and I will send it by mail if I see no chance to come home soon and I don't see any thing like orders yet.

You itemized the things you had received and you said you received the money order, is it you get two money orders? The first one for \$75 and one in December for \$50?

I am glad you received the stacking and Kobuta dress and if you have not received the M.O. for \$50 write me at once also if your increase in allotment has not shown up with me about that, it should have been paid first on July 1st.

I must keep tab on all these things for if they go astray they must be corrected at once or we may lose some money. I can send you some money each month so you can

Have it up for us. I am only allowed
to allot \$125 of my pay as a Capt or I
wonder send it that way but Money orders
are generally safe and I can send you
all about my allotment that way.

Jim at Nice. Had a letter waiting for
me on my return saying he did not
stay very long, neither did I, I only stayed
5 days, too much crowd.

Has Rabuta started
to school? You have not mentioned the
subject lately.

I am afraid his house in
the Highlands is too much home unless we
can get only a part of it. I want a
down town office if we think it a good
scheme when I locate, I will have to go
away at first I know but once I get
going things will be ok.

I have a letter
from Gordon Kyle which I will enclose
but you can destroy it when you read it as
it refers to some Masonic matter.

I had a
letter from Stuart Sutton he is in Germany
with the 357 Infantry, I also heard from Vernon
Proctor again and I hear Milburn Stammers
is with 184 Infantry and they are within 5
kilometers of me I am going to look him
up.

Your letter of today I cleared as

I am glad you all used your things &
sent, the handkerchiefs have not been
furnished and Robert's dress I am afraid
is not going to be made.

I to my has
to get the French to do things. They will
promise any thing in the world and
then do what the spirit moves them
to do.

I waited for the dress as long as
I could and then they said it had been
furnished but lost and to date never been
found. The chances are some one saw it
and offered more money than I agreed
to pay. The handkerchiefs are being made
by the June and they are as slow
as "Molasses in July" in case they are
not ready I will get some thing else
when I am ready to leave.

We are trying
to clean out the Hosp. so we can get
ordered out. But I really believe we will
get something by Feb 15th, work is
slacking up quite a bit and I feel a
more coming on.

I will Cable if I can when I am
starting if not I will immediately after
landing as an American Port.

I n. a letter
from Jim today he says he is waiting on
transportation to the States and he will
probably be home before I get started.
Sunday I am going to Metz and then to
Verden and the Argonne Battle field and then
to Sedan and perhaps to Rheims and Chateau
 Thierry I will try and find some suitable souvenirs
for every one.
Keep him and give me an
account of Robertas first day in school.
