Apr 714

I have not written  
for a number of days for I have  
been a little busy trying to  
get some of my patients out  
we are trying to clean  
out the hospital so we  
may have a chance to get

home and prospects are good we  
only have 200 patients today  
and most of them are considering  
so we may get pretty well  
cleaned up in a few days.  
I hear the Larsson unit  
of which Harry Pells is a  
member has sailed for home.



I lauded her several times  
in advance of them and  
I hope my turn comes to  
return soon.

I got Robertas dress today  
and its a beauty Cost me 120  
francs about \$22 but is built  
of a stuff that can be used

after she out grows this dress

I will not mail this as

I dont want to take a

chance on its being lost and

besides I want to give it to her

myself, the dress was made

in Paris, I ordered it

through a shop here and



They had it done in Paris  
so she will be bedecked in a  
Paris gown and you as well  
will be partly clothed in  
Parisian garments.

We have had a large snow  
which is melting these days  
and its getting quite warm again

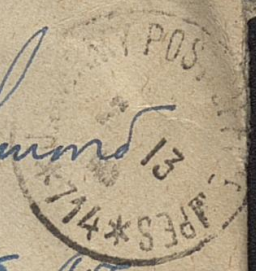

Dear Hattie:

We are having a  
nice rainy day consequently I  
am indoors and having had a  
good dinner I will write you  
a little letter this afternoon

Yesterday had a trip to  
Bourbonne Les Bains a  
watering place near here and  
enjoyed the trip very much  
I may get to Belfast next  
week for one day. I am  
doing very little now I  
have discharged all my



patients except one officer  
who is Convalescing from  
pneumonia and he will  
be discharged next week  
so my ward rounds dont  
consume much time these  
days, I just stick my  
head in the officer's ward

and say good morning and  
my day's work is finished  
we have only 80 patients in  
the hospital and most of  
them are Convalescing Cases  
and we are daily expecting  
orders to quit business  
and get ready for home



and when a Celebration there  
will be when we receive  
such orders. I will put  
on my second Service stripe  
in a few days but I see  
the stay at home are trying  
to put a bill through Congress  
preventing any stripes or

Cherries from being worn  
so I may come home without  
my Service Cherries on. I am  
very anxious to see if such  
a measure will be passed.  
Those who saw Service in the  
States are seeing to it that  
the A. E. F. has nothing to  
distinguish them from



The Man who ~~at~~ has a nice  
Service Chain in Washington  
and elsewhere.

We Cant have our Sam Brown  
Belt ~~on~~ our our ~~our~~ cap  
and now they are after our  
Service Chevrons.

Its really funny to see

The various moves made  
to lobby the A.E.F. out of  
even the little empty honors  
they have coming to them  
95% of the men who served  
in the States ~~ones~~ have come  
to France if they had tried  
and since they did not come



They are after the scalp of the  
Man who did.

I am anxious to hear from

You again regarding Henrietta

I hope she is better &

May Jan will be this.

Camp. Hoop. No 24

Apo. 714

July 21-1919.

Have had letters the  
last few days from you from  
Paris; I hope Henrietta is well.  
I am sending you by mail  
the dress I was to send Roberto  
for Christmas, to me it seems

to have too much lace worn on it  
but it's good stuff and if the  
dress is not suitable the material  
can at least be utilized.

You will find a waist for  
yourself it came from a  
very good shop in Paris



There are some Handkerchiefs  
one for your Mother - one for  
Sis McM - one for Brunette  
one for Aunt Vic one for Aunt  
Kate - one for Mrs Kelley and  
one for Mrs Baldez and one  
for Mrs Thomas, I hope I  
have not miscounted and  
that you will find the  
correct number in the  
box; I had them made  
here in Longue by the French  
who are supposed to do very  
good work in that line.  
I had planned to buy them



with me but I was afraid  
Roberta would outgrow the  
dress before it got home  
and decided to take a chance  
and send them.

We expect to come  
soon but can get no official  
hope on it, it may be soon

or it may be two or three  
months from all we can find  
out. We only have about  
80 patients now and very  
few coming in and we feel  
it can be very long but  
we never know in the army  
In a letter from Jim



Yesterday they were all set  
to go home and are probably  
on their way now. He has  
been awarded the distinguished  
Service Cross.

I hope also that  
we may be able to buy a  
Ford when I begin to practice  
again in fact its almost a  
necessity and I will have to  
figure on it some way.

I hope I may have some real  
news soon about coming home  
Love to all.

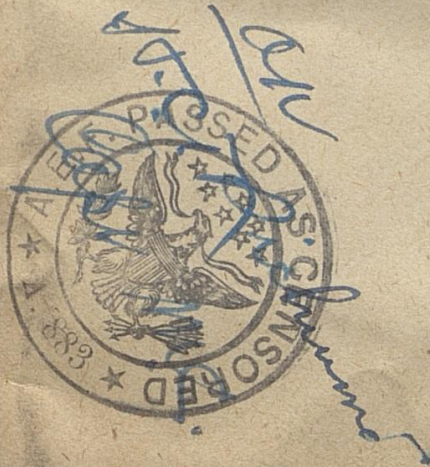
