We will probably leave for the coast by the

Fields from Kentucky (Whelan) and had lunch
on the dinner with him and it was certainly
good to see some one just from home.

I had a

held up here or at the port, but will look
forward to seeing you all soon and you can
imagine my feeling of joy at the prospect of
getting you.

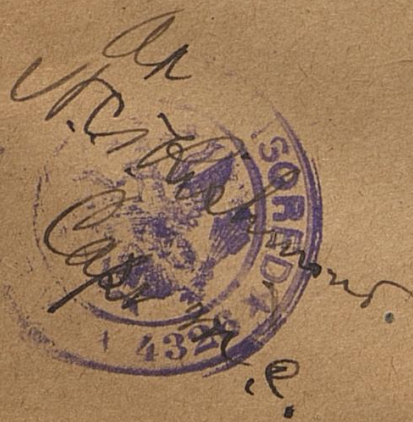
