Budget cuts force UK to look at child care options

For Pat Blevins, a single mother who works during the day and attends UK classes at night, the Evening Child Care Program is essential.
"I have no family in Lexington. I have nowhere else to take my child,"

However, due to University budget cuts and a general lack of funds, Blevins and other students like her may be faced with her elimination of the Evening Child Care Program next year meet for campus child care facilities and are searching for solutions.





Shuttle has perfect countdown in preparation for launch

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla.
Five astronauts tracked a perfect
countidown yesterday as technicians prepared the shuttle Atlantis
for a midafternoon launch on
today. The mission will propel
NASA's "Magellan" probe to
Venus and revive America's deepspace science program.



'After an II-year gap in the planetary program, we're anxious to get started," said John H. Ger-pheide, Magellan project manager Officials described the count-down as the smoothest of four since the Challenger disaster. The chance of high winds provided slight concern as NASA looked for-ward to liftoff in an unusually tight launch window that opens at 2:24 p.m. EDT and lasts justs 23 min-utes.

Atlantis' cargo is the Magellan spacecraft which has a radar system powerful enough to pierce the dense sulfuric acid clouds of Venus and map its surface. The mission costs \$550 million, not including the \$225 million cost of the four-day shuttle flight.

Budget cuts force University to review child care options



the faculty are looking at," Mesza-ros said.

Since the Early Childhood Lab is not suitable for most parents, stu-dents will be turning to other places, like the evening care pro-gram for child care. But if the Eve-ning Child Care program is discon-tinued next fall, these parents will be faced with the inconvence of the program "is so convenient with classes I don't have to worry about being late to class by taking (my daughter) to the babysitter," said Donna Conway. "Even if you have a friend who can take care of your child, there is no guarantee that she can keep your child every Tuesday night."

Of 372 prospective users of the facility, 60.2 percent say that they would use a child care center regularly. Although the opening of a day care center may not help relieve the worries parents may have concerning the possible closing of the evening care program, other ideas are being considered for the child care problem.


