

The wooden house, which was owned by Robert Bolling, a 17th-century merchant-trader, was probably built around 1700 and lasted until about the late 1730s or early 1740s, said Don Linebaugh, an assistant professor in anthropology and an alided faculty member in the De-

partment of Historic Preservation. Bolling's wife, Jane Rolfe,
was the granddaughter of Pocahontas.

Seven killed in grenade attack

Seven killed in grenade attack

ISLAMABAD. Pakistan — A grenade attack
on a Protestant church packed with Sunday
worshippers killed five people — including an
American woman and her daughter — in an assault clearly aimed at Pakistan's foreign community. No group claimed responsibility for the
attack, in which at least one young man in
black ran through the Protestant International
Church hurling grenades. Some witnesses reported two people. Islamic extremists
were suspected as more proposed to the conmost of whom were foreigners, police and hospitals said. One body remained unidentified late
Sunday, and officials said it may be the assailant. President Bush condemned the attack
on the church and called it an act of terrorism.
He pledged to find those responsible and bring
hem to justice. The attack occurred at 10:50
a.m. during a sermon before 60 to 70 worshippers. Dozens of police and soldlers rushed to the
scene.





Stricter seatbelt law an unnecessary evil

Bill might encourage some to buckle themselves, kids up; may lead the way for citations based on mere suspicion

The Kentucky House of Representatives votes today on Bill 68, which would make

The Kentucky House of Representatives votes today on Bill 68, which would make not wearing a seatbelt a primary offense.

Although wearing a seatbelt is mandatory in Kentucky, the bill would now make it legal for police officers to pull a car over strictly because of a suspicion that people in the car are not wearing seat belts. Right now, failure to wear a seatbelt is a secondary offense, and drivers can not be stopped for just that reason. The new law would allow officers to cite drivers and passengers solely for failing to wear their seatbelts.

A positive aspect to the law is that police officers will be able to pull over drivers whose children roam free in the car. The law might also encourage drivers to buckle up their children Safety is the big issue concerning the bill specially because of the 18

their children. Safety is the big issue concerning the bill, especially because of the 118 people who died last year in car accidents.

A problem with this bill is how exactly an officer can discern that people in cars are not wearing seathelts. Think about it — it can not be easy to judge if a passenger is wearing his or her seathelt, especially if the car is moving.

For that reason, the bill would allow officers to pull a car over strictly because they suspect non-seatbelt use. Imagine the pandemonium that could occur if police are allowed to pull people over just because they suspect a car is speeding.

This also lends to the possibility of increased profiling by police. Although many officers probably would not abuse their authority to pull drivers over because of their age or race, some might. And by the new law, it would be OK.

In another respect, the new law could distract officers from other duties because they will have the added responsibility of lowing for seathelt violators.

Mandatory seatbelt use is already Kentucky law. The bill could encourage Kentucky citizens who don't buckle up to start doing so, but the instatement of the bill might just have some negative repercussions.




