

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, December 13, 1977.

The University of Kentucky Board of Trustees met in regular statutory session on Tuesday, December 13, 1977, at 3:00 o'clock (Eastern Standard Time), in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Professor Michael Adelstein, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. L. D. Gorman, Mrs. Betty Carol Clark, Mr. Richard E. Cooper, Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler, Mr. George W. Griffin, Mr. James Newberry, Mrs. Sally Hermansdorfer, Mr. Thomas B. Kessinger, Mr. Zirl A. Palmer, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. Homer W. Ramsey, Professor Paul G. Sears, Dr. David A. Hull, and Dr. John R. Woodyard. Absent from the meeting were Mr. Albert G. Clay and Mr. John R. Gaines. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Lewis W. Cochran, Robert Zumwinkle, Peter P. Bosomworth, Raymond R. Hornback, Jack C. Blanton, and Donald B. Clapp; Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research; Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel; and Dr. Charles Wethington, Assistant Vice President of Community College System representing Vice President Wall.

A. Meeting Opened

Mr. Sturgill called the meeting to order at 3:00 o'clock. A moment of silence was observed in memory of Coach Rupp, whose funeral had been held just prior to the meeting of the Board. The invocation was pronounced by Mrs. Clark, and the Secretary called the roll, reporting 17 members present. The meeting was then declared officially open for the conduct of business at 3:05 o'clock.

B. Minutes Approved

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the reading of the Minutes of the October 19, 1977 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees was dispensed with and the Minutes were approved as published.

C. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

After reviewing some of the items in his monthly report to the Trustees, President Singletary recommended that the report be accepted and filed. Without objection it was so ordered.

D. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

Recommendations in PR 2 being routine in nature, President Singletary recommended that it be approved as a whole.

On motion by Mr. Frank Ramsey, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed without dissent, PR 2, Recommendations of the President, was approved as a whole and ordered made an official part of the Minutes of the meeting. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

E. Degree Candidates - University System (PR 4)

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Homer Ramsey, seconded by Mr. James Newberry and passed, the President was authorized to confer upon each individual whose name appeared on the list attached to PR 4, the degree to which he is entitled, upon certification by the Dean of Admissions and Registrar and approval by the University Senate that the individual has satisfactorily completed all of the requirements for the degree for which he has made application. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

F. Budget Revisions for 1977-78 (PR 5)

On President Singletary's recommendation and without discussion, on motion by Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Cooper, and passed, the Budget Revisions for 1977-78 as recommended in PR 5 were authorized and approved. (See PR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Doctoral Program in Communications (PR 6)

President Singletary indicated that the proposed doctoral program in Communications had been under consideration for approximately two years. It has gone through all the various councils of the University, been approved by each, and now requires Board approval so that it may be transmitted to the Council on Higher Education for approval by that body. Professor Sears moved that authorization be given for transmission to the Council on Higher Education a Doctoral Degree Program in Communications. His motion was seconded by Mr. Gorman and passed without dissent. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Associate Degree in Nursing at Southeast Community College (PR 7)

At the request of President Singletary, Dr. Wethington explained that the Appalachian Regional Hospital in October 1977 decided to phase out its nursing

diploma program at Harlan. The possibility of converting the diploma nursing program offered by the hospital to an associate degree program offered by the Southeast Community College has been under consideration for some time. However, the action in phasing out the present program was taken sooner than expected, thus requiring immediate action to get Council approval of an associate degree program in nursing at Southeast Community College.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, authorization was given for transmission to the Council on Higher Education an Associate Degree Program in Nursing at Southeast Community College to be started in the fall of 1978. (See PR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 8)

President Singletary explained that the proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations were presented at this time in order to give the members of the Board the opportunity to study them. He recommended that the proposed amendments be received for consideration and, provided at least one month has elapsed, be put on the agenda for action by the Board of Trustees at its next regular meeting. Professor Sears so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Homer Ramsey and passed without objection. (See PR 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Report on the Results of Alumni Member Election (PR 9)

President Singletary gave the results of the alumni election as reported to him by Professor Sears, Secretary of the Board of Trustees, and recommended that the report be received and put to record and that the Secretary of the Board be authorized to certify to the Governor the names of the three persons receiving the largest number of votes from which list a successor to Mr. Ramsey will be appointed. Governor Chandler so moved. His motion was seconded by Professor Sears and passed. (See PR 9 at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Comments on NeoNatal Care

In fairness to the employees in the University Hospital and to the faculty members in the NeoNatal Care Unit who have been unjustly maligned in recent publicity, President Singletary said he felt he must make some comment to straighten out the record. The accusation that the faculty or administration of the University could be using this problem for institutional gain should not go unchallenged.

The University of Kentucky recognizes the problem and is desirous of being a part of its solution, but it is not the cause of it. In fact, the University

has long taken the leadership in pointing out the inadequacies of the facilities for high risk mothers and new borns in our area. It has encouraged the development of a plan for a network of secondary facilities which would leave the University with the responsibility to provide the highest level of tertiary care at the University Hospital. When these facilities did not materialize the University attempted to respond by increasing its beds from 17 to 31 even though this seriously compromised other programs.

Dr. Singletary continued that one must realize that the University Hospital is a teaching hospital and responsible for providing tertiary care in many areas. Thus, when one program is expanded, another suffers. Space, however, is not the only problem; there is also a staff problem. The care of 31 tiny, very sick babies places a tremendous stress on the staff, and if more babies than our capacity allows are admitted, the care of those already admitted is seriously compromised.

In closing his remarks, President Singletary noted that the problem is a statewide problem and the solution lies in the providing of sufficient funding so that selected community hospitals can develop secondary level nurseries linked to the University of Kentucky Medical Center. He repeated that the University is eager to be a part of the solution to this problem but that it cannot solve it alone.

L. Report on Institute for Mining and Minerals Research

President Singletary introduced Dean Funk, Director of the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research, and Dr. David Drake, Director of the Kentucky Center for Energy Research, and noted that the Insititute and the Center have developed a very good working relationship.

Dr. Funk distributed some materials relative to the program being carried on by the IMMR and illustrated some of the points which he made with slides.

Mr. Sturgill thanked Dean Funk and expressed his gratification that the program has come such a long way in the last ten years.

M. Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)

Mr. Griffin, reporting for Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, recommended that the Financial Report for the period ending October 31, 1977 be accepted. He put his recommendation in the form of a motion which was seconded by Mr. Cooper and passed. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Authorization to Execute Lease and Related Documents With Lario Oil and Gas Company. (FCR 2)

Mr. Griffin said that the Finance Committee at its meeting on the morning of December 13 had discussed the lease and other related documents and believed that all were in order. Governor Chandler moved that the Vice President for Business Affairs be authorized to execute a lease, easement, and release of damages constituting a series of agreements with Lario Oil and Gas Company relating to the property in Garvin County Oklahoma coming to the University from the estate of Violette Renekar, deceased. His motion was seconded by Mr. Frank Ramsey and passed without dissent. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Conveyance of Substation Site to Kentucky Utilities Company (FCR 3)

Mr. Griffin asked that Mr. Blanton speak to FCR 3. Mr. Blanton said that the 1.4348 acres which would be conveyed to the Kentucky Utilities for the sum of \$12,900 was part of a tract of land adjacent to the V. A. Hospital which had been acquired from the federal government with the understanding that the property would be held by the University for 20 years. This period now has expired and the property, which has been used as part of a poultry demonstration and teaching program, is run down. Dean Barnhart recommends that it be sold and the proceeds used for another demonstration program. The conveyance to Kentucky Utilities is the first step in disposing of this property.

After satisfactory replies to several questions from members of the Board, on motion by Mr. Homer Ramsey, seconded by Mrs. Clark and passed, the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer was authorized to execute a deed conveying the parcel of land containing 1.4348 acres on the Viley Road in Fayette County Kentucky to Kentucky Utilities Company in consideration of the sum of \$12,900 as a site for a Utilities Substation. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

P. Authorization to Sell Surplus Real Property (FCR 4)

Mr. Blanton, at Mr. Griffin's request, explained that the University had purchased some property several years ago that is outside the present long range land use plan for campus expansion. Since the University does not have any intended use of the land for future building, it is recommended that these properties be declared surplus, disposed of, with the proceeds being used to acquire properties that are coming on the market which are within the approved land use plan.

Several questions were raised by Governor Chandler as to the desirability of disposing of presently owned land since land use plans could be changed and several Board members expressed feelings that the University should continue to hold these 14 parcels as rental property. Mr. Griffin said that the Finance Committee had considered the alternatives and felt that it was in the best interest of the University to dispose of this land. Governor Chandler moved that the matter be referred back to the Finance Committee for further study. His motion was seconded by Mrs. Clark and passed with one dissenting vote. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. Report of Investments (ICR 1)

Mr. Griffin moved that the report of changes made in investments for the University of Kentucky and its affiliated corporations for the quarter ending September 30, 1977, be accepted. His motion was seconded by Mr. Homer Ramsey and passed. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

R. Medical Center Committee

Mr. Black reported that the Medical Center Committee had met on the morning of December 13 and received a status report of the study being made at the Medical Center. The committee will meet again in February.

S. Meeting Adjourned

After determining that there was no further business to come before the meeting, the Chairman called for a motion for adjournment which was duly made, seconded and carried, and the meeting adjourned at 4:25 o'clock.

DOCTORAL PROGRAM IN COMMUNICATIONS

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees authorize for submission to the Council on Higher Education a Doctor of Philosophy Degree Program in Communications.

Background: The College of Communications proposes a program leading to the Ph. D. degree in Communications, a field which has been developed as an area of the social and behavioral sciences and which is concerned with the communicative behavior of individuals, small groups, and societies. The program is designed to prepare graduates to draw mainly upon research methods of these sciences to address the human communication process in a more orderly and scientific manner, to advance the theoretical knowledge of what has been called man's most important social behavior and to meet the needs in this relatively new discipline. The curriculum requires fundamental training in the social sciences, history, and statistics.

The University has the faculty resources in Communications and in the supporting areas for implementation of the proposed program of study.

The proposal has been approved by the Graduate Faculty and by the University Senate. It requires the approval of the Council on Higher Education pursuant to its statutory authority to approve all new graduate and professional programs. The Board is being asked to authorize submission of the program to the Council with final action by the Board to follow approval by the Council.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAM IN NURSING AT THE
SOUTHEAST COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees authorize for submission to the Council on Higher Education an associate degree program in Nursing at the Southeast Community College to be started in the fall of 1978.

Background: For some time the administrative personnel and faculty of the Harlan Appalachian Regional Hospital School of Nursing have discussed the possibility of converting the diploma nursing program offered by the hospital to an associate degree program offered by Southeast Community College. In October 1977, the Appalachian Regional Hospitals decided to phase out their diploma program at Harlan. This decision was made with the understanding that Southeast Community College would seek approval to start an associate degree nursing program.

The hospital administrator at Harlan and the director of Southeast Community College will work toward a smooth transition to phase out the diploma nursing program and initiate an associate degree nursing program when approval has been granted. There is a long-standing demonstrated need for a nursing education program in the area.

Funds are available in the Community College System budget to support the planning year of the program through 1977-78. The University of Kentucky biennial budget request for 1978-80 asks for recurring dollars to fund this program.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky be received for consideration and, provided at least one month has elapsed, be put on the agenda for action by the Board of Trustees at its next regular meeting.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

First Amendment - Change the first paragraph of Part VII-B-2 (pages 23a and 24) to read:

The Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research is chairman of the Graduate Faculty and the Graduate Council. Under the broad direction of the President and the Vice President for Academic Affairs, he provides general planning, guidance and review for all of the University's endeavors in graduate instruction and research. He bears responsibility for the total research activity of the University, including the University of Kentucky Research Foundation, and for the coordination of research and graduate education. He has direct administrative responsibility for the interdisciplinary research institutes. He appoints associate members of the Graduate Faculty and recommends the appointment of regular members for the approval of the President. He recommends on the appointment, promotion and granting of tenure to faculty members who may be involved in research and graduate programs of the University. He also recommends on budgets as they may affect research and graduate programs. He shall have the same authority and responsibilities as those of a dean of a college in the administration of educational units that might be transferred to or developed under his office.

Background: This amendment is appropriate since the Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research already has, as a result of prior actions by the Board of Trustees, the authority and responsibility for the administration of educational units such as the Graduate Center for Toxicology and several interdisciplinary research institutes.

Second Amendment – Change Part VIII-A-4-c (page 29) to read:

The term of a division chairman's appointment shall be three years and he normally shall serve for no more than two consecutive terms. Reappointment beyond the second term may occur under exceptional circumstances when it is deemed to be in the best interest of the community college and has been recommended by the faculty advisory committee [appointed to review the work of the division (Part IX)].

Background: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with the current University practice of reviewing each community college as a whole and not further reviewing each division within the community college as a separate educational unit.

Third Amendment – Change the footnote to Part IX (page 30) to read:

¹Includes departments, schools, institutes, interdisciplinary units, colleges, the Community College System, the individual community colleges and the Lexington Technical Institute [, and divisions].

Background: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with the current University practice of reviewing each community college as a whole and not further reviewing each division within the community college as a separate educational unit.

Fourth Amendment – Change Part X-B-4 (page 32) to read:

Part-time, visiting or temporary short-term appointments with explicit terminal dates of one academic year or less, terminate at the expiration of the term without notice. For those employed year-to-year on a fiscal or academic year basis, notification of non-renewal or appointment at the end of the first year of service shall be given not later than March 1 if the appointment expires at the end of that year or three months in advance if the one-year appointment terminates during the academic year. Notification of non-renewal of appointment at the end of the second year of service shall be given not later than December 15 if the appointment expires at the end of the year or six months in advance if the appointment expires during the year. Notification of non-renewal of appointment after more than two years of service shall be given at least 12 months before expiration of the appointment. Notice of non-renewal of appointment of those on post-retirement appointment shall be no less than six months.

Any related appeal(s) through administrative channels and/or the Advisory Committee on Privilege and Tenure of the University Senate or the Senate of the Community College System must be initiated in writing by the concerned faculty member within 60 days after being notified in writing by the dean or director about non-renewal of appointment.

Fourth Amendment - continued

Background: Earlier this year the University Senate Advisory Committee on Privilege and Tenure recommended to the President that a definite time period be established during which a faculty member could initiate an appeal relative to notification of non-renewal of appointment. Both the University Senate Advisory Committee on Privilege and Tenure and the University Senate Council concur that 60 days after notification in writing is a reasonable period for a faculty member to initiate any related appeal(s).

Fifth Amendment - Change Part X-B-6 (page 34) to read:

If a faculty member on a non-tenure appointment or a member on post-retirement appointment alleges that a decision not to reappoint him was caused by considerations violative of academic freedom, or that he was given less advance notice than specified in these regulations, he must present his allegations in writing to the Advisory Committee on Privilege and Tenure of the University Senate or the Senate of the Community College System within 60 days after being notified in writing by the dean or director about the decision not to reappoint. [, his allegations] Allegations so presented shall be given preliminary considerations by the appropriate Advisory Committee on Privilege and Tenure [of the University Senate or the Senate of the Community College System], which will seek to settle the matter by informal methods. His statement shall be accompanied by a statement that he agrees to the presentation, for the consideration of the committee, or such reasons and evidence as the University may allege in support of its decision. If the difficulty is unresolved at this stage, and if the committee so recommends, the procedures set forth in 5-b shall be applied, except that the faculty member making the complaint is responsible for stating the grounds upon which he bases his allegations, and the burden of proof shall rest upon him. If he succeeds in establishing a prima facie case, it is incumbent upon those who make the decision not to reappoint him to come forward with evidence in support of their decision.

Background: Earlier this year the University Senate Advisory Committee on Privilege and Tenure recommended to the President that a definite time period be established during which a faculty member could initiate an appeal relative to a decision not to reappoint. Both the University Senate Advisory Committee on Privilege and Tenure and the University Senate Council concur that 60 days after notification in writing is a reasonable period for a faculty member to initiate any related appeal.

Sixth Amendment - Replace all of Part X-C-8 (page 41) with the following abbreviated section:

8. Retirement

The University of Kentucky Retirement Plan (April 5, 1977) represents a consolidation of the original Retirement Resolution (April 7, 1964) and its numerous subsequent amendments into a unified statement of University policy and guidelines relative to retirement of employees in Groups I, II, III, and IV. The University of Kentucky Retirement Plan, which has been adopted by the Board of Trustees and may be amended only by that body, is presented in its entirety in the Administrative Regulations (AR II-8.0-4).

Background: This amendment is appropriate since Part X-C-8 heretofore dealt only with the retirement policy and guidelines for employees in Group I. The recently adopted University of Kentucky Retirement Plan is comprehensive in that it provides retirement policy and guidelines for employees in Groups I, II, III, and IV.
