UNDATED — Al Gore, his fight for the presidency spread across five courts, sought a speedy recount of Florida's contested ballos Tuesday to ensure "no question, no cloud" hangs over the nation 's 487d president. Republicans said the votes were counted, recounted and now "it's time to wrap this up." GOP vice presidential nominee Dick Cheney said, "To stretch it out, as Vice President Gore is doing ... is really unprecedented and it's going to create some problems," two days after Florida's top election official declared George W. Bush the winner.

the use of police power, the Supreme Court
struck down random roadblocks intended for
drug searches, saying they are an unreasonable
invasion of privacy under the Constitution. Law
enforcement is not a good enough reason to stop
innocent motorists, the majority concluded Tuesday in the first major ruling of the new term.
"Because the checkpoint program"s primary purpose is indistinguishable from the general interest in crime control, the checkpoints contravened the Fourth Amendment," which protects
against unreasonable searches and seizures, Justice Sandra Day O'Connor wrote.

CHICAGO — Score one for exasperated women: New research suggests men really do listen with just half their brains. In a study of 10 men and 10 women, brain scans showed that men when listening mostly used the left sides of their brains, the region long associated with understanding language. Women in the study, however, used both sides. The findings were presented Tuesday at the Radiological Society of North America's annual meeting by Dr. Joseph T. Lurito, an assistant radiology professor at Indiana University School of Medicine. They don't necessarily mean women are better listeners. It could be that "it's harder for them," Lurito suggested, since they apparently need to use more of their brains than men to do the same task. Drug banned after links to deaths

WASHINGTON — The maker of a popular
new treatment for women's irritable bowel syndrome pulled the drug Lotronex off the market
Tuesday after it was linked to a growing number
of deaths and hospitalizations. The withdrawal
comes just nine months after Lotronex began
selling with great fanfare. It becomes the seventh
banned drug the increasingly embattled Food
and Drug Administration has had to deal with in
2 1/2 years. The problem: Lotronex can cause severe side effects, including a life-threatening intestinal inflammation called ischemic colitis, and
constipation so severe that some patients needed
parts of their intestines surgically removed.

State Farm rewards auto safety

CHICAGO — The nation's leading automobile insurer is revising its pricing policies and giving the biggest rate breaks to drivers of what it finds are the safest cars — primarily luxury cars, vans or SUVs. State Farm said Tuesday the new system, which will replace its across-the-board discount for all vehicles with air bags, will result in no more than a \$50-4 year difference in insurance costs. Owners of sport utility vehicles and other big cars will still pay more for their insurance than small-car owners do. The announcement provoked criticism from consumer safety experts.

were contaminated with a chemical that can destroy the kidneys. East Earth Herb Inc. of Eugene, Ore., said it has detected the chemical,
called aristolochic acid, in certain batches of the
following products: Jade Pharmacy brand
Meridian Circulation tablets and liquid extract,
and Jade Pharmacy brand Quell Fire tablets. Do
not consume the recalled products, which may
be returned to the place of purchase for a refund, East Earth said. Consumers with questions



For only the second year, the Alumni Association is sponsoring 'Let the Arts Begini'. This program originated as a Homecoming festivity to bring the public into the new King Alumni House and allow them to see the renovations made inside.

degree, Suliers took his interest in art and turned it into more than just a hobby. Besides being an accomplished businessman, inventor and photographer, Suliers artistic ability brings to light the way a water-color abstract style of painting can be more appealing than the realistic style to which most students are exposed.

Suliers originally began
painting by studying closely
with other artists, attending
workshops and working on creating reproductions for other
artists. He first began working
with oil paints but later found
that he preferred watercolor.
Over 58 paintings are dis-

played in his exhibit. The majority of his paintings portray rural or urban landscapes with a few ocean scenes mixed in. With his abstract style, Suliers avoids adding too much detail to his work, leaving much to the viewer's interpretation. He refuses to duplicate real scenes; he prefers to paint from his own inagination.

Suliers paints from the comfort of his own home and avoids the studio setting unless he is working on the finishing touches of a piece.

Painting is not only impor-tant to aspiring artists, but should appeal to all students on

"It changes the way you look at things," Suliers said. "There are things you see when you paint that others don't. There are shadows we live with

everyday. Artists have to be aware of those lights and darks. You have to be able to pay attention to the subtle things.

He also emphasizes that art is a visual experience and should be entertaining.

Sullers thinks students will enjoy his exhibit because it appeals to so many tastes.

"Art has no beginning or end, you can just enjoy it at your own pace," he said.



But the park service cannot afford the \$599,500 asking price, said Sarah Olson, park superintendent for the Roosevelt Hallowal Historic Site.

It was acquired by James Roosevelt, the president's father, in 1868 and given to James Roosevelt, his son from his first marriage. The son, nicknamed Rosy, died in 1927 and left the Red House to his half brother, Franklin.

Seek peace, not international aid

Attempts by Middle Eastern leaders to make foreign alliances compromises peace process

For the last few months, the situation in the Middle East

has deteriorated from peace to war, and now both sides are attempting to up the stakes.

Ehud Barak, the Israeli prime minister, has solicited help from the extremist factions in Israel, while Palestinian Authority leader Yasser Arafat has been solidifying the Arab nations in their opposition to Israel.

tions in their opposition to Israel.

In the past week, however, a disturbing turn of events has emerged, threatening to escalate the crisis to international proportions. Barak has been allying himself even more firmly with President Clinton, hoping to win American support in the conflict.

Over the holiday weekend, Arafat has responded in kind, making friendly overtones to Vladamir Putin of Russia in hopes of a similar alliance.
