# Increase in cigarette tax will fund cancer research

FRANKFORT — The Markey Cancer Center will likely receive \$2.5 million for cancer research when the House and Senate convene today to vote on a tax modernization plan.

today to vote on a tax modernization plan.

This funding will be made possible due to a 1-cent increase in the initially proposed cigarette tax of 26 cents. If passed, the total tax will be 30 cents per pack.

The tax is expected to generate \$5 million a year, which will be split between UK and the University of Louisville.

Both universities will be required to match the \$2.5 million through their own fund-raising efforts, which could generate more

than \$5 million for cancer research.
Kevin McDonagh, deputy director of the Markey Cancer Center;
said he is delighted by the support





The recent remarks by Harvard President Larry Summers suggesting an innate difference in the ability of women to excel in math and science hit a necessary chord in today's society. Cries immediately rang out regarding the sexist nature of his comment, but critics didn't challenge its validity.

The problem is not that the head of one of the most prestigious schools in the world would have suggested a gender barrier in the sciences. Instead, people's ignorance and overzeal-ousness to scream "Bigoti" has overshadowed an opportunity to perform studies to truly evaluate this claim.

The same thing is happening all across America as researchers are silenced in the name of open-mindedness. It is politically incorrect to point out that abortion disproportionalely affects blacks or that AIDS disproportionately affects backs or that AIDS disproportionately affects homosexuals. Statistics show that both have had damaging effects on these groups. Yet, for a prominent, white American male to point this out would be career suicide once liberal rights organizations got done with him.




