For nearly ten years I served as post
Quartermaster - Was selected to dismantle
Fort Sedgwick, N.M. in 1878 - and Fort

in five months packing up and ship-
ping property with no officer or asso-
ciate at the post. In 1879 established
a Quartermaster & Commissary Dept.
