In Zoology and Geology the work has been satisfactory considering the absence of illustrative material.

In Practical Mechanic decided progress has
been made looking to a better organization
with adequate equipment the coming year

The Drawing classes have been conducted
as heretofore to meet the needs of those pursuing
Nat-History chiefly, but including the principles
of perspective with Shade & Shadow

In Microscopy a complete course has
been given including micro-metric determinations,
Projection, with instruction in Micro-photography

The collegiate year of the A & M college having about terminated I deem it opportune to report for your information such matters as might be of interest concerning operations of the military department. The number of students under instruction averaged during the year about seventy, and the attendance at drill averaged about 40. Beyond the recitation of ten (10) instructors in tactics, and which commenced about a month at the beginning of the session, the only kind of instruction attempted was the drill in the school of the soldier, the company and skirmishing. The instruction was by no means as thorough as desirable, or as I anticipated at the beginning of the session, for which two seasons are quite apparent, first the scant attendance in proportion to the numbers ~~and~~

belonging to the company, the general effect in each case being, that, when one is absent for any length of time the others must to some extent be delayed, in order that progress may, as from the nature of the case it must be, simultaneous. The second ~~main~~ obstacle being the exceedingly unfavorable weather, there being no hall in which the drill could be carried on more than in the ornam of arms. For nearly four months it was impracticable to drill in the open air - except possibly five or six times, for the ornam ornam, and even when the ornam weather commenced - the drill hour being midday - the heat was frequently too intense for the exercise. I especially invite your attention to the ~~effect~~ ^{effect} of these obstacles, which, as I have from time to time frequently mentioned the circumstances to you, I now only mention in order to suggest what I consider the mighty expediency, I might - in the interest of discipline almost say the absolute necessity of enforcing stringent measures for securing a better attendance, I consider it ^(the first requisite) the first requisite to secure discipline, and that good instruction is impossible without good discipline.

The uniforms of the cadets were contracted for and secured at a uniform price of \$7.65, including cap, coat and pants, I think they were generally well made, of

good materials and have given pretty general satisfaction. Our suits of uniforms is scarcely sufficient to last the entire session some of them even at the end of the first term becoming perceptibly worn and tarnished. Some of the students wear their uniforms habitually while others only wear it on drill. I am of the opinion that all should be required to wear it alike, either at all times or at least when on the college grounds.
