Professor creates civil rights bridge

Building bridges: UK professor Garry Bibbs builds a bridge memorial to recognize Kentuckians who were important in the Civil Rights Movement

Bridges represent movement, nsportation and perhaps even

Bridges represent movement, transportation and perhaps even change.

With all this in mind, UK Professor Garry Bibbs built a bridge that he said represents how 22 Kentuckians helped blacks overcome obstacles and led them to a better life.

Bibbs's Bridge of Fame was revealed July 18 at the 40th aniversary celebration of the Kentucky Commission on Human Rights at The Gardens in Louistle. By 12 foot structure recognizes the 22 inductees of the Kentucky Civil Rights Hall of Fame who have performed outstanding deeds for civil rights.

The bridge holds a mural-sized picture of each inductee on large wooden slots.

Lyman T. Johnson, who fought for the desegregation of UK, is recognized on the Bridge of Fame. Johnson sued UK for admission in 1948. At the time, black students were enrolled at the University, but were taught at a different location than white students were enfouled the University, but were taught at a different location than white students were the production of the pridge include Civil Rights ac-

Other famous faces found on the bridge include Civil Rights activist Anne Brade and the Director of Louisville Metropolitan Housing Coalition Suzy Post.

Bibbs said the project was a way for him to honor the inductees.

ductees.
"I adopted the project. My objective was to find a way to spiritually and aesthetically give people reference to the idea of what each inductee represents," Bibbs

said.

The Bridge of Fame is currently located in UK storage until a permanent home is found. Bibbs said he is satisfied with its location because he can add the names of new inductees to his sculp-

of new inductees to his sc ture.

Bibbs came to UK in 1990 to teach sculpture.
Ten years later, he has distinguished himself as a director of graduate studies.

a director of graduate studies. In addition to his work at the University, Blbbs was chosen to serve on the Planning Committee Commission on Human Rights.

The commission is made up of 50 members who handle cases of civil injustice. Currently the commission uses its \$2.1 million budget to take on 300 cases of discrimination a year.

The excitement in Lauretta Byars voice when asked about Johnson's induction provides enough inspiration to encourage those who don't know of his astounding accomplishments to research his contributions to the University, as well as contempo-

search his contributions to the University, as wen as contemporary America.

"I was extremely pleased that Lyman was selected for the work that he did," said Byars, vice chancellor for Minority Affairs. "Even though what he did opened the doors to higher education for African Americans at UK, his impact was not just at UK, but for the entire commonwealth."

Even though Byars didn't work directly with Johnson, her relationship with him was built upon something that many knew him for — his compassion and genuine concern for students.

dents. Byars said that even though Johnson's health deteriorated significantly as he got older, he returned every year, without fail, to the Black Student Union banquet. "He was so frail and could hardly walk because of arthritis, but the reason he came is because the students recognized him. He said it made him feel so good that students accelerated in school," Byars said. "He loved to come and hear what students were doing."

Regardless of ailing health, Byars said Johnson always showed up.

"He always had a message, no matter how frail he was. His mind was always sharp," she said.
Byars said Johnson's hame provides a positive image in most people's minds, however not for the most obvious reasons.
"He wasn't as interested in taking classes as he was challenging the system," she said of Johnson's fight for desegregation.

Johnson's struggle for equal rights at UK began in 1948 and became a landmark in UK's history when the University desegregated in 1949 after Johnson refuted the idea of the Day Law, which stated that blacks and whites could not be educated in the same facility.

They could, however be enrolled in the University, but they had to be educated at a different location.

had to be educated at a different location.

Byars said Johnson's ideologies derived to desegregate UK because he felt that as a tax paying citizen he too should be alleft that as a tax paying citizen he too should be al'He thought it was wrong that he couldn't go here,' she said.' It was his moral conviction.

What Byars said was a reason to challenge legalized segregation turned out to be one of UK's greatest feats.

'Johnson wanted a fight and he got it,' Byars said.

In 1948 Johnson decided to apply to UK. He was accepted, but would have had to take his classes at Kentucky State University, where faculty would commute several days out of the week to instruct the predominately black university. He took the case to court in 1948 where he filled a discrimination suit against UK and won.

By the summer of 1949, 50 black students sat in UK class-

Even though Johnson enabled blacks to attend classes at UK, he decided to take another route. He attended classes at UK, he decided to take another route. He attended classes at UK. He later finished his master's degree at the University of Michigan and taught history at Louisville Central High School. In 1979, UK awarded Johnson an honorary degree to commend his ef-

forts.

Byars' explanation of Johnson's story provides an intriguing wish of her's: that everyone could have known Johnson for his true sincerity, will and determination to desegregate UK.

Source awards show goes CANCELL COM sour as a result of fights

PASADENA, Calif.

(AP) — UPN will broadcast a rap music awards
show next week even
though the glittery hiphop celebration was cut
short by a bottle-throwing brawl.

Only three performances and a handful of
awards were announced
before The Source HipHop Music Awards 2000
was shut down by fights.
Some witnesses said
some fights involved
members of various rap

groups, although police could not immediately confirm that.

"This is not a reflection of what hip-hop is really all about." rapper Coolio said. "Hip-hop is really about all the people coming together."

The show, sponsored by *The Source* magazine, mingled rap stars such as Grammy Award-winner Dr. Dre with mainstream celebrities. About 2,500 people were inside Pasadena Civic Auditorium, including U.S. Rep.

Maxine Waters, basket-ball star Shaquille O'Neal and boxing pro-moter Don King. There were no arrests and no injuries, police said

and no injuries, police said.

UPN said it will broadcast the show on Aug. 29 as scheduled. New scenes will be taped to include awards that were not presented, said Patti McTeague, a network spokeswoman.

"It's an undertaking that we're willing to make," she said.



Bike lanes on the left and right sides were installed as part of the new plan to help students get safely to classes. No longer is there the need to coast along side. Those in the past who bravely chose to fight traffic and actually struggle with driving in the streets will find things are changing for the better. No longer is there the fear of being run over or facing the constant beeping of horns from impatient drivers.






